AL wins big amid big irregularities

Ruling party's mayoral candidate Rezaul bags 369,248 votes, BNP's Shahadat 52,489; turnout low in polls marred by violence; 1 killed in clashes

Awami League mayoral candidate Rezaul Karim Chowdhury has won by a landslide in the Chattogram City Corporation polls marked by violence, low voter turnout and the capture of scores of polling centres by ruling party men.

Rezaul bagged 369,248 votes while his nearest rival, BNP mayoral candidate Shahadat Hossain, got only of the 735 polling centres.

Voting at two centres was suspended following clashes between supporters of AL-backed councillor contenders and those of AL rebel candidates yesterday morning.

Voter turnout was 22.52 percent. Talking to The Daily Star, Shahadat alleged that police and those in the

local administration "acted as AL

"Police and the administration, not

the AL candidate, were my rivals." Alleging massive vote rigging and irregularities in yesterday's polls,

local BNP leaders said Shahadat got only one vote each at several polling centres which is a clear example of a

farcical election.

They said it is not believable that the BNP mayoral candidate would get one vote at any centre.

While announcing the results last night, Returning Officer Mohammad Hasanuzzaman said the polls were held in a peaceful manner.

Intra-party rivalry results in violence

From the very beginning of the campaigns for Chattogram City Corporation polls, the rebel candidates have been a big headache for the Awami League high-ups as a number of party men went against the central decision to run for councillor in the high-voltage local body election.

They resorted to violence, intimidation

Three The Daily Star correspondents visited six centres of the Chattogram City Corporation (CCC) polls, housed in two schools in the port city.

Two were stationed at two centres in Shahidnagar City Corporation Girls' High School from 8:00am to 3:15pm while the other journalist visited four centres at Bakalia Government High School between 8.00am and 3.30pm. The voting ended at 4:00pm.

While on duty, the three DS reporters saw how he polling was marred by sporadic incidents of violence, intimidation and 'capture" of centres by

ruling Awami League men. Polling at the Shahidnagar school's two centres in Lalkhan Bazar progressed amid sporadic incidents of violence and chaos.

Besides, widespread irregularities in the voting and gathering by ruling party men in a show of strength cast a sense of intimidation and panic in voters' minds.

A historic day

Says PM inaugurating the pilot vaccination, hopes inoculation will end Covid-19 scourge

Runu Veronica Costa, a senior nurse of Kurmitola General Hospital, yesterday received the first vaccine shot as Bangladesh joined the world in the Covid-19 vaccination campaign.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina termed the vaccination rollout a historic event.

"Many countries are yet to start vaccination. But we have started it despite being a country with a vast population and limited resources," she said while formally inaugurating the vaccination campaign at Kurmitola General Hospital through video conferencing from the Gono Bhaban.

At the inaugural event, five people were vaccinated in virtual presence of the PM. Later, 21 others were also vaccinated.

The countrywide mass vaccination drive is scheduled to start on February 7. The government has planned to vaccinate 60 lakh people in the first month and another 50 lakh the following month.

Online registration for mass vaccination also opened yesterday. People can register for vaccination through Shurokkha.gov.bd or using



Shurokkha mobile app.

"I hope the people of the country will get rid of coronavirus through this [vaccination campaign]," Hasina said in her speech.

She also thanked those who paid heed to the government's call for maintaining health guidelines.

The pilot vaccination will take place at five hospitals in Dhaka where around 500 health staffers of those hospitals will take the vaccine shots and then be observed for the next seven days, officials said.

Around 42,000 workers will be involved in the countrywide inoculation SEE PAGE 2 COL 1

Temperature likely to drop further

The weather office forecast that the mercury may fall further for a few days and the cold spell might last until the first week of February.

The forecast comes when fog has been disrupting ferry services and causing long tailbacks on the highways.

The weathermen, however, said this spell could be the last of this

winter. "The temperature may fall in a day or two and last till the first week of February," said Bazlur Rashid, meteorologist of Dhaka Met office.

Dhaka city's lowest temperature this winter was recorded at 11.8 degrees Celsius yesterday, while the country's lowest temperature was recorded at 9.7 degrees Celsius in
