the killing. Nasim Ahmed, officer-in-charge of Pabna Sadar Police Station, said there had been a long-standing enmity between Mokhlesur and Bokul over control of the area.

A clash broke out in Anonto Bazar area between supporters of the two men yesterday evening. At one stage, Mokhlesur's men attacked Bokul with sharp weapons. They hacked him mercilessly, leaving him critically injured.

Bokul was taken to Pabna General Hospital where he died of his wounds around 7:00pm, the OC added.

Speaking to The Daily Star, Abdul Ahad Babu, office secretary of Pabna district AL, said Mokhlesur's men had been collecting extortion money from the drivers of battery-run three-wheelers in Anonto Bazar area for long.

Bokul protested collection of extortion money. Angered by this, Mokhlesur's supporters hacked Bokul to death, he added.

Ahad demanded exemplary punishment for the killers.

The OC said they were investigating the incident.

opportunities and playgrounds -- facilities that are far better than those in the crowded refugee camps in Cox's Bazar.

Apart from the risk of landslides, the government cited issues such as drug peddling, human trafficking, a rising trend of gender-based violence and conflicts between factions of the refugee communities in Cox's Bazar as major reasons for the relocation.

While these and other factors may have prompted the government to opt for the relocation, the fact remains that the relocation of the first batch has happened and the government will eventually transfer about 100,000 to Bhasan Char. The UN and international aid agencies are however yet to be involved in humanitarian assistance. This has given rise to questions about how the lives of Rohingya refugees in Bhasan Char will be funded and managed.

Saiful Islam Chowdhury Kalim, coordinator of the alliance of 22 local NGOs that have been engaged in humanitarian activities in Bhasan Char with their own funds, said the office of the Refugee Relief and Rehabilitation Commissioner (RRRC) that supervises the Rohingya camps in Cox's Bazar is doing the same in Bhasan Char.

"We have stock of food for six months. Now we are assessing the demand and challenges ahead," he told this correspondent. "Initially, the NGOs cooked food for the Rohingyas but now they are provided stoves, gas cylinders and food stuff to cook for themselves [in Bhasan Char]."

Saiful Islam said they too had negative idea about the Bhasan Char project initially, but everything became clear after visiting the site.

"I think international agencies' idea will change if they come here," he said, adding that there is no such infrastructure for refugees anywhere in the world. He said they are searching for international donors, but if they fail, they have contingency plans for mobilising funds locally.

Besides, Rohingyas can eventually be engaged in income-generating activities that can be helpful, he said. Prof Imtiaz Ahmed, director at the Centre for Genocide Studies of the International Relations Department at Dhaka University, said it is unfortunate that the UN has not congratulated Bangladesh for its efforts to improve the lives of Rohingya refugees through relocation.

He said a country has the right to shelter refugees in places that it finds suitable. There will always be some issues wherever they are, but the government has built a planned housing. The facilities at Bhasan Char may not provide all the privileges the

refugees want, but is much better than the present ones in Cox's Bazar.

"Bangladesh is not only a victim of Myanmar's genocidal acts, but also of global and regional geopolitics," Prof Imtiaz said.

The international community is not as vocal on Rohingya repatriation as it is on the Rohingya situation in Bangladesh, he added.

"The UN should focus on Myanmar and repatriation, not Bangladesh, on the Rohingya question," he said.

Asked on funds and management of Rohingyas in Bhasan Char, the professor said he expects UN and other aid agencies will get involved in Bhasan Char soon.

Prof Imtiaz said the UN is not against relocation, but there is a communication gap between the government and the UN. "It should be removed immediately for the better."

Meanwhile, a few NGO officials working in the Rohingya camps said the government had become more adamant about the relocation because international aid agencies made "excessive level of criticism" about the Bhasan Char project, even though the government had spent \$350 million from its own fund for the betterment of the refugees. Also, they said the Rohingyas, especially families with young girls unwilling to be engaged in any conflict, had volunteered to go to Bhasan Char.

They also pointed to international aid agencies' high-handedness in management of the Rohingya camps. A statement Foreign Minister AK Abdul Momen made to this correspondent recently is reflective of this. He said government officials working in refugee camps are provided "financial incentives" by international aid agencies, whose foreign workers also draw high amount of benefits due to high per diems in Cox's Bazar, which is why they are reluctant to move to Bhasan Char.

While these claims need to be verified, local NGOs have long been saying that international aid agencies' operations in the camps were too expensive -- an issue that needs to be addressed by employing Bangladeshi NGOs at operational levels.

Two UN officials reacted differently when asked whether the UN would be involved in Bhasan Char as the government wants it to be. One said they would not go unless a technical assessment by a UN team is done, while the other said the UN Refugee Agency is obliged to go to Bhasan Char if the government wants as looking after refugees -- wherever they are -- is its mandate.

"We are observing what happens in Bhasan Char... how the community fares," a UN official told this correspondent.

## EU clinches deal on tougher

CO2 emissions compared to 1990 -- is not now seen as sufficient to achieve this goal.

At an October summit, the EU leaders postponed the decision on the more ambitious climate target until their next meeting, given the hesitation by the eastern member states.

The new climate goals are backed by big EU powers, including France and Germany, as well as many major businesses keen to access European funding to kickstart a recovery through what Brussels has taken to calling a green new deal.

But environmental activists decried the latest move as not ambitious enough.

"It shows that political convenience takes precedence over climate science, and that most politicians are still afraid to take on big polluters," Greenpeace EU climate policy adviser

Sebastian Mang said.

The climate and the budget succeeded in pushing failing Brexit trade negotiations to the side.

EU chief Ursula von der Leyen told leaders that there were "low expectations" of a deal in a short discussion at the end of the summit.

London and Brussels have said they will decide by Sunday whether to press on with talks aimed at reaching an accord or throw in the towel, as negotiators from the two sides met again to seek a way forward.

Amid their packed schedule the EU leaders also agreed to draw up a list of Turkish targets for sanctions in response to Ankara's prospecting for gas in Greek and Cypriot waters.

The move fell short of broader punitive measures urged by Athens and Nicosia, as other EU nations remained hesitant about imposing wider sanctions or an arms embargo on NATO member Ankara.

human rights violations to the government for necessary actions.

"The National Human Rights Commission can play a role of check and balance in this regard. If the government doesn't take any step against an offence, the commission itself will take appropriate legal actions."

The government must take necessary action against any incident of human rights violation if it is conveyed, said Anisul.


Mentioning that the country would have an anti-discrimination law next year, he said the government was

working on formulating the law to prevent discrimination against people and it was now at the final stage.

The minister said the government has given stimulus of \$4.14 billion to different sectors to face the challenges of lives and livelihoods posed by the Covid-19 pandemic.

The government has arranged Covid-19 testing free of cost and will take steps to provide vaccines to the people for free on a priority basis, he added.

UNDP Resident Representative Sudipto Mukherjee, among others, also spoke at the programme, chaired by NHRC Chairman Nasima Begum.

Beaked whale experts working alongside Sea Shepherd's scientific department managed to take photographs and video recordings of the three whales, and also recorded their acoustic signals using an underwater microphone.

Researchers Gustavo Cárdenas Hinojosa, Jay Barlow and Elizabeth Henderson are "highly confident" that the animals are a new whale species, according to the press release. Genetic sampling will be used to confirm whether they are correct.
