# Nirmul committee calls for judicial enquiry

SC lawyer serves notice on Liberation War affairs minister, secretary for unconditional apology before the nation within 24 hours

Ekattorer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee yesterday demanded formation of a judicial enquiry commission to identify those involved in publishing the flawed list of Razakars.

"It is very unfortunate that freedom fighters' names were in the list," Shahriar Kabir, president of the committee, told a press conference at Dhaka Reporters

Freedom fighters' names in the list of Razakars is humiliating to the entire nation, he said.

"We want a judicial enquiry commission comprising of a judge of the Appellate Division of Supreme Court to investigate who were responsible for such a crime," he said.

He added that those responsible should be brought to book through a fair investigation.

Names of notorious opponents of the Liberation War might have been dropped due to ignorance, but the inclusion of freedom fighters in the list is a serious crime.

"They [anti-liberation individuals and their aides] hadn't been removed from different tiers of the administration yet. That's why we urged the government not to give the responsibility of important tasks like preparing the list of Razakars and martyred intellectuals to bureaucrats. Different research organisations and liberation war researchers should have been engaged."

Dana Nazlee, daughter of the Chief Prosecutor of the International Crimes Tribunal and freedom fighter Ghulam Arieff Tipoo; Selina Mirza, daughter of freedom fighter Mirza Abdul Latif; and Julfia Begum Bulu, daughter of freedom fighter Abdus Salam, attended in the briefing.

Names of their fathers appeared in the Razakar list.

## Trump impeached

Trump, 73, is accused of abusing his power by pressuring Ukraine to investigate political rival Joe Biden, a leading contender for the 2020 Democratic presidential nomination, as well as a discredited theory that Democrats conspired with Ukraine to meddle in the 2016 election.

Democrats said Trump held back and a coveted White House meeting for Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy as leverage to coerce Kiev into interfering in the 2020 election by smearing Biden.

The second article accused Trump of obstruction of Congress by directing administration officials and agencies not to comply with lawful House subpoenas for testimony and Citizenship documents related to impeachment.

Trump, who is seeking another four-year term in the November 2020 presidential election, has denied wrongdoing and called the impeachment inquiry launched by Pelosi in September a "witch hunt."

At a raucous rally for his re-election in Battle Creek, Michigan, as the House voted, Trump said the impeachment would be a "mark of shame" for Democrats and Pelosi, and cost them in the 2020 election.

"This lawless, partisan impeachment is a political suicide march for the Democrat Party," Trump said. "They're the ones who should be impeached, every one of them."

During a daylong debate before the vote, Pelosi read the US Pledge of Allegiance and said: "We are here to defend democracy for the people."

"If we do not act now, we would be derelict in our duty. It is tragic that the president's reckless actions make impeachment necessary," Pelosi said.

As the debate unfolded, Republicans accused Democrats of seeking to use an unfair, rigged process to nullify the 2016 election and influence the 2020 vote.

"The matter before the House today is based solely on a fundamental hatred of our president. It's a sham, a witch hunt - and it's tantamount to a coup against the duly elected president of the United States," Republican Representative Mike Rogers said.

Republican Representative Mike Kelly compared the impeachment to the Japanese attack on Hawaii's \$391 million in security aid intended Pearl Harbor in 1941, calling the "In fact, the Bangladesh foreign to combat Russia-backed separatists House proceedings another "date that will live in infamy" - similar to the words Democratic President Franklin Roosevelt used to describe the raid that killed about 2,400 people and led to America's entry into World War Two.

The abuse of power article was passed on a 230-197 vote and the obstruction article was passed 229-198. All of the House Republicans opposed the articles, and two Democrats, Collin Peterson and Jeff Van Drew, voted no on both. Democrat Jared Golden voted against the obstruction charge but for abuse of power.

US Representative Tulsi Gabbard, a Democratic presidential candidate, voted present on both articles, declaring in a statement: "I could not in good conscience vote either yes or Trump's election has polarized the

United States, dividing families and friends and making it more difficult for politicians in Washington to find middle ground as they try to confront pressing challenges like the rise of China and climate change. The impeachment vote comes ahead

of Trump's re-election campaign, which will pit him against the winner among a field of Democratic contenders, including Biden, who have repeatedly criticised Trump's conduct in office and promised to make it a key issue.

Reuters/Ipsos polls show that while most Democrats want to see him impeached, most Republicans do not. Televised hearings last month that were meant to build public support for impeachment appear to have pushed the two sides further apart.

The House vote on Wednesday was just the latest, but also unquestionably the biggest, in a string of controversies that have buffeted the turbulent presidency of the New York real estate mogul and former reality TV personality.

Central to the impeachment inquiry was a July 25 telephone call in which Trump asked Zelenskiy to investigate Biden and his son Hunter Biden, who had joined the board of Ukrainian energy company Burisma while his father was US vice president.

Trump has accused the Bidens of corruption without offering evidence. They have denied wrongdoing.

A rough transcript of the call released by the White House showed Trump asking Zelenskiy, elected only three months earlier and eager for American support, to "do us a favor" and conduct the investigations in coordination with his personal lawyer Rudy Giuliani.

Giuliani in the prior months had engaged in a concerted effort to persuade Ukraine to carry out the investigations. Testimony before House committees showed that Giuliani helped engineer Trump's removal last May of the US ambassador to Ukraine, who was perceived as a roadblock to those investigations.

Impeachment is a remedy devised by the United States' founders, wary of a monarch on American soil after breaking away from Britain and King George III in the 18th century, to enable Congress to remove a president who has committed "high crimes and misdemeanors."

Only two previous presidents have been impeached. The House in 1998 impeached President Bill Clinton on charges of perjury and obstruction of justice arising from a sexual relationship he had with a White House intern, but the Senate acquitted him. The House impeached President Andrew Johnson in 1868, focused on his removal of the secretary of war, but he was acquitted by one vote in the Senate.

Three youths have been sued on charge of gang-raping a tenth-grader in Dinajpur Sadar upazila on the night of Victory Day. The victim's mother filed a case

Wednesday accusing one Moksedul Islam, a resident of Julkapara village in the upazila, and two unnamed people, said Bazlur Rashid, inspector (investigation) of Dinajpur Sadar Police Station. According to the case statement,

the victim was returning home alone around 9:30pm after attending a cultural programme at Sundara Adarsha School. On her way, the three youths

intercepted her and took her to the bank of a nearby pond where they raped her. They then left the scene leaving the

girl unconscious, the statement said, adding that she gained consciousness after an hour and went home. She was admitted to M Abdur

### Rohingya 'robber' killed in Teknaf

A Rohingya man suspected of being a robber was killed in a "gunfight" with members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) in Teknaf upazila of Cox's Bazar

early yesterday. The dead -- Abdul Karim, 38, an inhabitant of Leda Rohingya camp in Teknaf's Hinla union -- was enlisted as a "robber" in the home ministry's list,

said Rab. Lt Mirza Shahed Mahtab, camp commander of Rab-15 in Teknaf, said a team of the elite force conducted an anti-drug drive in Baraitali area around 2:30am on information that some "robbers" were about to

smuggle yaba there. As soon as the Rab team reached the area, a group of criminals opened fire, forcing the law enforcers to retaliate,

he claimed. At one point of the "gunfight", Abdul Karim sustained bullet injuries. Rab members rushed him to Teknaf Upazila Health Complex. He was then taken to Cox's Bazar Sadar Hospital where doctors declared him dead, he

Rab also claimed to have recovered a locally-made gun, three bullets and 10,000 yaba pills from the spot.

The Daily Star, however, could not independently verify the Rab claims.
