Errant DMP cops to face the music

700 transferred; they may face disciplinary actions if specific allegations found true

About 700 lower-tier DMP officials, including 16 officersin-charge of Dhaka metropolitan police stations, were transferred over the last two and a half months following information that they were involved in corruption and other criminal activities.

The Dhaka Metropolitan Police counter-intelligence unit received information that 200 of them were involved in corruption, said a top DMP official, preferring anonymity. Most of these errant officers were sent out of the DMP through the Police Headquarters as punishment, the

official said. He said the officials have been transferred outside Dhaka and given less important positions as intelligence report primarily found their involvement in corruption and other crimes.

"If we receive any specific complaint against anyone, we will investigate. If the officials transferred are found guilty, they will face punitive action," the official told The Daily Star yesterday wishing anonymity.

Another official said, "We have taken the initiative to remove corrupt and inefficient officers in an attempt to

Two Moncho leaders detained by police

Detectives yesterday detained two leaders of Muktijuddho Moncho over the attack on Ducsu VP Nurul Haque Nur and his supporters on Sunday.

The detainees are Al Mamun, general secretary of the platform's central unit, Injured Tuhin Farabi and Yeasir Arafat Turjo, general secretary additional commissioner of Detective

Branch of the Dhaka Metropolitan Police

(DMP), told The Daily Star yesterday noon.



He said they detained the two in the capital's Shahbagh area.

Earlier in the day, Awami League General Secretary Obaidul Quader said Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina gave a "clear instruction" take administrative and organisational action against the attackers.

BJP concedes defeat amid citizenship row

India's main opposition Congress party and its allies yesterday won Jharkhand state elections amid nationwide protests against the government's new citizenship

As the ruling BJP appeared for second place in the election, Chief Minister Raghubar Das conceded defeat.

Long way to go

Half of schoolkids lack expected level of competence in math, Bangla, finds National Student Assessment

More than half of primary schoolkids do not have the expected level of competence in mathematics and Bangla, reveals a new government assessment, raising questions about the quality of the country's primary education.

The National Student Assessment (NSA) found that 66 percent of class-III students and 67 percent of class-V students did not achieve the desirable level of competence in mathematics in their respective grades.

In Bangla, 53 percent of third graders and 56 percent of fifth graders could not gain adequate competence, shows the NSA 2017, published by the Directorate of Primary Education (DPE) in October this year.

There has been a debate over the quality of education over the last several years though pass rates in public examinations are going up every year. Experts blame lack of proper classroom teaching, high student-teacher

ratio, shortage of teachers, lack of infrastructure, and insufficient budget, for such a gloomy picture of primary education. Students mostly rely on private tuition and coaching classes as concerns

remain over the quality of classroom teaching-learning, experts said. SEE PAGE 2 COL 1
