

Children, elderly the worst sufferers

Cold-related illnesses ail people across country; 4,196 received treatment at govt hospitals in last 24 hours

With a cold wave sweeping through the country, the number of people -- especially children and the elderly -- falling into cold-related illnesses is rising in many districts.

A total of 4,196 patients received treatment for cold-related ailments at different government hospitals nationwide in the last 24 hours till 8am yesterday, according to the control room of the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS).

"Many of them received treatment at outpatient departments of government hospitals, while others were admitted," said Dr Ayesha Akther, assistant director of Health Emergency Operation Center and Control Room of the DGHS.

"Children and elderly persons are more vulnerable to cold-related illnesses," she told The Daily Star last night.

Referring to the DGHS statistics, UNB reports that some 668 of the patients received treatment for acute respiratory infection, while another 1,639 were treated for diarrhoea, and 1,889 for other issues including jaundice, inflammation in the eye, skin diseases, and fever.

Five deaths were reported across the country between November 1 and December 28 due to cold-related diseases, reports UNB.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh Meteorological Department (BMD) in a weather bulletin

yesterday said a mild to moderate cold wave may continue today, with prevalence of moderate to thick fog.

Night temperatures may fall slightly, and day temperature may rise slightly over the country, said the BMD forecast.

Yesterday's minimum temperature was

recorded as 7.2 degree Celsius in Dinajpur, while the maximum was in Sylhet at 25 degrees.

Our correspondents from different districts sent reports on the situation.

In Bogura, at least 20 children were admitted with pneumonia and diarrhoea, and 20-25 adult patients admitted with asthma in last two days, said Abdul Wadud, assistant director of the 1,200-bed Bogura Shaheed Ziaur Rahman Medical College Hospital.

The district's civil surgeon Gausul Azim Chowdhury said some 45 diarrhoea patients and five pneumonia patients were admitted to 11 upazila health complexes in the district.

In Nilphamari, dense fog disrupted communication, as the sun was not visible in the last two days.

Local met office forecast that the cold spell might continue for the next three days.

The district's civil surgeon Ranjit Kumar Barman said some 550 people have been admitted to the district hospital and six upazila health complexes in the last seven days, with cold-related illnesses.

In Barishal, sudden rain and biting cold brought sufferings to the people in the last three days.

Road and river communications were severely hampered while many -- mostly children -- were suffering from cold-related ailments.

'Country not being run according to constitution'

Says Dr Kamal at JSD council

Jatiya Oikyafront convener Dr Kamal Hossain yesterday said people cannot exercise their power as owners of the country, since Bangladesh is not run as per its constitution.

"Even after 50 years of the country's independence, we have to seek our constitutional power back. Our power have been usurped ... we're not allowed to exercise our power as they [government] were not elected truly," he said.

Dr Kamal further said, "I would like to firmly say that the country's current governance system is not operated as per the constitution. Our leaders had written in the constitution that people are owners [sources] of power. But we're not allowed to enjoy it and the benefits of the independence."

He made the remarks while speaking at the triennial council of Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (JSD-Rob) at Mohanagar Natya Mancha auditorium.

The Gonothread chief said those who think they can buy people and keep the governance system under their grip with black money are living in fool's paradise.

Regretting that the ruling party has been in power resorting to falsehood and spreading lies over the general election and its results, he called upon the government to hold a fresh election after bringing changes to the Election Commission.

He said their alliance wants to restore people's ownership of the country on the eve of the Golden Jubilee of Independence.

Speaking at the programme, BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir said Awami League has established a "puppet government" in the country, destroying the spirit of the Liberation War.

Shift focus to agro-based industry: BCI

President of Bangladesh Chamber of Industries (BCI) Anwar-ul Alam Chowdhury Parvez yesterday underscored the need for focusing on agro-based industry to ensure sustainable economic growth after the country's graduation from the group of Least Developed Countries (LDCs).

