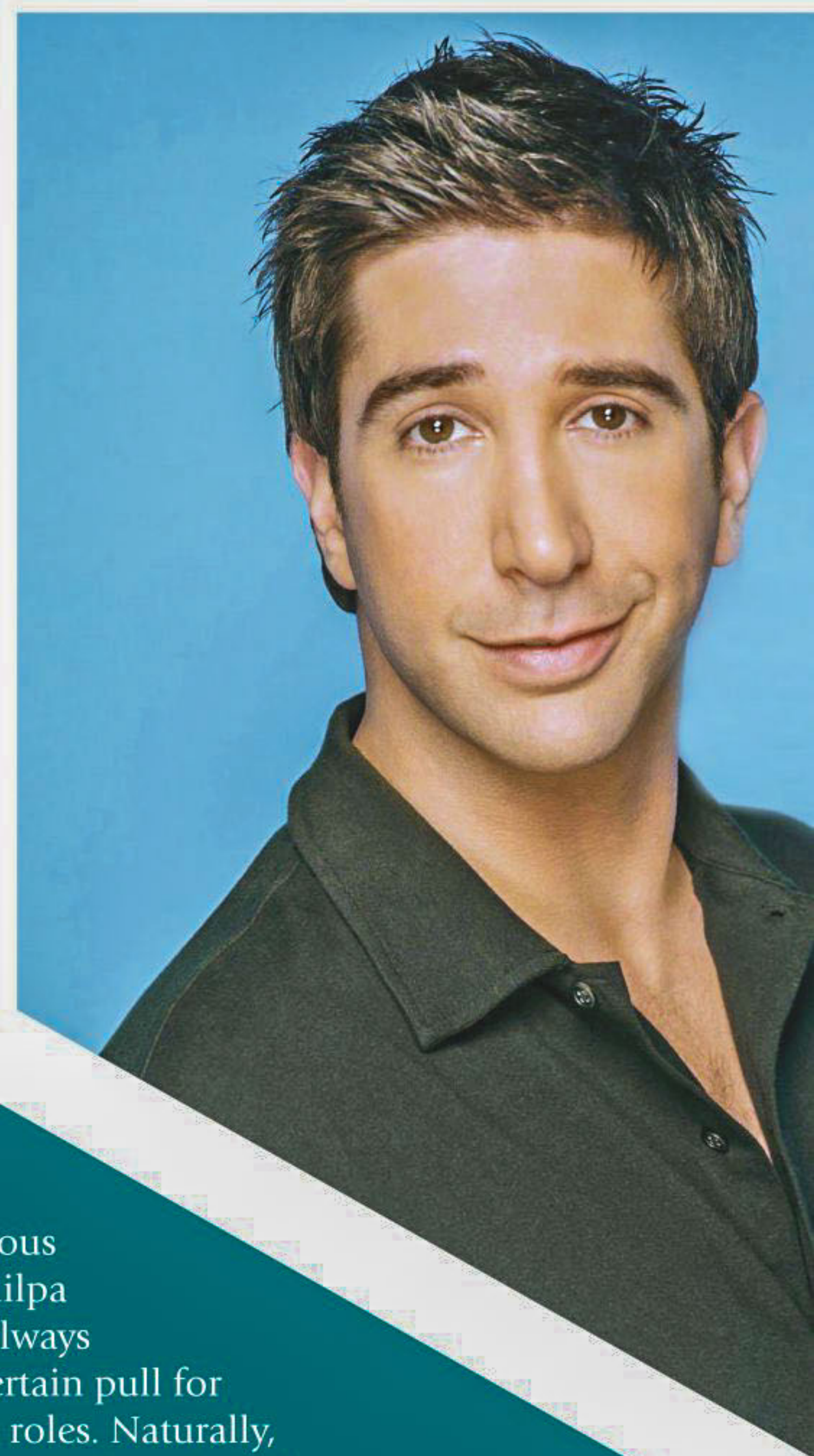


ROSS, NOT AGAIN!
