All eyes on gen secretary post

Hasina for stronger AL as party council begins; delegates want clean images

Festivity was in the air. Large flags, banners, festoons and portraits of Awami League leaders were everywhere at the capital's Suhrawardy Udyan, where thousands of leaders and activists went to join the party's 21st council yesterday. Amid this festivity, everyone was curious to know who would be holding the party's general secretary post. There were discussions within the party's rank and file whether incumbent GS Obaidul Quader would get re-elected or be replaced, said insiders. What is almost certain, however, is that Sheikh Hasina, who has been leading the party since 1981, will be re-elected as the AL president, they said. Now all eyes are on the GS post as the triennial council rolls on to the final day today. A council session at The Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh, in the capital would form the party's central working committee.

INDIA'S DIVISIVE CITIZENSHIP ACT 6 killed in UP

Over 60 protesters injured; fresh clashes with police; demos in Delhi, Gujarat

Six more protesters died in India yesterday in fresh clashes between police and demonstrators, taking the death toll to 15 in more than a week of unrest triggered by a citizenship law seen as anti-Muslim. The law -- which makes it easier for persecuted minorities from three neighbouring countries to gain citizenship, but not if they are Muslim -- has stoked fears Prime Minister Narendra Modi wants to remould the world's biggest democracy India as a Hindu nation, which he denies. The latest deaths, in northern Uttar Pradesh where almost 20 percent of the state's 200-million population are Muslim, followed the loss of three lives on Thursday when police opened fire on protesters in the northern city of Lucknow and the southern city of Mangalore. Four of the demonstrators -- two from Meerut and two from neighbouring Muzaffarnagar, both in Uttar Pradesh -- died yesterday from "gunshot wounds", Meerut chief
