
DERBY RACIST ARRESTED

British police yesterday arrested a 41-year-old man after a video posted on social media showed a supporter apparently making racist gestures during Saturday's Manchester derby. "Police were called to a report of a supporter making alleged racist gestures and sounds towards players during the Manchester City and Manchester United derby," said Greater Manchester Police in a statement. "A 41-year-old man has been arrested on suspicion of a racially aggravated public order and remains in custody for questioning." City pledged to take a zero tolerance approach against supporters found to have subjected United players to racist abuse after the Premier League champions lost 2-1 to their local rivals at the Etihad Stadium. United midfielder Fred was hit by objects thrown from the crowd as he prepared to take a corner in the second half and footage on social media appears to show a City fan mimicking a monkey at the Brazilian.

Mujibur Rahman, gathered steam after Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina officially announced the opening of the special edition of the T20 tournament at around 7:00pm at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium yesterday.

Bangladesh Cricket Board President Nazmul Hassan had promised that it would be one of the best opening ceremonies in the history of the BPL. However, there was some mismanagement and the programme had to be delayed by more than an hour. Scheduled to begin at 5:25pm, the ceremony finally started at 6:30pm.

After the prime minister inaugurated the event, there was a 10-minute fireworks display to pump up the audience before performers from Bangladesh and India kept spectators on their feet.

The likes of James, Reshmi Mirza and 'dRockstar' Shuvo from Bangladesh entertained the crowd, but another local singer who was scheduled to perform, Momtaz, did not appear.

It was then popular Indian singer Sonu Nigam who surprised everyone by singing the famous Bengali songs 'Dhono Dhanne Pushpe Bhora' and 'Shuno Ekti Mujibur'.

By then, the main attractions of the opening ceremony -- Bollywood superstars Salman Khan and Katrina Kaif -- arrived at the venue and met Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and BCB President Nazmul Hassan.

Another Indian singer, Kailash Kher, performed all his famous before Katrina lit up the stage with her dance moves.

The anticipation reached its crescendo and Salman stepped onto the huge stage and the fans at home of cricket in Mirpur stood on their feet and enjoyed the Bollywood star performing in front of their eyes.

Much like the opening ceremony, fans will also hope to witness exciting cricket on the field in the special edition of the BBPL, which is scheduled to begin from December 11.

PCB proposes D/N Test

While the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) is still awaiting the green signal from the government to tour Pakistan for a threematch T20I and two-match

January, the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) proposed at least one daynight Test match in Karachi, ESPNCricinfo reported.

The BCB is yet to confirm the tour but have received a draft itinerary including two Tests and three T20Is slated for January-February from the PCB.

"We may ask Pakistan to split the Test and T20I series. The issue of day-night Tests will be decided later because it depends on the government's security report and whether we will tour Pakistan or not. If we don't get the green signal for some reason then we have to discuss playing at a neutral venue. If we get the green signal then it's different," said BCB cricket operations committee chairman Akram Khan.

According to sources close to the BCB, the board is willing to play longer-version cricket away from Pakistan considering the length of the series, reasoning that it would be mentally exhausting for cricketers to play under strict security for such a long period of time.

Akram added that they were not under any pressure to visit Pakistan and said that it had nothing to do with Sri Lanka's recent Lanka later this week.

Meanwhile, the PCB proposed at least one day-night Test on the tour.

The idea behind encouraging daynight cricket and offering Bangladesh is to counter the problem of dwindling crowds. We intend to add at least one day-night Test in our home itinerary. The benefit, other than better crowds, is that we have an opportunity to extend our cricketing season. Like in Pakistan if the season ends in the mid-April or earlier, we can extend it by having day-night games to fill in an empty window," PCB chairman Ehsan Mani told Cricinfo.

Bangladesh played their first day-night Test in India last month, which was also the first day-night match in the subcontinent. Pakistan have already played four Tests under lights, and are on the verge of hosting their first pink-ball Test at home against Sri

Juve suffer first defeat of season

Italian champions Juventus suffered their first defeat of the season Saturday with a 3-1 loss against Lazio in Rome blowing open the Serie

A title race. Maurizio Sarri's eight-time reigning league champions remain second in the table, two points behind leaders Inter Milan after 15 matches.

Third-placed Lazio clawed to within just three points of Juventus after their first win at home against the Turin giants since December 2003.

Cristiano Ronaldo put Juventus ahead at the Stadio Olimpico when he picked up a Rodrigo Bentancur cross to tap in after 25 minutes.

But Luiz Felipe hit back for the Romans in front of 60,000 fans, nodding in just before the break.

Juan Cuadrado's sending off for a foul on Manuel Lazzari after 69 minutes proved to be the turning point. Lazio took control as Sergej Milinkovic-Savic connected with a Luis Alberto assist to fire in a stunning goal.


Goalkeeper Thomas Strakosha denied Ronaldo's header on the line while Iuventus counterpart Woiciech Szczesny atoned for bringing down Joaquin Correa by saving Serie A top scorer Ciro Immobile's resulting penalty.

Felipe Caicedo snatched the third goal five minutes into niury time as Lazio earned their seventh straight win, fuelling ambitions of challenging for a first Serie A title since 2000. "Lazio for the Scudetto? Maybe, it depends on how

much they will be able to continue this extraordinary moment," said Sarri, "let's say it will be a three-way fight." "The red card changed everything for us," he added.

Iuventus had been the only team left in Europe's top leagues to remain unbeaten in all competitions this season. 'My lads did something extraordinary tonight," Inzaghi

A trio of vintage Messi finishes contributed to five stunning Barca goals, the best of them arguably belonging to Luis Suarez, whose brilliant backheel capped a freeflowing move, involving seven different players.

But at the end of a week in which Messi claimed a record sixth Ballon d'Or, it was the Argentinian etching his name into the history books again after pulling clear of Cristiano Ronaldo's 34 La Liga trebles to stand alone. The efforts of Messi and Suarez

overshadowed Antoine Griezmann's opener but that was impressive too, the Frenchman applying a sumptuous chip after being assisted by his own goalkeeper Marc-Andre ter Stegen. An exhibition of creativity at

Camp Nou allowed for the occasional lapse in defence and Mallorca's Ante Budimir twice reduced the deficit to 2-1 and 4-2, even if a comeback never looked likely. Instead, Messi underlined his status

as the world's finest footballer with another sublime performance, instant evidence for why he was presented with his latest Ballon d'Or trophy on the pitch before kick-off.

at Lecce yesterday. Genoa, who led 2-0 at halftime, finished with nine men in the Serie A relegation battle while Lecce drew 2-2 for the third successive home game.

Son Heung-min admitted he considered passing before the Tottenham winger "put his booster on" to score his astonishing goal of the season contender against Burnley.

Son's stroke of genius was hailed as one of the best goals in Tottenham's glittering history as he virtually ran the entire length of the pitch before firing home in Saturday's Premier League clash in north London.

Tottenham Jose Mourinho dubbed the South Korea star "Sonaldo" in reference in a brilliant strike scored by Brazilian legend Ronaldo Barcelona Compostela in 1996.

But Son said he was actually looking to pass to Dele Alli before instead setting off on the counterattacking gem that earned comparisons with Lionel Messi and George Weah.

"I saw Dele (Alli) running on the left side," Son said. "I tried to pass first to Dele. Then I was just thinking 'should I go?', and I put my booster on. I took the right timing to the booster on. Then in two or three seconds I was in front of the goal and I was really surprised. This kind of goal, especially at home, it makes me so proud and happy. It's

amazing.
