

Railway mulls anti-collision

matter came to the fore again after a fatal train accident in Brahmanbaria last year.

The Dhaka-bound Turna Nishita rammed Chattogram-bound Udayan Express at Mandobagh Railway Station in Kasba early on November 12, 2019, that left 17 passengers dead and many others injured.

Probe committees found negligence of the driver, his assistant and the guard of Turna Nishita Express was responsible for the fatal accident.

In their reports, probe committees recommended the introduction an "Automatic Train Stop" system to avoid any head-on collision between two trains.

Jahangir Hossain, the project director of construction of Khulna-Mongla Port Rail Line, has prepared the draft study proposal titled "feasibility study, technology selection, specification finalization and detail design of Automatic Train Protection System for Bangladesh Railway".

Speaking to The Daily Star yesterday, Jahangir said developed countries like the US, Japan and European countries have already introduced ATPS and India also introduced it recently.

Once the system is introduced, a train would be automatically stopped if it overshoots danger or red signal due to failure of designated staffers, and thus head on collisions can be avoided, he said.

Mahmudul appeared in the first part examination in May last year while the examinations for Part-2 were held on October 27 this year.

"My father -- now around 75 -- was a businessman. He had a desire to raise one of his children to be a doctor. Besides, I had an interest in medicine anyway. So, when I appeared for medical admission tests, I got selected," Mahmudul said.

Dr Abdullah-Al-Murad, civil surgeon of Shariatpur district told The Daily Star, "It is really a great achievement. We congratulate him. We knew Dr Mahmud as a bookworm and he proved it!"

their homegrown mRNA vaccine. "We had nine meetings with icddr,b during the last three months. They agreed and signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) on October 14. Yet another one and a half months have passed, but they cannot make satisfactory progress. So, we sent them a letter yesterday [Monday] informing of our decision to cancel the contract," Md Mohiuddin, manager of quality and regulation operation at Globe Biotech Ltd, told The Daily Star yesterday.

The International Centre for Diarrhoeal Disease Research, Bangladesh (icddr,b) refused to make a comment at this time.

On October 5, Globe Biotech announced that its first vaccine candidate had passed in the pre-clinical trial on mice and was ready for a clinical trial.

On October 17, Bancovid, along with two other vaccine candidates developed by the Globe Biotech Ltd, were included in the draft landscape of the World Health Organisation (WHO).

is being unfairly maligned," ANI quoted SII as saying.

The man had served a legal notice on SII, claiming to have suffered a virtual neurological breakdown and impairment of cognitive functions, seeking Rs 5 crore in compensation and a halt to the trial.

The SII has collaborated with Oxford University and AstraZeneca Plc in testing Covishield, the vaccine candidate they developed.

Along with SII, the man also named Indian Council of Medical Research, one of the sponsors, and Chennai-based Sri Ramachandra Institute of Higher Education and Research, which administered the vaccine to the man.

The man, according to the notice, suffered acute encephalopathy, a disease that affects the brain, following vaccination and all tests confirmed that the setback in his health was because of the vaccine candidate.

The Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) had deployed an institutional ethics committee at the implementation site to investigate the adverse event.

In Europe, the European Commission is likely to give the final authorisation for the roll-out of Covid-19 vaccines days after the EU drug regulator approves them, a spokesman for the EU executive said.

cause list of the Appellate Division on March 6, 2018, for their hearing.

The same day, a four-member bench of the Appellate Division headed by Chief Justice Syed Mahmud Hossain adjourned hearing of the appeals for four weeks after the then Additional Attorney General Murad Reza prayed for time to take preparation for placing arguments on the issue.

Later, the appeals were not heard by the apex court as none of the parties took any move for hearing the matter.

Murad Reza resigned from his post on October 11 this year.

Contacted, Attorney General AM Amin Uddin, who was appointed to the post on October 8 this year, told this paper on November 29 that his office would place arguments before the Appellate Division in support of the appeals when these would come up before the apex court serially.

The attorney general said his office would not take any initiative for hearing of the appeals at this moment as the apex court is not hearing and disposing of the old cases due to the pandemic.

SC lawyer Tajul Islam, one of the writ petitioners, said they would not take any initiative for hearing the appeals as the government, which is the main respondent to the case and has filed the appeal against the HC judgment, is not so serious about quick hearing and disposal of the appeals.

The government should take steps for hearing the appeals, he added.

