The special edition of the Bangladesh Premier League T20 to mark birth centenary of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman is set to raise its curtains through a grand opening ceremony at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium today.

The main ground was busy for the last-minute preparations for the opening ceremony of the cash-rich tournament and teams were busy attending practice sessions at the BCB Academy Ground.

Bollywood superstar Salman Khan and Katrina Kaif are the main attraction of the ceremony, which will last for almost five hours.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will declare the Bangabandhu Bangladesh Premier League open at around 7:00pm.

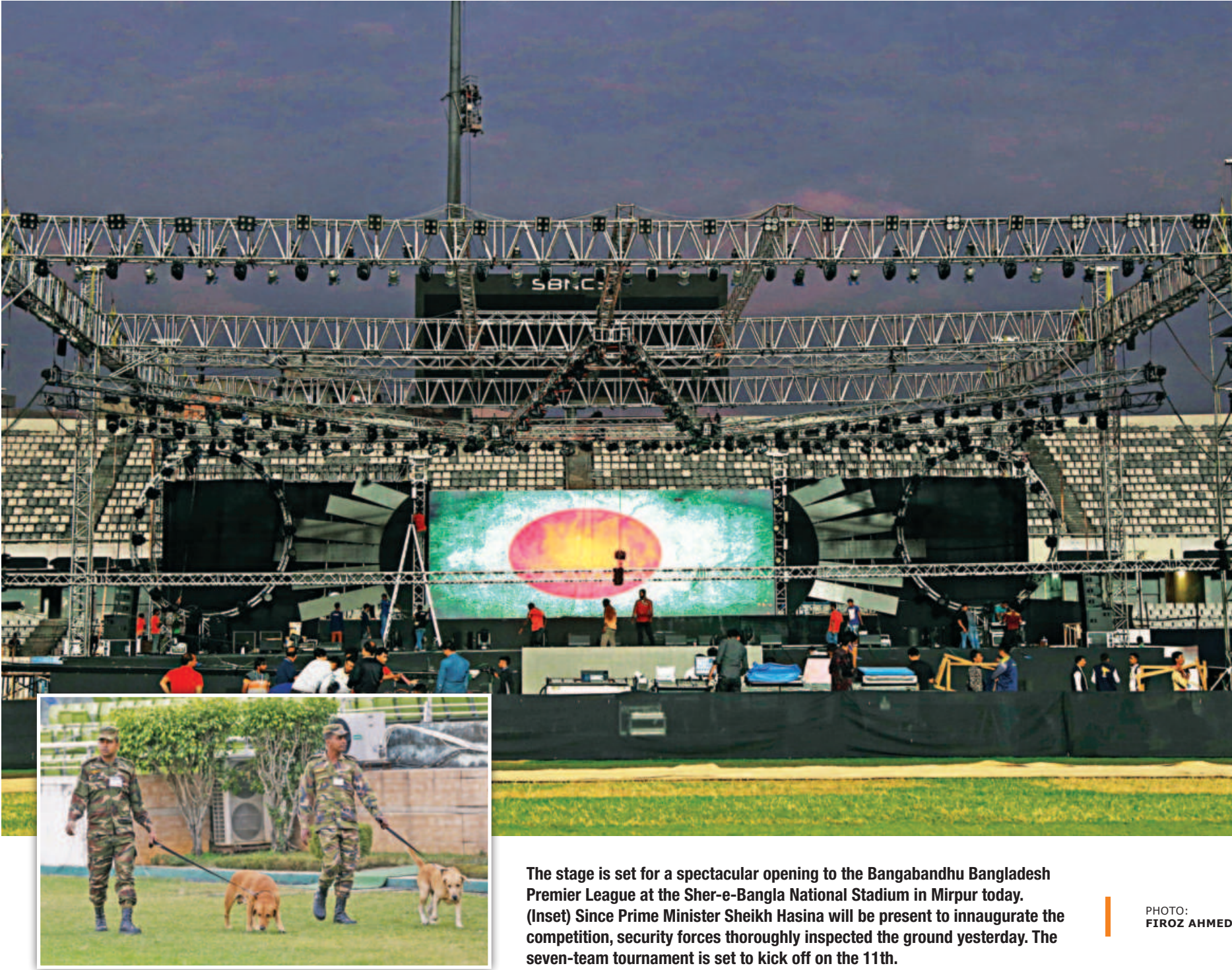
The programme has been divided into two parts, which is set to begin from 5:00pm. Bangladesh singers James, Mumtaz and others will rule the roost in the first part while the second part will be handled by entertainers from Bollywood.

