MP Papul jailed in Kuwait

Sentenced to four years in a bribery case

STAR REPORT

A Kuwaiti court yesterday sentenced Bangladeshi lawmaker Kazi Shahidul Islam Papul and four others to four years in jail in a bribery case.

Issuing the judgment, the court, headed by Counselor Abdullah Al-Othman, also fined them 1.9 million Kuwaiti dinars.

The others sentenced include Kuwait's interior ministry's Assistant Under-Secretary Maj Gen Mazen Al-Jarrah, and Nawaf Al-Mutairi, Hassan Al-Khader and one Bangladeshi named Mohammad Rashidul Islam, report Kuwaiti newspaper Alqabas and other sources.

The criminal court also ordered the deportation of Rashidul Islam after jail terms.

Kuwaiti MP Saadoun Hammad and former MP Salah Khorshid, and three Bangladeshis -- Mahbub, Sheikh Masum and Anowar Molla -- who were also accused in the case for bribery, were acquitted.

Frontliners lead from the front

Several ministers also take first jabs as pilot vaccination ends

The two-day piloting of inoculation against Covid-19 ended at five public hospitals in the capital yesterday.

Of the 541 people who got the vaccine shots yesterday, 296 were doctors, according to the Directorate General of Health Services.

On Wednesday, 26 people took their first shot of the two-dose Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccine after Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina launched the programme from the Gono Bhaban.

Political leaders and eminent personalities also joined frontline health workers yesterday to encourage people to take part in the countrywide mass inoculation campaign, scheduled to start on February 7.

Since Wednesday, people have been able to register for vaccination on shurokkha.gov.bd or by using the mobile app titled Shurokkha.

The government plans to vaccinate 60 lakh people in the first month of the campaign and another 50 lakh in the following month.

The 567 people who received their first doses will be observed for seven days.

TI CORRUPTION PERCEPTION INDEX

Ranking same, but 'graft rose'

Bangladesh has been ranked 146th having scored only 26 out of 100 in the Transparency International Corruption Perceptions Index 2020. It failed to improve both in terms of ranking and score from the previous year.

The country has been placed at the 12th spot from the bottom, two notches worse from the previous index.

The index has been a flagship research of TI, a Berlin-based global graft watchdog, since 1995. This year, the index has been prepared on 180 countries. There have been instances where more than one country secured the same spot as they scored the same.

Disclosing the findings at a virtual press conference yesterday, Transparency International Bangladesh

CHATTOGRAM MAYORAL RACE

Shahadat got no vote in 7 centres

Got single-digit vote at 80 centres, polls officials say; all but AL lose deposit

RASHIDUL HASAN and DWAIPAYAN BARUA from Ctg

Defeated BNP mayoral candidate Shahadat Hossain didn't get any vote in at least seven polling centres and bagged single-digit votes at 80 centres in the Chattogram City Corporation Polls, said a top official at the Returning Office in the port city.

BNP leaders say this clearly shows that Wednesday's election was nothing but a farce.

They also alleged that the polls were manipulated through widespread irregularities and the capture of polling centres by the supporters of mayor-elect Rezaul Karim Chowdhury, who contested the election on the ruling Awami League ticket.

The BNP leaders also raised questions about the long delay in announcing results as polling was held through electronic voting machines.
