CRUYFF LEAVES CHONGQING LIFAN

Coach Jordi Cruyff has left China's Chongqing Lifan after failing to agree a new contract for next season, the club said yesterday. The 45-year-old enjoyed a successful 16 months at the Chinese Super League club, taking them from relegation candidates last year to a 10th-place finish this season. The former Manchester United and Barcelona midfielder, son of late Dutch great Johan Cruyff, paid tribute to Chongqing's supporters. "Without their backing it would have been impossible to achieve the targets we set ourselves as a team," Cruyff, who previous coaching job was at Maccabi Tel Aviv in Israel, said in a statement. "As I call time on my spell at Chongging, I wanted my first words of thanks to go to the club's fans for their constant shows of affection, which really touched me, despite the language barrier."

one win in their last 12 games. "We made an incredible result but the way we played against Manchester United was better in many, many things,'

At Molineux, Mourinho's men had to

dig deep against in-form Wolves to inflict the hosts' first league defeat in 12 games. Adama Traore's spectacular strike had

cancelled out Lucas Moura's early opener before Vertonghen stooped to guide home Christan Eriksen's corner in stoppage-time. Spurs can now move into the top four

before Christmas if they beat Chelsea at home and Mourinho has his sights on qualifying for the Champions League.

United are one point behind Tottenham after the momentum from their impressive recent run stalled in the Everton draw.

Ole Gunnar Solskjaer's side fell behind to Victor Lindelof's controversial first half own-goal after United's appeals for a foul on David de Gea were ignored by VAR.

"It was a clear foul but there's no point complaining. VAR will be better next year. They'll have to look at it," Solskjaer said.

But Greenwood, introduced in the second half, underlined his vast potential with a clinical strike 13 minutes from full-time.

Cristiano Ronaldo scored twice as Juventus bounced back from their first defeat of the season to beat Udinese 3-1 and move top of Serie A on Sunday.

Ronaldo struck twice in the first half to make it five goals in four games as champions Juve move one point ahead of leaders Inter Milan ahead of their trip to off-form Fiorentina later on Sunday.

"That's how we have to play, with confidence. Let's see what happens now," said Ronaldo.

Maurizio Sarri's side had taken just one point from their last two league games but Portuguese star Ronaldo finished off a Paulo Dybala rebound after nine minutes at the Allianz Stadium, and burst through to finish off a Gonzalo Higuain cross on 36 minutes.

Leonardo Bonucci sealed the three points just before the break when he headed in from close range.

Ignacio Pussetto pulled a goal back for 17th-placed Udinese four minutes into injury time.

Juventus play their final Serie A game before the winter break at Sampdoria on Wednesday, before a rematch against Lazio in the Italian Super Cup in Saudi Arabia next weekend.

"It is the first time after a Champions League match that we managed to attack the game well," said Sarri. "We played very well for 60 minutes."

Bangladesh The Football Federation (BFF) has once again deferred women's football league, which will be held in January

next year after the game's local governing body has failed to confirm participating clubs for the league, which was last held in 2013.

Bangladesh have had reasonable success at age-group women's football but the senior women's team, which mostly comprise of junior players, have failed to replicate that success at international level. Hence there has been a demand for a long time to resume women's league so as to give the age-group players a platform to mature by playing their football career.

of restarting women's league from October-November, the BFF in March this year had prepared a set of rules under club licensing regulations for clubs, organisations and corporate houses willing to take part. The BFF also invited its affiliated bodies and league.

But the game's local governing body failed to meet the deadline, deferring it to December. BFF also did not send the women's football team in the just-concluded South Asian Games citing the start of women's league, but it has now rescheduled the start of the league to January, a month when Bangabandhu Gold Cup international football tournament is scheduled to take place.
