Bethlehem welcomes pilgrims for Christmas celebrations

Pilgrims from around the world yesterday gathered in the biblical city of Bethlehem, revered by Christians as the birthplace of Jesus, to celebrate Christmas in the Holy Land.

Palestinians and foreigners began converging on the "little town" in the Israeli-occupied West Bank from early morning, with Christmas Eve festivities taking place in and around the Church of the Nativity. Tourists queued to visit the grotto

inside the church, believed to be the exact site where Jesus was born, with Ola, a Nigerian visitor, saying it was a "special day." Outside in the winter sun,

hundreds watched as Palestinian scouts paraded to the sound of drums. "I feel really emotional to be here

today, it's wonderful," said Germana, an Italian travelling with her husband and two children. Archbishop Pierbattista Pizzaballa, apostolic administrator of the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem and the most

Middle East, was due to travel from Jerusalem to Bethlehem yesterday morning. He will lead midnight mass in the Church of the Nativity, with

senior Roman Catholic official in the

Palestinian president Mahmud Abbas expected to attend. Bethlehem is close to Jerusalem,

but cut off from the holy city by Israel's separation barrier. The first church was built on the

site in the fourth century, though it was replaced after a fire in the sixth century. This year celebrations were bolstered by the return of a wooden

fragment believed to be from the manger of Jesus. Sent as a gift to Pope Theodore I

in 640, the piece had been in Europe for more than 1,300 years before being returned last month, Francesco Patton, chief custodian for the Holy Land, said.

of Saint Petersburg to the Crimean port city of Sevastopol covers a distance of 2,500 kilometres (1,550 miles).

Putin said the bridge would restore rail links to Crimea severed in 2014 when Moscow annexed the peninsula, sparking an ongoing separatist conflict in eastern Ukraine that has claimed more 13,000 lives.

The company of Putin's close ally, billionaire businessman Arkady Rotenberg, won the construction contract for the bridge. He sold the

company last month. Putin told workers an anecdote about receiving an emotional call from "your main boss with the simple Russian surname Rotenberg,'

after the completion of a key stage of the project. "He called me at night and spoke in such a voice that I asked him 'Have

you been drinking?'" the Russian

leader said. The coverage of the project has been reminiscent of Soviet infrastructure projects, with a newsreader on state-controlled Rossiya 24 television channel calling the opening "without exaggeration

historic." Russia says it is the longest railway

bridge in Europe.

Ukraine was unhappy about both the rail link and Putin's presence at the opening.

President Volodymyr Zelensky's representative office for Crimea said in a statement on Facebook that the rail link and Putin's visit to Crimea were "a gross breach by the Russian side of Ukraine's sovereignty and

territorial integrity." It showed "disregard by the Kremlin of the universally recognised principles and norms of international

law," the statement said.

In both the cases, "criminals" opened fire on Rab members first,

forcing them to retaliate.

During the "gunfights", both the "criminals" sustained bullet injuries and died.

In Cox's bazar, Rab members rushed Rubel to Cox's Bazar General Hospital where doctors declared him dead. In Pabna, Amin died on the

spot of the "gunfight". The bodies were sent to morgues for autopsies.

Rab in Cox's Bazar recovered 10,000 yaba pills, one locally made gun and three bullets while Rab in Pabna recovered one pistol and two sharp weapons from the scene.

in 2010 along with the house-listing phase of Census of India 2011. The data was updated in 2015 by conducting door-to-door survey. The digitisation of the updated information has been completed.

Prince Philip leaves hospital after four nights

Britain's Prince Philip left a London hospital yesterday after a four-night stay that renewed concern about the 98-year-old's health, in time to join the royal family for Christmas. Queen Elizabeth II's husband,

dressed in a suit, took a few steps before being helped into a dark green Land Rover parked by a side entrance of the King Edward VII hospital, where he was admitted on Friday, an AFP reporter said.

"The Duke of Edinburgh has today left hospital after being discharged by his doctor and is now back at Sandringham," where the royal family traditionally spends Christmas Day, Buckingham Palace said in a statement.

"His royal highness would like to thank everyone who sent their good wishes." Buckingham Palace has released

little information about the duke's health, saying only that he went in for "observation and treatment in relation to a pre-existing condition". It stressed that it was a

"precautionary measure". The duke was reportedly flown

there by helicopter from the royal Sandringham estate in eastern England, where he has been based since retiring from public duties in

The Sun tabloid reported that Philip has suffered a month of illhealth, including a "bad fall" which left him confined to bed for a couple of days.

In recent years, he has been admitted to hospital for abdominal surgery, bladder infections and a blocked coronary artery, while he is also reported to suffer from arthritis in his right wrist.

Iran arrests family of young man killed in 'riots': report

Iran has arrested the family of a young man killed in street violence that flared during last month's protests against fuel price hikes, Mehr news agency reported yesterday. The family of Pouya Bakhtiari,

who was "killed suspiciously during the recent riots", had been invited for talks with authorities, Mehr said citing what it called an informed source. They were found to have been
