Three kids drown

Three children drowned in Lalmonirhat and Kurigram on Wednesday.

A five-year-old boy drowned while playing beside a pond near his house at Singimari village in Lalmonirhat's Hatibandha upazila around 1:30pm.

The deceased, Mishkat Hossain, was son of Nurul Islam of the village.

Away in Kurigram, another boy Rokon Miah, 5, son of Haran Miah of Char Gorokmandal village in Phulbari upazila, drowned in a pond around 4:00pm the same afternoon.

Villagers spotted Rokon's body floating in a pond water and recovered it.

Meanwhile, three-yearold Nasrin Akhter, daughter of Nazir Hossain of Purbo Phulmati village in the upazila, drowned in a pond near her house the same afternoon.

Locals said the minor girl slipped into the pond water while playing beside it and drowned.

Youth found dead

Police recovered the body of a youth from a waterbody in Naogaon's Atrai upazila on Wednesday, a day after he went missing from a relative's house in Manda upazila of same district.

The deceased, Sohel Rana, 20, was son of Mohammad Zakaria of Mohipur village in Chapainawabganj Sadar upazila.

Sohel came to visit one of his relative's house at Turukbaria village in Manda upazila couple of days ago.

Quoting the victim's relatives and locals, police said Sohel went out of the house on Tuesday noon and

FLOODING CAUSED BY HIGH TIDE

Crop on 65,000 hectares under water in Patuakhali

Torrential rain coupled with the recent unusual high tide inundated about 65,000 hectares of croplands in Patuakhali, where about 200 millimetres of rainfall was recorded in the last seven days.

The Water Development Board (WDB) said the water in local rivers was flowing 74 centimetres above the danger level.

According to the Patuakhali Department of Agricultural Extension (DAE), seasonal vegetables as well as Aus and Aman rice were cultivated on a total of 1.47 lakh hectares of land in the district this year.

Out of 89,600 hectares of land where Aman was planted, 32,015 hectares were submerged in floodwaters, caused by incessant rain and high tide over the last seven days.

Different varieties of Aus including high-yielding varieties were cultivated on 38,360 hectares

of land, but the crop on 24,918 hectares has gone under water.

Summer vegetables were planted on 3,175 hectares and those on 2,630 hectares are now inundated in floodwaters.

High tides are a natural phenomenon that occurs during the ascent of the new moon, but the tide this time has been unusually high, said officials at the WDB in Patuakhali.

Hridayeshwar Dutta, deputy director of DAE in Patuakhali, said

the unusual flooding is a result of incessant rain caused by monsoon winds as well as the rise in water level due to the tidal water caused by the new moon.

Aman farmers might be able to recover the losses by replanting the crop, but summer vegetable farmers may not be able to recover the damage, he added.

Farmer Rafiqul Islam, from Kismat Moukaran village in Laukathi union of Sadar upazila, said he cultivated seasonal vegetables on 40 decimals of land this year and he was able to harvest some of those for only two days, before his vegetable field got flooded.

With water covering the field for an entire week, all the vegetables underneath have started to rot, he said frustratingly.

Sobhan Khan of the same village spent Tk 13,000 to plant summer vegetables on 15 decimals of land. But all his investment -- the money and the labour -- is likely to go in vain, he lamented.

Woman, son found dead in Jamalpur

A woman and her three-year-old son were found dead at their house in Madarganj upazila of the district on Wednesday.

The deceased are Moslema Aktar Shikha, 35, wife of Harun-or-Rashid Palash of Chargopalpur village in the upazila, and their minor son Tauhid.

Informed by Gunaritola Union Parishad (UP) Chairman

Joynal Abedin, a police team went to the spot and found Shikha and her son lying dead on the bed.

They recovered the bodies and sent those to Jamalpur

General Hospital for autopsy, Officer in Charge (OC) of Madarganj Police Station Rafiqul Islam said. Jamalpur Additional Superintendent of Police (Admin & Crime) Shema Rani Sarker, who visited the spot, said

they detained Shikha's husband Palash, a worker at a saw mill, suspecting his involvement in the double murder.

During primary interrogation, Palash told the police that he went out of his house to catch fish on Tuesday

night.
When he returned home around 1:30am he found the

main door of the house was open. He then rushed in and spotted his wife Shikha and son

Tauhid lying dead on the bed, police said. Later, Palash informed the matter to local UP chairman Joynal, police said, adding that they were verifying Palash's

statement.

While preparing the first inquest report (surathal), they found both the bodies bore several injury marks, said the additional SP, adding that they primarily suspect that the woman and her son were strangled to death.

Police were trying to unearth the motive behind the killings, OC Rafiqul said.

Lalmonirhat Rover Scouts working to resist Dharla erosion

The district administration also joined hands with them

Members of Lalmonirhat district Rover Scout are working relentlessly to protect Char Falimari village from erosion by the Dharla river.

Local people said the bordering village is now under threat of being washed away due to erosion of the river. The river has devoured about 500 metres at the village in Moghalhat union of Sadar upazila.

The villagers have also joined the work on voluntary basis. They themselves have collected bamboos and wood, which are being used for piling at the erosion points.

Arman Rahman, secretary of Lalmonirhat district Rover Scout, said the district Rover Scout members are working hard in the hot sun to check the river erosion. The district administration authorities have also joined hands with them.

He further said Additional Deputy Commissioner (General) in Lalmonirhat Md Rafiqul Islam himself is filling the sack with sand. Later, the sand-filled sacks are being dumped at the eroded points to protect the village from the river erosion.

Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC) (General) in Lalmonirhat Md Rafiqul Islam told The Daily Star that the Rover Scouts of the district have given

5,000 plastic bags. The bags are being filled with sand and later, the sand bags are being dumped at the erosion points.

The ADC further added that Lalmonirhat Water Development Board (WDB) authority has also given 1000 geo-bags. The villagers themselves have given 650 bamboos. The bamboos are being used for piling.

"We all are working together to check the erosion and save Char Falimari village from the clutch of Dharla," he added.

Erosion-hit victim Sekendar Ali of the village said despite repeated pleas, the authorities concerned are yet to take any steps to protect the village from erosion.

Finding no other alternative, they have joined hands with the Rover Scouts to resist the river erosion, he said, adding that both the Rover Scout members and villagers have been working relentlessly for the last several days.

The work of dumping sand bags at erosion-prone points in the village will continue for a few more days, said Sekendar.

Erosion at some points at the village has already been stopped following dumping of sandbags, he said.

The erosion-hit villagers have also urged the government to take immediate steps to stop the river erosion permanently.
