'No one will remain homeless, landless'

Tk 1,000cr released to construct 50,000 more homes, says PM

Bss, Dhaka Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said she has released Tk 1,000 crore to construct



houses for homeless and landless people. "Marking the Mujib Borsho, today [yesterday], I released Tk 1,000 crore for constructing 50,000 more houses for the homeless and landless," she said.

The prime minister was speaking at the oath-taking ceremony of the newly-elected mayor of Chattogram City Corporation Rezaul Karim Chowdhury and 55 ward councillors, including 14 councillors in reserved seats at Osmani Memorial Auditorium.

She attended the programme virtually from her official residence Gono Bhaban in the capital.

"We are constructing one lakh more homes for them," she said.

The premier asked the public representatives to identify the homeless and landless people in their localities as SEE PAGE 4 COL 5

Usage of menstrual products high but hygiene low: survey

88pc girls report sexual harassment during commute

Despite a higher percentage of adolescent girls using some form of menstrual products, the hygiene of menstrual practices remains very low among teenagers aged 15-19, revealed the Bangladesh Adolescent Health and Wellbeing Survey (BAHWS) 2019-20. In the survey, 88 percent respondents mentioned they were harassed during commutes.

Ninteen percent of the responses listed their schools as a place where they were sexually harassed.

The survey was conducted in five phases between 25 July 2019 and 10 January 2020 with a nationally representative sample of 72,800 households. A total of 4,926 girls who are or have been married participated in the survey, alongside 7,800 unmarried girls and 5,523 unmarried boys

The National Institute of Population Research and Training (NIPORT) with technical assistance from Research for Decision Makers (RDM) project of icddr,b and Data for Impact (D4I) of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill conducted the research, which is the first of its kind in Bangladesh.

They found that only one in every 11 married adolescents and one in eight unmarried adolescents have hygienic menstrual practice.

On the other hand, 98 percent of both married and unmarried adolescents reported using either disposable products or reusable materials cleaned with water and soap or detergent during menstruation.

My experience of taking the Covid-19 vaccine

After waiting for 12 months for that miracle, it finally happened. On December 8, 2020, a grandmother in the UK was given the first Covid-19 vaccine shot. After wreaking havoc in the world not experienced since the second World War, there was a ray of hope that life would finally go back to normal.

In Bangladesh, the first case of Covid-19 was identified on March 8, 2020. As rates of infection and deaths increased, the government ordered a complete lockdown including closure of schools, businesses, offices etc. Bangladesh was miraculously spared the worst of the outbreak. By February 2021, we had seven lakh infections and 8,500 deaths.

News of the availability of the AstaZeneca vaccine was greeted with joy mixed with apprehension. It was declared that mass inoculation will start from

February 7. Meanwhile, the vaccine was transported to all 64 districts and over 6,000 health workers were trained to administer it.

I registered on February 2 to get the vaccine, and immediately received an OTP number on my mobile phone. On February 9, I was informed that my shot will be given at the Kurmitola General Hospital, and was instructed to go there with my National ID and the "Tika Card" which was also sent to me on my phone.

As instructed, I reached the hospital at 9:06am, and to my dismay found a huge crowd of people waiting in queues outside the main building. However, the line was moving fast and I reached the table in 10 minutes, where a very polite young woman was checking papers. It took about five more minutes to find my serial number, which she wrote down on the Tika Card

Fraudster who duped jobseekers wearing 'uniform' arrested

The Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) has arrested a fraud gang's ringleader, who has embezzled crores of taka from around a

hundred jobseekers, introducing himself as an army official. A Rab-4 team arrested Sheikh Selim alias Shuvo (35) from the capital's Mirpur area on Wednesday, said Sajedul Islam, senior assistant director of Rab-4.


"He used to introduce himself as an employee of a government agency. By doing so, he collected jobseekers, took interview and gave them fake appointment letters of the agency. From every jobseeker, this gang used to take Tk 5-10 lakh," he said.

The official said this gang maintains an organisational structure by which they employed people in field level. They targeted unemployed, innocent people from villages. They have duped more than a hundred jobseekers, he added.

Apart from the arrestee, 10-12 people are involved with the gang, according to Rab.

Rab seized eight fake appointment letters, three bank cheques, three ATM cards, two laptops and a car from Selim's possession.

They were speaking at a programme at Dhaka Reporters' Unity.