BBPL’s focus on youth

The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) will be looking at young players in the upcoming Bangladesh Premier League (BBPL) and try to integrate them into the national team during the T20 World Cup, scheduled for October next year.

“This BBPL is very crucial to us. The T20 World Cup is knocking on the door. Also, we have a lot of T20 matches coming. Our performance there will be vital. We are working in the areas where we have deficiencies,” chief selector Minhajul Abedin told reporters yesterday.

Bangladesh are yet to find a batsman who can consistently score quick runs in the lower order. Moreover, the BCB has already implemented a few guidelines that they believe will help them overcome their deficiencies ahead of the World Cup. The BCB has made it mandatory for BPL teams to employ at least one wrist spinner and a fast bowler capable of bowling over 140kmp/h.

And with the BBPL being organised solely by the board, the event is being touted as the perfect platform for youngsters to prove their mettle and make their way into the national team.

Minhajul shared those sentiments. “We all want to see good performances from the players in

these areas and we will see that in the BPL. If we get some players from here, then it will be a bonus,” Minhajul, who is also acting as the team director of the Cumilla Warriors, said.

“A lot of good overseas players are coming so our local cricketers will have a great opportunity to gain experience. In the shorter format, you have to be involved in the game in

No Bangladeshi cricketers were selected for the upcoming Pakistan Super League (PSL) 2020 mainly due to the Tigers’ unavailability during the fifth edition of the tournament, which is slated to be held in Pakistan from February 20 next year.

The Tigers will be busy with a home series against Zimbabwe in March and will therefore not be available for the PSL.

23 Bangladesh players were named in the players’ draft held in Lahore on Friday. Opener Tamim Iqbal, all-rounder Mahmudullah Riyad, left-arm pacer Mustafizur Rahman and pace bowling all-rounder Mohammed Saifuddin were placed in gold category.

Earlier, no team from the newly-introduced 100-ball cricket picked any cricketers from Bangladesh.

Meanwhile, six Bangladesh cricketers -- Tamim, Mahmudullah, Mustafizur, Mehedi Hasan Miraz, Taskin Ahmed and Soumya Sarkar -- have been named in the Indian Premier League auction.

Everton down Chelsea 3-1

Chelsea slipped to their third Premier League defeat in four matches yesterday as Everton bounced back from their Merseyside derby humiliation to win 3-1 and escape from the relegation zone.

Goals early in each half from Richarlison and Dominic Calvert-Lewin put the home side 2-0 up and although Mateo Kovacic pulled one back, Calvert-Lewin struck again late to seal the win.

Benzema sinks Espanyol

Real Madrid were without Eden Hazard and Gareth Bale yesterday but Karim Benzema stepped up again to ensure they beat struggling Espanyol in La Liga.

Benzema scored one and set up another in a 2-0 win at the Santiago Bernabeu, where Madrid wore an all-green kit to show support for this week’s Climate Summit in the city.

An ankle injury is likely to rule Hazard out of the season’s first Clasico on December 18 while Bale has a thigh problem and is also a concern ahead of that crunch game at Camp Nou.

But another excellent Benzema display will at least be of some consolation, after he teed up Raphael Varane before scoring his 15th goal this term to put Espanyol out of sight.

Increasingly it looks like the winner of the Clasico will spend the Christmas break first in the table, with the top two pulling away from the likes of Atletico Madrid, who drew again away at Villarreal on Friday night.

Sevilla, in third, are four points behind Real Madrid before they travel to Osasuna on Sunday.

charge of Duncan Ferguson following the sacking of Marco Silva, lifts them to the relative comfort of 14th spot in the table.

Frank Lampard’s men remain in fourth place but Wolves could close the gap to just three points if they beat Brighton on Sunday.

Ferguson’s reign at Goodison Park got off to the perfect start with Brazil forward Richarlison heading home Djibril Sidibe’s cross from the right to give the hosts a fifth-minute lead.

Chelsea pushed for an equaliser, with in-form England forward Tammy Abraham going close a couple of times, but the Toffees went in at half-time 1-0 up.

Everton got a flying start to the second half as well, with Calvert-Lewin barging his way through the Chelsea defence before slotting past Kepa Arrizabalaga from 12 yards.

But Chelsea responded immediately, with Kovacic stroking in a volley with his right foot in the 52nd minute, beating the dive of England goalkeeper Jordan Pickford.

Substitute Tom Davies mistimed a header when in a good position to restore Everton’s two-goal lead.

But Chelsea shot themselves in the foot when Kepa mishit a pass, gifting possession to Walcott.

The ball came to Davies, who struggled to control the ball, but it eventually fell for Calvert-Lewin, who bundled home, sending Ferguson charging down the touchline.