Referring to findings of the World Health Organization (WHO), the secretary said, "Global studies showed that anybody can stay safe, even up to 95 percent if he/she wears a protected mask. So everyone, including children and adults, has to wear masks. Other health regulations, including social distancing, have to be maintained accordingly."

He also said the government has continued the "no mask no service" campaign countrywide and the hospitals are preparing themselves for tackling the possible second wave.

On Monday, Cabinet Secretary Khandker Anwarul Islam said in a press briefing at the secretariat that the government would initially distribute three crore doses of Oxford-AstraZeneca Covid-19 vaccine among people for free.

A proposal to buy the vaccine from Serum Institute of India has been sent by the health ministry to the cabinet committee on economic affairs for approval. The committee will sit today to discuss the matter.

"Approval from the Economic Affairs Committee is required as per section 76 of the Public Procurement Rules since it will be bought from a

With this, the total number of deaths rose to 6,675 while the death rate stood at 1.43 percent. Another 2,293 cases were recorded in the same 24 hours taking the total number of positive cases to 4,67,225 added the release.

Against a number of 15,501 tests conducted in those 24 hours throughout the country, the positivity rate was 14.79 percent, while the overall positivity rate stood at 16.76 percent.

BANGABANDHU REACHES JHALKATHI

Prime Minister Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Rahman who left Dhaka on November 29 on a visit to the coastal areas, arrives at Jhalkathi today. The prime minister is on a three-day visit to the coastal areas to see for himself the coastal embankment projects, arrangements for the conservation of coastal forests and preservation of wildlife. At Jhalkathi the PM is

received by Awami League leaders and workers and local people.

Out of a total of 2,500 miles of coastal embankment proposed under the first phase, 2,150 miles have already been completed. The remaining 350 miles of embankments would be completed by early next year when the second phase of the project would be taken up. JS body for home wants to see process

the committee on whether the respective ministries organised such foreign trips with the ministry's fund.

The government has several times given its opinion against the parliamentary committee's foreign tours with the ministry's funding.

At a meeting held in late August, the parliamentary standing committee on home affairs ministry had recommended the respective ministry to organise a foreign tour.

The committee made the recommendation to get a better idea on how to make the activities of the agencies under the ministry and the UN missions in different countries more dynamic and effective.

In another meeting held in late November, the ministry informed the standing committee about the progress in this regard.

The committee was informed that passport and visa related activities are underway in 15 Bangladesh missions.

Employees of the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Department of Immigration and Passports are working in the Passport and Visa Wing in these missions, the ministry informed the committee.

Once the Covid-19 situation is normal, a plan can be made to inspect the passport and visa issuance activities at those missions, the

ministry told the standing committee.

According to the ministry, the nine countries these 15 missions are situated in are: the United States, Saudi Arabia, United Arab Emirates, the United Kingdom, Malaysia, Italy, Kuwait, Singapore and Qatar.

Speaking to The Daily Star, Md Shamsul Haque Tuku, chairman of the standing committee, said the committee in its meeting had discussed this issue, but no decision was not finalised.

"I told the meeting that such tours were not necessary at this moment," he also said.

The ruling Awami League MP from Pabna-1 also said they actually wanted to get a first-hand experience how different foreign missions are delivering services to our expatriate Bangladeshis.

"We could get that information over telephone. But sometimes first-hand experience becomes useful," he also said.

According to the Jatiya Sangsads Rules of Procedure, the function of the Parliamentary Committees under the Ministry is to review the activities of the respective ministries, to investigate irregularities and serious allegations and to examine the Bills or any matter sent by the Parliament.

The government often discourages such visit of the parliamentary

standing committee members with the funding of the respective ministry.

In a letter to the Speaker in 2016, the then Finance Minister AMA Muhib had said, "The financial discipline of the government is being ruined due to the foreign tours by the parliamentary committee with the money of the ministry."

In 2016, the Prime Minister's Office opined that the Parliament Secretariat may bear the cost of foreign trips of MPs following the parliamentary standing committee on expatriate welfare and overseas employment ministry's recommendations to arrange a foreign trip.

Parliament affairs expert Nizamuddin Ahmed, also a former professor of Chattogram University told The Daily Star, that the recommendation of the parliamentary committee on the home ministry was not reasonable.

"The parliamentary committee does not have any moral basis to hold the ministry accountable for its activities after traveling abroad with the money of the ministry. If the visit was in the interest of an investigation or in the interest of state security, then it would be logical," he said.

He said MPs can definitely travel abroad if necessary. But for this, a separate budget should be allocated in the budget of parliament.
