## Bangladesh's real wage suffers steepest plunge in Asia: ILO

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In Asia and the Pacific, Bangladesh is one of the few examples where minimum wages are set entirely according to industry, the ILO said.

As of 2020, around 18 per cent of countries (29 countries) with statutory minimum wages exclude agricultural workers, domestic workers or both categories from minimum wage regulations.

Of these, seven countries – namely, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Jordan, Lebanon, Pakistan, Sudan and Syria – exclude both agricultural and domestic workers.

Zahid Hussain, a former lead economist of the World Bank's Dhaka office, said the real annual wage in Bangladesh is not adjusted annually, taking into account the total labour productivity.

If the wage had been adjusted, it would not have eroded significantly, he said. "During the period, the policymakers have not reviewed it, and inflation has always been positive."

Bangladesh revises the minimum wage every five years and it last did so in December 2018, the ILO report said.

Rizwanul Islam, a former special adviser for employment sector at the International Labour Office in Geneva, said a decline in real wages or the inability of real wages to keep pace with the growth of labour productivity are essential mechanisms through which income inequality can increase.

Sayema Haque Bidisha, a professor of the department of economics at the University of Dhaka, said the laws related to minimum wages and trade unions apply to a few industries in the formal sector.

"We don't have proper legislations. There

are a lot of people in the informal sector. So, the country is yet to take the minimum wage to a level through strong trade unions, proper legislations and formalisation and documentation of workers."

Prof Bidisha called for expanding the legislation of the minimum wage to bring more industries under its framework.

She said the wage has to be related to the inflation rate. If the growth in wages is not higher than the inflation rate, it would not be meaningful for workers.

In Bangladesh, inflation has averaged more than 6 per cent in the last decade.

The ILO report said the pandemic made it more difficult for national authorities to collect statistics. However, there is abundant case study evidence of workers having to accept – at least temporarily – shorter hours and/or wage cuts.

In a press release, ILO Director-General Guy Ryder said: "Our recovery strategy must be human-centred. We need adequate wage policies that take into account the sustainability of jobs and enterprises, and also address inequalities and the need to sustain demand."

Adequate minimum wages can protect workers against low pay and reduce inequality, said Rosalia Vazquez-Alvarez, one of the authors of the report.

"But ensuring that minimum wage policies are effective requires a comprehensive and inclusive package of measures. It means better compliance, extending coverage to more workers, and setting minimum wages at an adequate, up-to-date level that allows people to build a better life for themselves and their families."

## Imports for manufacturing slump

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The economy is now in dire straits because of the pandemic, so the government needs to take measures to give a boost to the economy, he said.

Both the central bank and the government should emphasise implementing the stimulus packages quickly, which will give a momentum to the business sector, he said.

The cost of doing business should be brought down to ensure faster growth, he said.

Zahid Hussain, a former lead economist of the World Bank's Dhaka office, said reducing the trade gap is a good sign for any economy and it has caused the foreign exchange reserve to balloon.

The reserve stood at \$41.18 billion as of November 25 in contrast to \$31.72 billion a year ago, aided mainly by a robust remittance flow.

"These events are helping the central bank inject liquidity into the market."

But there is no scope to be complacent as the trade gap has narrowed in the wake of a

collapse in demand, Hussain said.

"In brief, we can say that the indicators of the BoP are a signal of the weak economic recovery," Hussain said.

The fall in the trade gap and the increasing trend of remittance fuelled the current account, a record of a country's international transactions with the rest of the world.

Between July and October, the current account posted a surplus of \$4.05 billion in contrast to a deficit of \$1.52 billion.

"The sluggishness in the imported items for the textile and garment sectors is not a good sign at all," said Asif Ibrahim, a director of the Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association.

The industrial sector has been facing many challenges due to the business slowdown. The world has already been hit hard by the second wave of infections, he said.

"The government should think of unveiling the second round of stimulus packages to protect the economy from the existing crisis," said Ibrahim, also a former president of the Dhaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

Besides, the EU is also enhancing its engagement with Myanmar on the EBA facility because of the Rohingya crisis.

"So, we have instruments at our disposal to address human rights issues in Myanmar. It is not only related to the Rohingya but other ethnic problems too," she said.

The EU ambassador said the whole international community should work together for a solution to the crisis and that it was not right to single out the role of the EU.

"Look at India and China and many other countries in ASEAN. We don't see a unified approach. We see Malaysia sometimes positive but see them pushing back Rohingya boats at the same time. I think the whole international community should work together."

"Look at what other countries are doing. We all need to work together," she said.

## Xiaomi shares slide 7.1pc after finalising \$3.9b in equity deal

Chinese smartphone maker Xiaomi Corp's shares fell 7.1 per cent in Hong Kong trading on Wednesday as the company finalised a \$3.91 billion capital raising that included the city's largest top up placement.

The company said 1 billion shares were sold at HK\$23.70 each as part of the top up deal that was carried out overnight. The final price was a 9.4 per cent discount to Xiaomi's closing price of HK\$26.15 on Tuesday.

Trading of Xiaomi's stock was halted during the morning session before the company released details of the capital raise during Hong Kong's lunch break, when trading is stopped for an hour.
