Lalmonirhat-Burimari highway awaits repair

25 people killed in 15 accidents that occurred over the last twelve months

The highway connecting Lalmonirhat with Burimari land port, the second largest of its kind, has become risky for all.

Potholes have developed and carpeting has worn out on nearly 40 kilometres out of total 100 kilometres of the highway. But thousands of vehicles, especially cargo trucks, have to ply the highway every day, risking accidents and fatalities.

According to police control room, 25 people lost their lives in 15 accidents that took place on the road over the last twelve

On January 18, two members of police were killed when a truck carrying stones from Burimari land port ran them over in Khaner Bazar area under Hatibandha upazila.

Truck driver Nur Islam said he has 18 years of trucking experience on all highways in the country and out of all, the condition of Lalmonirhat-Burimari highway is the worst.

"I don't want to drive on this highway," he said, adding that drivers always have to worry about getting killed or killing others while driving on this highway. But there is no other option as this is the only road for transporting goods in and out of the land

Not just to drivers and passengers of different vehicles, the road poses risk to pedestrians as well.

Atiar Rahman, a resident of Khaner Bazar area in Hatibandha upazila, said pedestrians use the road with extreme risk as heavy trucks, loaded with stones and other goods, can get into severe accidents and cause fatalities on the road that is riddled with huge potholes.

Shamim Ahmed, who conducts his export and import business through Burimari port, said their cost of transport has been rising as many truck drivers refuse to transport goods to and from the port due to the poor condition of the road.

The highway has been in such a state for a long time, but the authorities concerned do not seem to care, he alleged.

However, Mohammad Mahbub Alam, executive engineer of Roads and Highways Department in Lalmonirhat, claimed that it has not been too long since the highway fell into disrepair. Rather, overloaded trucks frequenting the road have caused it to get damaged in a short period.

They have already been allocated Tk 40 crore for the repair of the dilapidated 40 kilometres of the highway and they were in the process of selecting a contractor firm for

Illegal power crushing now headache for sugar mills

Illegal crushing of sugarcane by power crushers in Natore is going on unabated that may hamper sugar production in achieving the target, much to the worry of the authorities of two state-run sugar mills in the district.

The production target of the North Bengal Sugar Mills (NBSM) and Natore Sugar Mills (NSM) may not be achieved due to possible shortage of sugarcane as the owners of power crushers have already crushed 2.04 lakh tonnes of sugarcane in the mill zone areas of the district.

Managing Director of North Bengal Sugar Mills (NBSM) Md Humayan Kabir said, 445 owners continue crushing by power crushers in the mill zone area. They have crushed about 1.5 lakh tonnes of sugarcane in the mill zone area this year. They will crush around one lakh tonnes more the rest of the days in this season.

The production target of the mill may not be achieved this year because of possible sugarcane shortage and illegal power crushing, he added.

"Normally we start production of the sugar mill from the first week of November but this time we started the production from the first week of December. As a result, the farmers started crushing

mill zone area," said the MD.

"Around 243 growers have already crushed about 54,000 tonnes of sugarcane with power crushers and they will crush more 54,000 tonnes in next 30 days at Natore Sugar Mills zone," said Md Rafiqul Islam, managing director (MD) of NSM.

The rate of sugar recovery is decreasing and it is around five percent now, while it was around more than seven percent five to six years ago, he said.

to possible shortage of sugarcane. Apart from this, the owners of power crushers are crushing 1.4 lakh tonnes of sugarcane illegally. If the sugar mills could crush the sugarcane, it might have brought profit to the public industry," Rafiqul added.

"I cultivate sugarcane on 10 bighas of land and produce around 102 tonnes of sugarcane. But sugar mill authorities buy only 1.2 tonnes from a grower like me "We have fixed target to crush in a week. Then how will I sell sugarcane by power crushers in the 1.32 lakh tonnes of sugarcane my sugarcane to the mills?" said area in Gopalpur municipality.

but it may not be achieved due Masud Rana, a grower of Raypur area in Lalpur upazila.

"When a grower sells the sugarcane to mills, he gets Tk 140 per maund and the mill authority takes times for payment. But when the same grower sells the sugarcane to the crusher owner, he can sell it at Tk 220 per maund and get instant cash," Masud added.

a hassle-free business when you will handle it with the crusher owner, said another sugarcane grower Majdar Sarker of Keshabpur

They resorted to violence, intimidation

continued till 1:30pm. At least 10 people were injured in the incident. Around noon, AL supporters attacked Moni's house and election office, which was near the voting centres, she told The Daily Star. This newspaper, however, could not verify this claim.

Moni, who has been elected a councillor

protest from 1:45pm to 3:00pm, flanked by her to the DS reporter stationed there. supporters and in the presence of law enforcers.

She announced a polls boycott around 2:00pm. Talking to The Daily Star, at least 10 voters at the two centres, housed in the school, alleged that their votes were cast by AL men.

At the female voting centre, only 99 out of 2,176 votes were cast till 3:00pm.

BAKALIA GOVERNMENT HIGH SCHOOL The polling atmosphere at Bakalia Government

High School was almost peaceful since the four centres there had been "captured" by ruling party hrice, sat in front of the polling centres in $\,$ men even before the voting kicked off, according $\,$ voters.

The centres had a total of 10,536 voters.

The ruling party men drove out all the polling agents of the BNP-nominated mayoral candidate Dr Shahadat Hossain as well as of a BNP-supported ward councillor candidate AKM Ariful Islam Duke.

As the polling formally started at 8:00am, over one hundred AL men adorned with badges of the AL-supported councillor candidate Shahidul Alam stood in a queue obstructing entrance of other voters.

AL men were seen gathering in and around the centres, guiding voters to the polling booths and even entering the secret voting rooms along with the voters in violation of the electoral rules.

In many cases, the ruling party men themselves pressed the EVM button and cast votes for the candidates of their choice, depriving the voters of exercising the right, the voters told The Daily

A housewife, who came along with her baby girl, said, "When I entered the secret polling room, a group of youths came from nowhere and forced me into pressing a button."

Until 3.30pm, only 627 votes out of the total 5,147 were cast at the two centres for male voters. Only 215 votes were cast at the two centres for female voters against a total number of 5,389

Surprisingly, none of the concerned people knows about the matter! Locals alleged that although the tree logs were sold at a

normal price of Tk 10,000, but its market value would be around Tk 1 lakh. According to a notification of Ministry of Education,

trees of any government or non-governmental organization have to be cut down through a public auction with prior permission from administration. Legal action will be taken against those involved in

felling trees without administration's permission.

During a visit to the spot, this correspondent saw some tree trunks inside the boundary wall of the institution while several pieces of logs are piled up outside the school

Headmaster of Lathitila Government Primary School Misbah Uddin said he was not aware of the matter as was not present at the institution for a few days.
