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Many univs keen on final year exams

They want to avert session jams; students want to be able to sit for BCS tests

Many public universities are in favour of holding semester exams for final year students to negate session jam and make students qualified for sitting in the upcoming BCS exams.

Students, mostly of honours final year exams, are holding demonstrations demanding exams and some of them are contacting with authorities with the same demand.

Universities are waiting for the decision of the University Grants Commission (UGC) as it, in June, asked universities to hold online classes and exams and practical classes will take place after normalcy returns.

Against this backdrop, the University Grants Commission is scheduled to hold a discussion in a meeting today about the exams.

"We have monthly meeting on Sunday, and one of the agenda will be exams of public universities," UGC Member Prof Muhammed Alamgir told The Daily Star yesterday.

He said that many public universities had sent letter or contacted UGC about decision on exams specially those for honours final year and master's level.

"In some places, students are protesting on the demand of exams, so we will discuss the matter and hopeful that we will be able to know all a decision soon," he said.

UK, EU call in leaders to save trade talks

British Prime Minister Boris Johnson was scheduled to speak to European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen yesterday to try to break an impasse in trade talks with time running out to avoid a chaotic end to the Brexit saga.

Britain left the European Union on Jan 31 but rules governing trade, travel and business have remained unchanged during a transition period which ends on Dec 31, when a new relationship will be established - with or without a deal.

The talks between Johnson and von der Leyen could provide the political impetus to move the sides closer to bridging their substantial differences, or highlight how the "red lines" on both sides mean a deal remains out of reach.

If the two sides fail to reach a deal, the five-year Brexit divorce will end messily just as Britain and

Vaccines no magic bullet

Reminds WHO; Russia starts inoculating vulnerable workers against coronavirus

The World Health Organization warned that vaccines were no magic bullet for the coronavirus crisis, as Russia started vaccinating its high-risk workers yesterday and other countries geared up for similar programmes.

The WHO warned about what it said was an erroneous belief that the Covid-19 crisis is over with jabs on the horizon, nearly a year after the start of the pandemic that has killed 1.5 million people worldwide.

"Vaccines do not equal zero Covid," said WHO emergencies director Michael Ryan, adding that not everyone will be able to receive it early next year.

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