"Bangladesh's economy largely depends on RMG [readymade garments], textiles, foreign remittance and agricultural production. But to ensure sustainable economic growth after the country's graduation from the group of LDCs, we have to decrease our dependence on those and instead focus more on potentially viable sectors like light engineering, agro-based industry, halal products, blue economy and leather goods," he said while addressing the 33rd BCI annual general meeting at its office in the capital.

Parvez further said the volume of global market for light engineering is \$7 trillion, whereas Bangladesh exports only \$319.4 million.

The chamber has already taken initiatives to create new entrepreneurs and develop micro- and small industries apart from putting emphasis on light engineering and agro-processing industry, Parvez said.

Former BCI presidents Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu and Shahedul Islam Helal, senior vice president Md Helal Uddin and vice president Priti Chakraborty, as well as directors and general members of BCI were present.

Woman's decomposed body recovered in Savar

Jute mill workers call hunger strike again after talks fall apart

Workers of eight state-owned jute mills in Khulna and Jashore industrial belt will go on an indefinite hunger strike again from this afternoon.

The decision was taken on Thursday, after a third meeting in Dhaka -- held between jute mill workers and leaders, and authorities from the Bangladesh Jute Mill Corporation (BJMC) and the Textiles and Jute Ministry -- failed to reach an understanding, said sources.

Earlier on December 10, the jute mill workers started a hunger strike to press home their 11-point demand, including implementation of national wage commission. One worker died and over two hundred fell sick during the hunger strike, which was suspended on December 13, after a meeting with State Minister for

Labour and Employment Monnujan Sufian.

Following this, two meetings were held in Dhaka on December 15 -- one at the jute ministry and another at the BJMC office, in presence of all parties.

"Workers agreed to suspend the hunger strike till December 17. Later, the date was extended to December 22. But after the third meeting -- held between jute mill workers and leaders, and authorities from the Bangladesh Jute Mill Corporation and the Textiles and Jute Ministry -- failed to reach an understanding, we made the decision," said Murad Hossain, former president of Crescent Jute Mill and joint convener of CBA and Non-CBA Sangram Parishad.

"State minister Monnujan Sufian asked for another month to fulfil our demands, but we do not want to give

more time," said Murad Hossain.

Meanwhile, workers of eight state-owned jute mills in Khulna-Jashore industrial belt organised rallies yesterday at their respective mill gates.

Several thousand workers of Daulatpur, Khalishpur, Crescent, Platinum and Star jute mills gathered in front of their mill gates around 10am and took part in the demonstrations. Workers of Alim and Eastern jute mills also gathered in Atra industrial area of the city.

In Jashore, workers of Jashore Jute Industry (JJ) yesterday also announced to go on a hunger strike in Rajhat area from today, from a demonstration in front of their mill gate.

The workers' demands include cancellation of public-private

Four snatchers arrested in M'singh

Police arrested four alleged snatchers and seized a car from their possession in Bhaluka of Mymensingh early yesterday.

The arrestees were identified as Shahadat Hossain (38), from Barguna; Shah Alam (28), from Cumilla; Swapon Mia (28), from Mymensingh; and Ujjol Mia (30), from Sherpur, police said.

The four took one Sajib Mia in the car as a passenger from Mymensingh city's Bypass Road around 12:30am, said Mohammad Mainuddin, officer-in-charge of Bhaluka Police Station.

When the car crossed Trishal upazila headquarters, the snatchers took away a mobile phone and Tk 1,190 in cash from Sajib and left him beside Dhaka-Mymensingh highway in Chelerghat area, said the OC.

Taking help from locals, Sajib informed Bhoraduba highway police about the incident.

Later, a police team halted the car in Bhaluka Bus Stand area and arrested the four, said the OC.

Police seized five mobiles, one owned by Sajib, and the snatched money.

The arrestees were handed over to Trishal Police Station yesterday.

A Mymensingh court sent them to jail when they were produced before it later in the day, said Trishal Police Station OC Md Azizur Rahman.
