Migrants need social, legal protection

Foreign Minister Momen on their vulnerabilities abroad during emergencies

Bangladesh wants social and legal protection of migrant workers in destination countries during emergency situations like the Covid-19 pandemic that has exposed their sheer vulnerability abroad.

"Migrant workers need to be included in the social and judicial protection system of the countries of destination to address the gap. We need to ensure migrants' rights from the early stage of ethical recruitment to wage, health and job protection," said Foreign Minister AK Abdul Momen.

The comment comes ahead of the Global Forum on Migration and Development (GFMD) to be hosted by the UAE on January 18-24. The UN-led forum is going to be held at a time when restrictions on migrants have been increasing due to the pandemic.

About 400,000 Bangladeshi migrants returned home, mostly empty-

DEATH IN JAIL CUSTODY Court asks PBI to probe alleged torture

The family of the apprentice lawyer, who died in a prison cell of a hospital after alleged torture by members of Detective Branch of police, was able to file a murder case yesterday with a Barisal court that ordered the Police Bureau of Investigation (PBI) to probe the incident.

Younus Munshi, father of victim Rejaul Islam Reja, 30, lodged the case with Barisal Metropolitan Magistrate's Court against Mohiuddin Ahmed, sub-inspector of Barisal Metropolitan Police, and two other members, said Mohsin Montu, a lawyer of the case.

Georgia votes in key US Senate runoffs

Biden promises 'new day'

After an unprecedented campaign that mobilised President Donald Trump and his successor Joe Biden, the people of Georgia yesterday started voting in two US Senate runoffs that could shape the first years of the new Democratic presidency.

For nearly 20 years Georgia has voted reliably Republican in the presidential election and Senate contests.

But Biden pulled out a shock victory in Georgia in November, one of several states that he flipped to win the White House, and the races for the Senate have come down to the wire in the biggest, most expensive congressional

BOTCHED BANK ROBBERY

Robbers hurl acid at guard, stab Ansar member

Robbers carried out acid attack on a security guard and stabbed another after failing to rob a bank in Bogura's Gabtali upazila early yesterday.

The incident happened at the Sabekpara branch of Rupali Bank, said police.

Analysing CCTV footage, Sabina Yasmin, assistant superintendent of police (Gabtali circle), said two robbers in masks and PPE sneaked into the bank from the roof.

One of the criminals disconnected a CCTV camera set up near a staircase outside the gate of the bank and went in. The other robber waited outside.

At that time, Ansar members Masud Rana, 28, and Habibur Rahman, 25, stopped the robber who was waiting outside. At one point, the robber started arguing with the guards. He then took out a bottle of acid from his pocket and threw acid on Habibur. He also stabbed Masud.

As the guards started shouting, the robbers fled using the roof, Sabina said.

The ASP said they were trying to arrest the robbers.

World Bank sees global output up 4pc in 2021

Flags downside risks

The global economy is expected to expand 4 percent in 2021 after shrinking 4.3% in 2020, the World Bank said yesterday, although it warned that rising Covid-19 infections and delays in vaccine distribution could limit the recovery to just 1.6 percent this year.

The World Bank's semi-annual forecast showed the collapse in activity due to the coronavirus pandemic was slightly less severe than previously forecast, but the recovery was also more subdued and still subject to considerable downside risk.

"The near-term outlook remains highly uncertain," the Bank said in a statement. "A downside scenario in which infections continue to rise and the rollout of a vaccine

Moscow metro hires first women train drivers

The Moscow metro said Sunday it had hired female drivers for the first time in its recent history, following recent changes in controversial Russian legislation prohibiting women from many professions.

The Russian capital's transport system, which oversees the sprawling metro system, said in a statement that "the first female electric train drivers in modern history started working for the Moscow metro."

Built in the Soviet era as a Communist showpiece, the metro's trains were historically operated by men because the work was listed on

New infected in triple digits 5 days in row

UNB, Dhaka

Coronavirus claimed 20 more lives and infected another 991 people in 24 hours across the country till Tuesday morning.

The total number of deaths rose to 7,670 since the first case was reported in the country on March 8. With the new infections, the country's caseload stood at 517,920, said the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS).

So far, 3,286,885 tests, including 14,629 new ones, have been carried out. The overall infection rate now stands at 15.76 percent and the death rate at 1.48.
