

Marking Victory Day 2019, Bangladesh National Museum (BNM) is holding a 16-day special exhibition on the remnants of Liberation War at their Nalini Kanto Bhattasali Gallery.

Internationally renowned folklorist Professor Shamsuzzaman Khan, also the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, BNM, presided over the discussion on the Liberation War affairs. The event was held at the Poet Sufia Kamal Auditorium of the museum on December 16.

Renowned journalist and freedom fighter Haroon Habib attended the event as the chief discussant, while former director general of Bangladesh Television M Hamid and president of Ekatorrer Ghatok Dalal Nirmul Committee Shahriar Kabir, among others, spoke at the event.

"The prime purpose of the programme is to inform the younger generation of the true history of Bangladesh and its glorious Liberation War," Said Md Riaz Ahmed, Director General of BNM, in his welcome address.

"The anti-liberation forces tried to hinder Bangladesh's development and erase the history of the Liberation War through the gruesome killing of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman," said Haroon Habib.

A musical programme, featuring songs about the Liberation War, followed. Renowned artists Timir Nandi and Debolina Sur performed songs at the event.

Dance speaks an international language. Dancers, therefore, emphasise more on expressing their art forms, which include not only facial expressions, but also balanced corporal gestures. On the other hand, painters portray an orchestration of imageries on canvas, to express their artistic thoughts.

Merging paintings and the the essence of dance was truly an innovative gesture, arranged by renowned dance school Kolpotoru recently, at Jatra Biroti, Banani. Several promising dancers and teachers, including Taskin Anha, Arthy Ahmed, Zuairiyah Mouli, Alka Das Pranti, Sweety Das Chowdhury and Shammy Akter organised the event, titled *Natyachitra*, to educate the young dancers of Kolpotoru throughout the creative venture.

The dancers first indulged in a performance set on the song, *Dhitang Dhitang Bole*. Artist Syed Rashad Imam Tanmoy demonstrated the basics of drawings for the young dancers, elaborating on *Chhondo-Kalpo-Droom* (Rhythm-Imagination-Taal). As an artist myself, I communicated with the creative minds, shedding light on how they

could portray their eloquent dance moves on canvas. A painting exhibition, featuring different classical dance styles by emerging artist-dancer Abu Ibney Rafi and one of his disciples, added a new dimension to the event.

Zuairiyah Mouli posed in several dance mudras, as all the participants depicted their interpretations of those on their canvases. As the programme proceeded, both the teachers and students painted their imaginations, dreams and thoughts on paper, using various art media. The organisers hope to hold more such events in the future.
