

Unmanned level crossing poses risk

A level crossing near Mohimaganj railway station has remained without gate and gateman for long, posing risk of accidents, thanks to the authorities' ignorance of the matter.

It is very busy industrial area in Mohimaganj upazila town. As Rangpur Sugar Mill and several knitwear factories lie there, the area remains always jam-packed with pedestrians and different types of vehicles.

Meanwhile, after construction of Melandaha Bridge over the Bangalee river, people's movement has increased at the level crossing on the road connecting Shaghata upazila.

Sixteen trains ply across Mohimaganj railway station every day, said stationmaster Nazrul Islam.

But the railway authorities simply placed

a placard stating that 'As there is no gateman at the level crossing, people should cross it at their own risk', said locals.

Alam Mia, driver of a three-wheeler, said they often got stuck in traffic jam while passing the level crossing.

Solaiman Ali, a trader of Mohimaganj bazar, said the level crossing has remained without gateman for long, exposing commuters, especially schoolchildren, and vehicles to accidents.

Stationmaster Nazrul Islam said the level crossing has remained uncared for long, posing risk of accidents.

They have already informed the higher authorities about the matter but to no respond yet, said Nazrul.

Local people urged the railway authorities to take immediate steps to set up gates on both the sides of the level crossing and appoint a gateman as well.

Bandarban townspeople deprived of civic amenities

Basic civic amenities still elude the residents of Bandarban town, 35 years after it started functioning as a municipality.

Problems like inadequate supply of drinking water, lack of sewerage system and public toilets, scanty streetlights, narrow and broken roads, and lack of recreational facilities continued affecting the residents even after the district town was upgraded to 'A' category municipality in 2002.

Human wastes and garbage of the town are discharged directly into the Sangu river, polluting the waterbody flowing through the town.

As the municipality authority failed to set up sufficient potable water points, many people have installed deep tube-wells at their house with own cost.

Most of the areas become dark soon after evening due to absence of

streetlights.

Thirty-seven ethnic Marma families living at Godar Para under the municipality have to collect their drinking water from a jhiri (natural water flow) while electricity still remains a dream for them, said Aung Kyaw Ching Marma, a local.

The poor inhabitants have to pay municipality tax without getting any facilities, said U Chaw Mong, karbari (headman) of Godar Para.

"We hardly feel that we are living in a municipality area as the facilities are very poor. Waterlogging is very common in Bandarban town now as most of the land of Myaksi canal have been grabbed," said Robiul Islam of Army Para area.

Amzad Hossain, convener of citizens' welfare association in Bandarban, said buses, microbuses, trucks and three-wheelers are often parked on the roads as there is no

parking area in the municipality.

Touhidul Islam, secretary of Bandarban municipality, said, "Bandarban Hill District Council is the authority to supply water in the town. We are repairing most of the roads of the municipality area under different government projects."

"We could not provide adequate civic amenities for the townspeople as there was not sufficient allocation for the purpose. Necessary steps will be taken to solve the problems as soon as possible," said Islam Baby, mayor of the municipality.

"The picturesque tourist spots of the district attract thousands of visitors from home and abroad round the year but lack of facilities including potable water hampers tourism here," said Sirajul Islam, secretary of hotel owners' association in Bandarban.

Mymensingh divisional office has chalked out daylong programmes ahead of the Mujib Year (Mujib Borsho) scheduled to be celebrated round the next year.

The programmes included a colourful rally, discussion meeting and human chain.

Members of different socio-cultural organisations and students of different educational institutions also took part in the procession that paraded the main thoroughfares of the city.

State Minister for Cultural Affairs KM Khalid Babu inaugurated the daylong programme as the chief guest.

Divisional Commissioner Khondoker Mustafizur Rahman and Deputy Commissioner of Mymensingh Md Mizanur Rahman, among others, addressed the programme.

The divisional commissioner said the programme was declared on December 1 this year. On the same day, they also arranged a meeting, where the marriage registrars of the division were present.

Some 20 events including meetings with union parishad chairmen, members, religious leaders and guardians and students of every educational institution in the division will be held next year.

The programme will continue until the final goal is achieved, said the divisional commissioner.

Administration and police will also remain vigilant to take immediate action against the perpetrators of early marriage, he added.

Fire guts 17 houses, hurts 2

A fire gutted at least 17 houses at Nilkantho village in Belgachha union of Kurigram Sadar upazila early yesterday.

Two people also sustained burn injuries in the fire incident. They were later admitted to Kurigram General Hospital.

Local people said the fire originated from an electric short circuit of a house around 1:00am and soon engulfed the adjacent 16 dwellings.

On information, firefighters rushed to the spot and doused the blaze after hours of frantic efforts, said local union parishad (UP) member Aminul Islam.

At the time, two men sustained burn injuries when they tried to douse the fire, said villagers.

Saiful Islam, a resident of the area, said the fire gutted his household items worth Tk one lakh.

The UP member claimed that the loss caused by the fire go up to Tk 20 lakh.
