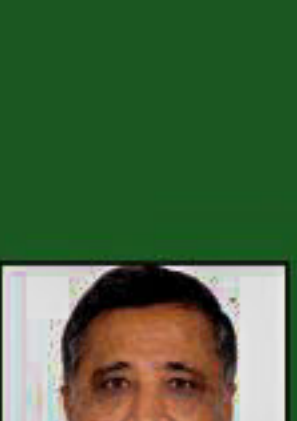

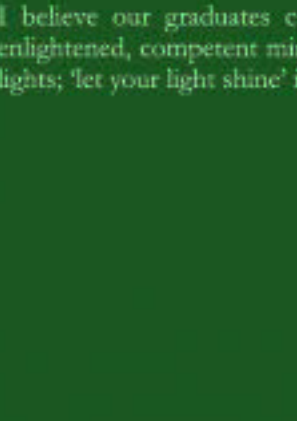

**COLLABORATION**  
NDUB has collaboration program with University of Notre Dame, Indiana, United States of America. Each year faculty members from foreign universities conduct workshop and training programs for the faculty members and students at NDUB campus. Furthermore, NDUB and Martin Luther Christian University, Shillong, Meghalaya, India signed an MoU to foster academic exchange and cooperation. Both the organizations will encourage the following academic activities of mutual interest. The two universities shall exchange academic staff/researchers/experts for delivering of lectures, exchanging of views and expertise for both long term and short term duration, conducting joint academic research for a period of time as agreed upon in advance by the relevant authorities in the two universities, participating in conferences, seminars and similar activities organized by either institute.

**CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**  
NDUB also believes in pragmatic training for the students and there NDUB presents its full-fledged running clubs at task where students explore their potentials, work on their dormant talents, learn the leadership skills and get prepared for a better future through achieving competency in career.  
Moreover, NDUB has its own in-door and outdoor game facilities. Annual sports competition is held every year. By participating in these games students are given the opportunities to be fit—mentally and physically. Also, students learn team management, leadership, resolving instant crisis, and effective communication.

**RECENT HISTORY**  
The Government of Bangladesh and its many officers and resources have cooperated enthusiastically to hasten the founding and growth of the University. The Board of Governors of Notre Dame College generously donated land on the south edge of their campus, which has become the present and future home of NDUB. Fr. Hemanto Rosario, CSC, Principal of Notre Dame College, did tireless work to prepare the initial application to the University Grants Commission. Fr. Thomas O'Hara, CSC, former President of King's College, Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, USA, the Convocation Speaker at today's First NDUB Convocation, gave long hours of valuable advice to guide the setting up of the institution and the formation of its Board of Trustees. That Board of Trustees has met continually since 2013, and with the Syndicate and Academic Council guides and supports the University leadership in holding to the founding vision and preparing for all future challenges. After five full years of teaching and learning, a dedicated faculty, a committed administration, and a talented, diverse student body have come together on our Motijheel campus on December 18, 2019, in the presence of so many generous guardians and countless well-wishers, to celebrate the entrance of NDUB's first graduates into the public life of Bangladesh and beyond. These joyful graduates and the many who will follow them through the years shall be the real proof of the worthiness of this effort and the rightness of the vision. We believe they now have "the competence to see and the courage to act."

**THE BEGINNINGS**  
Because education was seen as essential to the development of the people, every mission station developed primary, and often secondary schools. At the time, illiteracy rates were very high, and there was hope of getting everyone through class five (the standard for literacy) and then as many as possible into high school. All schools founded by the Congregation were open to all children without distinction of creed or race. The miniscule Catholic population, which today still only accounts for 0.2% of the population in Bangladesh, was providing a necessary and valued service to all the people it could reach in that vast area. With the end of the British Raj and the establishment of independent Pakistan in 1947, the Holy Cross community sought to support the new nation by extending its educational efforts to the intermediate college level (class 11 and 12). Notre Dame College opened its doors in November 1949, alongside St. Gregory's High School in Luxmibazar. A year later the college relocated to a pharmacy building nearby at Subash Bose Lane, and two years after that in 1952, Notre Dame College shifted to the newly developed area of Dhaka called Motijheel. One year after the boys' school had begun, the Holy Cross Sisters began Holy Cross College for girls at Tejaon in another section of the city. These several colleges made their mark and their reputation spread quickly. Their academic results were excellent from the start.

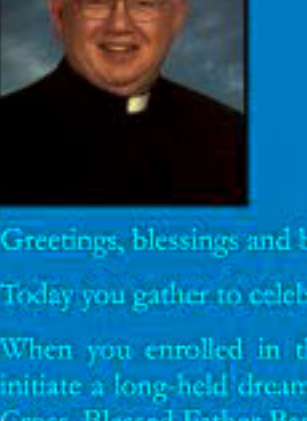

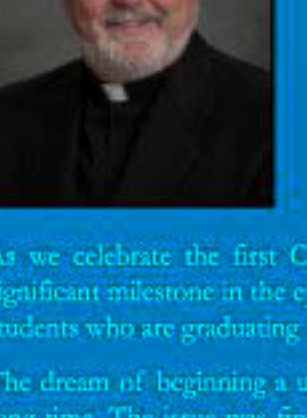
