

Aman growers unhappy as prices too low

Unusually low market price of Aman paddy at the beginning of harvesting period frustrates farmers of Patuakhali and adjacent Barguna district.

This correspondent visited paddy markets at Mohipur and Dhankhali under Kalapara and Badura under Galachipa upazila in Patuakhali and Bandra under Barguna's Amtali upazila during the last couple of days.

It was found that tepushail, a local variety of Aman, was selling for Tk 500 to 550 per maund (40 kg) and kazalshail and rajashail, also local varieties, for Tk 525 to 550.

"Production cost per maund of Aman is around Tk 700 but we are getting maximum Tk 550 in the local market," said Faruq Mridha, a farmer of Puran Mohipur village in Kalapara.

"I cultivated Aman paddy on 1.20 acres of land this year, spending around Tk 38,000 including lease money, fertiliser, seeds and labour. But I cannot expect more than Tk 22,000 for 40 maunds of produce as it is selling at Tk 550 a maund," said Md Jalil Hawlader of the same village.

"I went to Badura Bazar to sell 20 maunds

of Aman paddy but became frustrated due to low price," said Md Khabir Uddin, a farmer of Dakkhin Auliapur village under Patuakhali Sadar upazila.

Abul Mir of Pashchim Gerakhali village under the same upazila said, "I cultivated paddy on four acres of land. As I did not have adequate money to cover the total farming cost, I had to borrow Tk 20,000 from a local NGO. But now I cannot even recover the production cost as the market price is very low."

Farmers in the area depend mostly on Aman cultivation for livelihood.

"Wholesale buyers from northern districts including Natore, Mymensing and Dinajpur usually come to the area every year to buy Aman for good prices but this season they have not come yet. It is the main reason for low price of the paddy," said Masudur Rahman, a wholesale buyer of Baufal upazila's Kalaiya Bazar, the largest paddy market in Patuakhali.

Aman paddy was cultivated on about 2.10 lakh hectares of land in seven upazilas of the district this year and the production target is 5.08 lakh tonnes, said Redoyeswhor Datta, deputy director of the Department of Agriculture Extension in Patuakhali.

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

‘Tangail free day’ today

Hakimpur also liberated on this day

Today is ‘Tangail free day’ as the district tasted freedom from the Pakistani occupation army on December 11 in 1971.

Meanwhile, Dinajpur’s Hakimpur upazila was also liberated on this day.

During the Liberation War, the brave freedom fighters of Tangail created extra ordinary history in various ways and the story of their heroic roles spread not inside the country but also across the world.

The heroism of Kaderia Bahini, led by Abdul Kader Siddiqui, will be remembered in the history of the Liberation War.

The Zila Swadhin Bangla Gono Mukti Parishad was formed in the first of March 1971. Local youths then started organising to fight against the Pakistani army.

Apart from this, the training of the freedom fighters (FFs) was continuing.

In the meantime, the Pakistani army entered Tangail town on April 3 after breaking the resistance of the FFs at Goran-Satiachara in Mirzapur.

Within a few days, Kaderia Bahini, led by the then Chhatra League leader Abdul Kader Siddique, got united and started fighting against the Pakistani army at different places in Tangail.

On the other hand, another group of the freedom fighters, led by late Khandakar Abdul Baten, also attacked the occupation forces.

However, the Kaderia Bahini played the main role of resistance and the Pakistani army made bewildered by their attacks from the all sides.

On December 10, the confidence of the Pakistani army collapsed when around 2,000 paratroopers belonging to Indian allied forces landed at Poulsee near Tangail town. The Pakistani army then retreated to Dhaka.

On the early morning of December 11, the brave freedom fighters entered Tangail town while the general people came down to the streets and started celebrating.

To mark the historic day, Tangail municipality has arranged a six-day-long programmes from today at Shaheed Smriti Pouro Udyan in the town.

Meanwhile, Hakimpur upazila, now widely known as Hili, was freed from the Pakistan occupation forces on this day in 1971.

To mark the day, local FFs have organised different programmes including discussion and placing floral wreaths at monument and offering prayers.

On December 11 in 1971, the Indian allied army aided by the freedom fighters forced Pakistan troops to retreat, following fierce fighting for days in Hili under the upazila.

After the Pakistan army started crackdown on the freedom-loving Bangalees on March 26 in 1971, the occupation force created a strong base at Muhara in Hilli area.

Freedom fighters fought several fierce fights with the Pakistani troops in the area while the barbaric forces with the help of their local collaborators killed many innocent people, said Motiur Rahman, a freedom fighter of Dinajpur.

The fights between Indian and Pakistan armies in early December left at least 345 Indian troops killed and 1100 others wounded in Hilli area, said local freedom fighters and liberation war researchers.

In 2012, a memorial was built at Basudebpur village, remembering the days of 1971, said local freedom fighters.

Man takes own life after killing wife

A man reportedly died by suicide after allegedly killing his wife over a family feud in Kalihati upazila on Monday night.

The deceased were identified as Lal Mahmud, 55, a resident of Awaliabad village in the upazila, and his wife Anwara Begum, 50.

The couple married off their only daughter years ago while their two son sons are currently working in Qatar and Saudi Arabia.

Quoting locals and witnesses, Officer in Charge (OC) of Kalihati Police Station Hasan Al Mamun said, Lal often locked in altercation with his wife as their two expatriate sons used to send money through their mother's account.

As a sequel, the duo again locked in a quarrel around 8:30pm on Monday. At one stage, angry Lal, an irrigation pump operator, hacked Anwara with a machete indiscriminately, leaving her dead on the spot.


Later, keeping Anwara's body on the veranda, Lal hanged himself from the ceiling of his room, locking the door from inside, the OC added.

Being informed by the villagers, police went to the spot and recovered the bodies the same night, the OC said, adding that the bodies were sent to Tangail General Hospital for autopsy yesterday.
