Indo-Bangla Meeting Today

Delhi wants 3 more transshipment points

REJAUL KARIM BYRON and PORIMOL PALMA

India wants three more transshipment points in Bangladesh for transporting goods to its north-eastern states, according to the agenda of a bilateral meeting that begins in Dhaka today.

The points are in Munshiganj's Muktarpur, Dhaka's Pangaon and Narayanganj.

India will place the proposal at the two-day shipping secretary-level meeting at the InterContinental Dhaka. Currently, Ashuganj is being used

as the only transshipment point in Bangladesh under the River Protocol signed between the two countries in 2010. India began using the port in June

Bangladesh Shipping Secretary Abdus Samad told The Daily Star that the proposal would be discussed in the meeting.

"Based on their study, India thinks the three new points will ease the transportation of its goods," he told The Daily Star.

He said willingness of railway officials and proper monitoring could change the situation.

Another transport expert, Shamsul Haque, however, said giving proper services to passengers was not possible under the current system.

Asked about the continuous losses, Md Shamsuzzaman, director general of BR, said the railways were a state entity and not a business organisation.

"... there might be a loss or profit. If we want to make it [railways] profitable, we have to increase fare. The train fares in our country are a lot lower than that of many other countries," he said.

The DG, however, said they would work to seal the "leakages" causing losses and reducing their revenue.

About the train delays, he said there was no scheduling problem in the eastern zone or for those operating within the western zone, such as trains on the Khulna-Rajshahi route.

He, however, admitted that most of the trains running in the country's northwestern and southern regions from Dhaka face delays mainly due to inadequate railway lines from Joydevpur-Ishwardi, which connects the capital to the western zone via Bangabandhu Bridge.

Projects for doubling the lines from Joydebpur-Ishwardi and a new rail bridge over the Jamuna have already been undertaken. The work for them is to start soon, he said.

The DG also blamed the delays on speed restrictions on the Bangabandhu Bridge. "It would take time and major investment to change the situation, he told The Daily Star yesterday.


Shamsuzzaman also said there was a huge difference between the demand and supply of train tickets, which lead to ticket shortages.

Asked about the black-market for tickets, he said they would take strict action if allegations of such practice was brought before them and hold their staffers accountable if they were found involved.

The DG also admitted that there were problems in the catering services, because the recruitment process of service providers was "defective".

"We are trying to regulate them," which shot up to Tk 1,738.37 crore in he said.

Shamsuzzaman said they had undertaken several projects to improve services and once they were implemented, things would get better.

Classes at the government medical college started on January 10, 2018 with 50 students. It now has 150 students.

In May 2018, Dr Md Abu Sufian, acting principal of the college and chairman of a six-member tender committee, called for bidding in two national and one local dailies for the purchase of various appliances including furniture, fixtures, books, journals, computers, printers and other education materials.

The committee included the then civil surgeon of Habiganj Dr Suchinta Chowdhury and acting deputy director of the district's Population Planning Department Dr Nasima Khanam Eva. According to the civil surgeon,

he was not called in for any of the meetings relating to the tender. Seven companies participated in the tender, and Nirjhora Enterprise of Dhaka's Shyamoli and Punam

Trade International of Motijheel were selected for supplying the goods at a meeting of the committee, college sources say. Dr Suchinta Chowdhury said after

he was sent the minutes of that meeting for signing it, he wrote to the principal questioning the request. The rest of the committee members

signed the minutes of the meeting where the decision to award the work to Nirjhora and Punam was taken. But Dr Nasima claimed she was not

on the committee. Asked about her signature on the minutes, she admitted to signing it later "out of official formality but she did not go to any meeting".

"I won't take responsibility for corruption, if there was any," she said.

Dr Shahin Bhuiyan, president of another committee, formed to check the suppliers' quotations with the market prices, said, "Since the purchase was completed in June [last year], the last month of the fiscal year, we did not have enough time to check the price of all the materials."

He, however, did not say which prices he checked.

Dr Abu Sufian did not receive phone of this correspondent. However, in a press release issued on November 26, he claimed, referring to the entire purchase process, that "an audit with no objection was completed last year".

A project involving around Tk 15.50 crore was taken up last year to make purchases for the college. Of the fund, Tk 1.61 crore was deposited in the public treasury for VAT and

OFFENSIVE AGAINST ARAKAN ARMY

Myanmar army shelling kills 3 in Rakhine

Shelling by Myanmar's military killed a woman and two infants, and wounded six others in Rakhine State on Monday, according to residents and a lawmaker in the town of Mrauk U, where security forces are fighting

against an ethnic militant group. The army unleashed a counterinsurgency campaign against the Arakan Army, which recruits from the region's mostly Buddhist ethnic

Rakhine population, almost a year ago. The militants are fighting for greater autonomy from the central government, and authorities cut internet access to most of the region in June.

Tens of thousands of people have been displaced across Rakhine since clashes began in December last year, bringing fresh chaos to the region, from which more than 730,000 Rohingya Muslims fled a military crackdown in 2017.

Two military spokesmen did not answer phone calls from Reuters seeking comment, while a spokesman for the Arakan Army also blamed the army for the shelling, saying there were no clashes involving its fighters in Mrauk U.