Rezwanul Haque Raza, vice president of Jatiya Press Club and chief news editor of Masranga Television, said, "The investigation into the murders had not been completed for nine long years. But we don't want to be disappointed as trial of many murders have taken place even after a long time."

Runi's younger brother Nowsher Alam Roman and the couple's only son Mahir Sarowar Megh (14) were present at the programme.

Sagar, news editor at private TV channel Maasranga, and Runi, a senior reporter at ATN Bangla, were killed in the early hours of February 11, 2012, at their rented flat in the capital's West Rajabazar.

Megh, only five at the time, was in the apartment when his parents were murdered.

A senior shipbreaking worker died early yesterday -- five days after sustaining burn injury in a fire incident at the engine room of a ship at Sitakunda upazila of Chattogram.

The incident occurred at N R shipbreaking on February 6. Deceased Md Jashim (40), from Kumira area of Sitakunda upazila used to work at the yard.

The name of the ship could not be known. It is a container ship weighing 12,000 tonnes.

Hamidur Rahman, director of N R Shipbreaking told The Daily Star that the worker died while he was cutting a pipe.

"We sent him to Dhaka for better treatment and tried our best to save the worker's life," he added.

Mohammed Ali, general secretary of Bangladesh Metal Workers Federation told The Daily Star that Jashim was a senior cutter at the yard.

He was working at the engine room of the ship to cut a pipe, but it had clogged gas inside. A fire broke out as the gas came into contact with the spark of the cutting machine. Jashim was severely injured.

Md Manik, younger brother of the victim told The Daily Star that his brother was taken to Chattogram Medical College Hospital on February 6.

Quoting doctors, he said his elder brother had 45 percent burns on his body, prompting doctors to send him to Sheikh Hasina National Institute of Burn and Plastic Surgery where he died early yesterday.

Due to the pandemic, Amar Ekushey Book Fair, one of the most soughtafter events got halt this year. This book fair, which is largest of its kind in this region, was paused after much deliberation by the decision of the Ministry of Cultural Affairs. Though there were initial talks about officially hosting the book fair online, that plan was scrapped after the decision was made in a meeting between Bangla Academy, the Academic and Creative Publishers' Association of Bangladesh, and the Bangladesh Publishers and Booksellers' Association. Although the official book fair is not happening, local e-commerce ventures have come forward, to appease the booklovers in the month of February.

Rokomari, the largest specialised e-commerce for books, has started their online book fair. According to Mahmudul Hasan Sohag, founder of the venture, the uncertainty of Ekushey Boi Mela due to pandemic compelled Rokomari to arrange the fair online. "Publishing industry is under threat due to pandemic. As book fair is very close to our heart and part of our heritage, we wanted to support our book publishers with this virtual fair." During the online book fair, Rokomari is offering a minimum 25% discount on all books, 10% cashback on bKash payments, and free shipping is available on bKash payment for the orders of Tk. 700/-.

Alibaba backed e-commerce Daraz is also arranging, for the first time on their platform, a virtual book fair. The fair started from February 1 and is going to continue till February

20. According to Daraz, 3000+ book collections are currently available in their platform. "We are also providing free delivery till February 14 so that our customers can happily skip the hassles of going to real-time book fairs in the middle of the COVID-19 pandemic", said Category lead of Daraz Books & Stationeries Minhaz Uddin. Daraz is also enticing customers by providing up to 70% off on selective books of different genre, plus 10% cashback or discount on selective cards and mobile financial services.

Up and coming e-commerce, Dhamaka Shopping has also hosted a book fair on its platform. According to Sirajul Islam Rana, Chief Operating Officer of Dhamaka Shopping, Dhamaka has several thousand books on its platform and hopes to deliver customers smoothly within the stipulated time. "We have added the most recent and best seller books on our platform. To encourage our customers, even more, we are offering up to 40% discount on purchase", he said. On their platform, Dhamaka will continue to keep on selling books from now on.

Aadi.com.bd, the e-commerce specialising in cross-border product delivery, is also offering local books for anyone intending to purchase books abroad. Fatima Begum, Chief Executive Officer of Aadi informed that this is the first time any local venture has formally initiated crossborder bookselling. "Currently, Aadi offers over 7,000 books both for local and global customers. We will deliver books up to 2 KGs in any part of the world for just USD 9.99", she said.
