



CHATTOGRAM WIN HIGH-SCORING THRILLER

Chattogram Challengers captain Mahmudullah Riyad is seen smashing one during a 28-ball 59 that contained five fours and four sixes. Lendl Simmons and Avishka Fernando set the tone, with a 51-run opening stand in 4.4 overs before Imrul Kayes (40 off 24) and Riyad took charge to guide Chattogram across the 200-run mark for the first time in the ongoing BBPL. Opener Mominul Haque's 35-ball 52 was outdone by Thisara Perera's 27-ball 47 but it was not enough for Dhaka Platoon to overtake the huge total of 221 for 4. Platoon were bowled out for 205 in 20 overs.

MCC to tour Pakistan

Marylebone Cricket Club confirmed yesterday they would send a touring squad to Pakistan next year under the captaincy of president Kumar Sangakkara after the recent return of Test cricket to the country. The MCC said they had accepted an invitation from the Pakistan Cricket Board to send a team to Lahore in February 2020 and would play a number of matches in the city. "It is hugely important to support cricket in countries such as Pakistan," said the now retired Sangakkara, who was injured in the attack on the Sri Lankan team bus in Lahore in 2009.

'Want the job if it's long-term'

As has happened before, Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) director and former captain Khaled Mahmud has expressed interest in taking up the national pace bowling coach's position if given the role for the long term. The post was vacated after the BCB yesterday released South African Charl Langeveldt on special consideration. The move came after Cricket South Africa requested the BCB to release the 45-year-old so that he could take up a position with the South African national team. Langeveldt was less than four months into his two-year contract with the BCB. The board is now looking for a new bowling coach for the Tigers, at the very least an interim one for Bangladesh's scheduled tour of Pakistan in January-February next year.



The 48-year-old Mahmud previously worked as the interim national head coach in the home tri-nation ODI series involving Sri Lanka and Zimbabwe in 2018 and two ensuing Tests against Sri Lanka. Mahmud also took charge as interim coach during Bangladesh's tour of Sri Lanka for a three-match ODI series in August this year, which

the Tigers lost 3-0. "I will of course be interested if given the opportunity [as a bowling coach]. Coaching is my profession, so naturally there is interest. I had worked as Bangladesh head coach twice before but for a limited time. It hurts when the job ends and the results don't come. "I had said this before... it is better if the job is given for a long term. It is tough to organise the team working on a short-term basis. Every coach has his technique and it requires time to implement. I have watched the Bangladesh team from close and know the players well. Then there is the matter of the players accepting local coaches. It's a fact that they are excited when a foreign coach takes charge," Mahmud told reporters at the MA Aziz Stadium in Chattogram yesterday. Mahmud played 12 Tests and 77 ODIs for Bangladesh, picking up 13 and 67 scalps.

Malan aces a stiff chase

The special edition of the Bangladesh Premier League (BBPL) was considered a platform for local cricketers to strut their wares and there have been quite a few instances that will have caught the selectors' eyes. Cumilla Warriors returned to winning ways with a collective approach against a struggling Rangpur Rangers who, despite posting a substantial 181 for eight, eventually faced a six-wicket defeat in the days' first game at the Zahur Ahmed Chowdhury Stadium in Chattogram yesterday. And it was a refreshing sight to see two locals in Soumya Sarkar and Sabbir Rahman score some valuable runs and gain confidence, with both batsmen scoring forties. With two wins in three games, Cumilla will certainly be riding a wave of confidence while Rangpur were still searching for their first win of the tournament, having lost all three matches so far. The left-handed Soumya, who had gotten starts in the first two games while batting at number three, was promoted

to open the innings against Rangpur and the cashed in with a compact display after a handy bowling performance with his medium pace. Along with Bhanuka Rajapaksa, Soumya provided a flying start, adding 61 runs for the first wicket before the latter was out for 32 off just 15 balls. Soumya was then joined by Sabbir who, after failing to prove his worth in the first two games, also fired. Both batsmen would however be disappointed at not being able to finish the game, with Soumya being the first to be dismissed after scoring 41 off 34 balls with five fours and a six. Sabbir hung around to take the chase further before falling one short of his fifty, leaving Dawid Malan to finish it off with an unbeaten 24 ball 42. For Rangpur, the foreign players started with Mohammad Shahzad providing a flying start and top-scoring with 61 off just 27 balls, while Mohammad Nabi and Tom Abell chipped in to post the big total. Mustafizur Rahman, however, remained below-par for Rangpur, picking up a wicket for 35 runs. However, Rangpur's young right-arm pacer Mukidul Islam impressed on his T20 debut yesterday and picked up a wicket, conceding just 26 runs from four overs.

Sharma, Rahul and Yadav level series for India

Centuries from Rohit Sharma and KL Rahul was followed by a hat-trick from Kuldeep Yadav as India emphatically levelled the three-ODI series against West Indies with a thumping 107-run win over West Indies in the second ODI in Visakhapatnam yesterday. An opening stand of 227 between Sharma and Rahul formed the basis for a massive total of 387 for five, a target that West Indies found too hot to handle, especially after left-arm chinaman bowler Yadav dismissed Shai Hope, skipper Jason Holder and Alzarri Joseph in consecutive deliveries in the 33rd over. West Indies had reached 192 for three in the 30th over with Hope

scoring 78 off 85 balls and Nicholas Pooran blazing a 47-ball 75. But Pooran was caught off Mohammad Shami and then Yadav broke West Indies by becoming the first Indian bowler to take two international hat-tricks. From 210 for eight, Keemo Paul reduced the margin of defeat with 45 before the tourists were bowled out for 280 in 43.3 overs. Earlier, Sharma led the onslaught with 159 off 138 balls with 17 fours and five sixes, while Rahul made 102. Shreyas Iyer tore into the West Indies attack with a 32-ball 53 as he hit Roston Chase for 31 runs -- including four sixes and one four -- in the 47th over. He shared in a 73-run fourth-wicket stand with wicketkeeper-batsman Rishabh Pant, who hit 39 off 16 deliveries. After a slow start, Sharma soon overtook his partner, who had raised his fifty in 46 balls, and went on to complete his 28th ODI hundred. Rahul recorded his third ODI hundred with a boundary off Joseph, but lost his wicket to the paceman four balls later when mistiming a shot to third man. Nicknamed the Hitman, Sharma registered his eighth score of 150 plus before edging an incoming delivery from paceman Sheldon Cottrell to wicketkeeper Shai Hope.
