

# Indian national arrested for misappropriating Tk 1.4cr from bank account

Criminal Investigation Department yesterday arrested Anju Kapoor, who allegedly drove out her two stepdaughters from her Gulshan residence in October, on charges of “misappropriating” Tk 1.40 crore from her husband’s bank account.

Sheikh Omar Faruque, additional deputy inspector general (Dhaka Metro) of CID said they arrested the woman from the Gulshan residence around 8am. The arrestee withdrew money from the account of her husband Mostafa Jaglul Wahid on October 11 last year -- a day after Jaglul died, said Khalidul Howlader, a special superintendent of CID.

Anju, an Indian national, was once employed as house help in Jaglul’s house. The man later married her.

She had a mandate to run the account but he concealed the news of her husband’s death in order to withdraw the money. After Jaglul’s death, his inherent was supposed to get the money, he said.

Mushfika Mostafa, a daughter of Jaglul earlier filed a case with Gulshan Police Station in December last year, bringing the allegations of misappropriating the money.

“We have found proof of the allegation brought against Anju during primary investigation,” Khalidul added.

Earlier, Jaglul’s two daughters -- Mushfika and Mobashshera -- took position in front of their house, alleging that their Anju was not allowing them enter their paternal home in Gulshan, following their father’s death.

Learning the incident through media, a high court bench of Justice Md Nazrul Islam Talukder and Justice Ahmed Sohail held a virtual hearing at night and ordered the OC of Gulshan Police Station to ensure that the girls were allowed to enter the house with police protection.

Deputy Attorney General AKM Amin Uddin Manik yesterday informed the High Court bench about the arrest of the Anju.

fully subsidised toilets. Besides household water connections, it will construct around 3,000 community piped water schemes.

“Safe water, sanitation, and hygiene practices are key for ensuring better health and building human capital,” said Mercy Tembon, World Bank Country Director for Bangladesh and Bhutan.

He said the project will help prevent diseases and protect citizens from Covid-19 and other infectious diseases by increasing access to quality water and sanitation services at home and public spaces as well, as by promoting hand-washing behaviour.

The project will install about 312 public toilets and 2,514 hand-washing stations at crowded public places, such as markets and bus stations. About 1,280 community clinics will have new or renovated facilities, both for patients and medical purposes.

The project, in a quick and timely manner, will also help address urgent water and sanitation needs arising from Covid-19.

“Over the last decades, Bangladesh has made commendable progress with almost universal access to basic water supply and elimination of open defecation,” said Fatima Yasmin, Secretary, Economic Relations Division, Government of Bangladesh.

She said further investments will ensure that all citizens -- in cities and villages -- have access to safe and improved water and sanitation facilities. This will help Bangladesh achieve Sustainable Development Goals.

## Bangabandhu’s crop art aims for Guinness World Records

Bangladesh aims to register its name on the Guinness World Records with the largest crop art mosaic of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

National AgriCare Bangladesh, a private company involved in agricultural development and dissemination of renewable energy in rural areas, is crafting the crop art on a 1,20,000-square-metre area.

Currently, Shanghai Lezhidao Tourism Development Company of China holds the record, after it made a crop field mosaic spanning 79,505.19 square metres in 2019, according to Guinness World Records’ website.

“To highlight Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman’s great love for farmers to the billions of people around the world, we’ve decided to build the crop art mosaic,” said Krishibid KSM Mustafizur Rahman.

On a 105-bigha land of Bhobanipur union of Bogura’s Sherpur, Bangabandhu’s portrait has been crafted.

“We’ve used golden and deep purple rice plants to portray Bangabandhu’s image,” he added.

“Bangabandhu fought throughout his life for farmers’ wellbeing,” he said.

“After the nine-monthlong Liberation War, when independent Bangladesh was struggling to rise, Bangabandhu knew that only farmers would be able to save the country. He worked hard for the betterment of farmers.”

Mustafizur said due to the pandemic, people around the world are again starting to realise the importance of farmers. “That’s why we crafted the gigantic crop art mosaic to showcase Bangabandhu’s love for farmers and agriculture.”

Talking to the Daily Star last week, Mustafizur Rahman said by February 21, the crop art mosaic will get a complete look.

“We’re hopeful of putting our name on the Guinness World Records before the 101st birth anniversary of Bangabandhu on March 17,” he said.

There are 250 members in the forum, none of whom are involved in extortion. Tanu said that some members of other forums get involved in extortion, and the entire community has to bear the brunt of it.

Of the members, a good number of them work as cooks in different restaurants in and outside the city, while some others work for non-government organisations, she informed.

The members said on different occasions, they contacted local administration to get support for building a “hijra palli”. With necessary financial support via soft loans, they could become self-reliant by rearing dairy and poultry, and running tailor shops.

Such pallis have been established in Dinajpur and Sirajganj, but they are deprived of many facilities, although pledges were made on various occasions, they lamented.

To lead a decent life, everyone needs necessary financial ability and a regular income source, they said.

The centre’s teacher Mufti Bhuiyan said he learnt about such a centre for hijras in Dhaka through YouTube and inspired the hijras in Mymensingh to start a centre.

“I am enjoying providing my services for free, as it is a scope to work with a neglected group,” he said, “They are very meritorious and can take in the lessons quickly.”

Contacted, Md Saiful Islam, Sadar upazila nirbahi officer, said they have a plan to allot government land for hijras in Mymensingh.

buried him in the farmhouse. Recently, CMP has issued a circular asking the landlords not to rent out any house to Rohingyas.

According to the circular, Rohingyas people are trying to get involved in criminal activities through renting houses. In many cases, they have fled the refugee camps and got involved in terror activities. Already, members of several Rohingya criminal gangs have been arrested and legal actions have been taken against them.

In addition, legal action will be taken against those who rent out their residences to Rohingyas. Renting out houses to Rohingyas is illegal according to the country’s existing law. A landlord must submit the tenants’ citizenship form to the

nearest police station and should inform police if any Rohingya try to rent a house in the area, added the circular.

Law enforcers had issued a similar circular in 2007 after the Rohingya influx. They said many of the refugees have settled outside the camps and are now helping others.

In recent times, Rohingyas are being held with Bangladeshi NID cards and passports following drives by law enforcers. Those cases are being investigated by police and Criminals Investigation Department (CID).

“We’re on high alert in this regard,” said ADC Palash Kanti Nath of CMP (south zone). “However, we need cooperation from landlords and locals as well. It’s not possible to find out about the Rohingyas if they conceal the information from us,” he added.

He said in the existing system, the quality of the waste transport vans used by the collectors are not good, many children are involved in the process and they are also charging people more. In many places, they are charging from Tk 100 to even Tk 1,000, he said.

About the waste collectors’ demand, he said, “Until we finalise the tender process, we are planning to renew their contract every year based on performance and if they do not maintain standards, their license will be cancelled.”

About the tender, he said, “We will give priority to the existing garbage collecting organisations. But we are reducing the number of such organisations to ensure quality.”

Saidur said they have fixed Tk 100 for the old wards and Tk 50 for new wards per household for collecting garbage.

“We are trying to break the syndication, who are charging people more,” he said.

Mentionable, the recent move by Dhaka South City Corporation to “reform” the city’s waste collection has not fared well with citizens, who say they are being charged excessively by the newly-appointed contractors, and the service is substandard.

DSCC started to appoint one primary collection service provider (PCSP) in each ward for collecting waste from all sorts of establishments under its jurisdiction from July last year.

According to the contract agreement, service providers will not charge more than Tk 100 per month from each household unit and other establishments for their service.

However, residents of several areas said the service providers were demanding much higher from households.
