

Fish markets in Barishal sit idle

Anglers, traders worried about low fish supply; officials say it's normal for this season

Anglers and fisheries officials have reported a decrease in the number of fish caught from Barishal's rivers, though for different reasons according to each party. As a result, supply of local fish to major fish markets has come down noticeably.

On one hand, local anglers said the situation arose as fishing in the river has been banned for the last 15 days, while fisheries officials said fish supply has decreased naturally, as is normal for this season.

In addition, officials said anglers are catching less fish than before, as they are using illegal nets, which depletes fish supply and brings fewer catches.

Following their claims, this correspondent, while visiting Port Road Wholesale Fish Market -- one of the biggest wholesale fish markets of the south region -- and other markets and saw very little activity.

Traders and labourers were mostly sitting idle, as there is not much work. Some shops were found closed while some store fronts were being used to repair fishing pots.

Soleiman Fakir, a worker at the market, told this correspondent that since a lot less fish is coming in every day, their income has decreased by at least six to eight times.

Nirab Hossain Tutul, president of Barishal Port Road Motsho Arotard Samity,

said compared to an inflow of 800-2,000 maunds of fish per day, the number has now come down to 100-150 maunds. Hilsa rarely comes, with less than 50 maunds arriving on Thursday.

"Some anglers are afraid of going out to the rivers after thousands of nets were burned in a massive operation to protect jatka, which ran from January 10-16 and January 25 to Feb 1. This is another reason why netting has decreased," Nirab said.

According to the Fisheries Department, the special operation ran on six districts of Barishal division. In total, 761 operation were conducted by 294 mobile courts.

Bimal Das, district fisheries officer (hilsa), said as a result of the operation, anglers are not able to use illegal nets, which may give off the impression that less fish is being caught, but he assured that this is normal.

"It is normal for fish supply to be low at this point of the year. It will increase from April. There is nothing to worry about," said Anisur Rahman Talukder, deputy director of Divisional Fisheries Office of Barishal.

"The operations seized 1,243 'Behundi nets', 68.09 lakh metres of current nets, 22,707 metric tonnes of jatka, and one tonne of other fishes. In the meantime, 131 cases were filed and 92 anglers were jailed for illegal netting," he added.

added. General Aziz emphasised on sending back Rashed Chowdhury, a death row convict in Bangabandhu murder case, to Bangladesh.

On February 4, a guard of honour, on behalf of US Army chief General McConville, was presented to the chief of Bangladesh Army.

Later, General Aziz paid a courtesy call on his US counterpart and discussed ways to strengthen relations between armies of the two countries as well as mutual cooperation.

Last week, the army chief exchanged views with the military adviser and under-secretary-generals to the UN peacekeeping mission. During the discussion, the UN senior officials lauded the professional skills of the peacekeepers from Bangladesh.

The army chief made a promise to the senior UN officials over scaling up the strong role of Bangladesh Army in preserving world peace.

His US trip would play an important role in increasing the number of Bangladeshi members in UN peacekeeping missions, said the press release.

is needed to recover the canals. He also spoke about the importance of decentralisation to lessen the pressure on Dhaka.

Rajuk DAP project director Ashrafur Islam claimed that the bigger water retention areas like Hatirjheel, Gulshan and Baridhara lakes have been created by Rajuk.

"We found out that local ponds were being used for retaining water in those areas... but the city became densely populated over the years and there is very little space left for creating more water retention ponds," he said. "Now, local reservoirs have to be revived so that they can retain water properly," he added.

Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives Minister Md Tazul Islam said plans should be undertaken taking population density of an area into account.

He also said the mayors are doing their best to recover the canals, but they are facing many challenges. "Those can be overcome through working collectively and community engagement."

UDJF president Motin Abdullah presided over the programme. Its general secretary Sohel Mamun and Institute of Water and Environment chairman M Inamul Haque were also present at the event.

Youth arrested for stabbing Hefajat leader

Police have arrested a youth on the charge of stabbing Hefajat-e-Islam's central leader Jasim Uddin in Dhaka's Lalbagh area on Tuesday.

Masum Hasan Imran (30) was held in the capital's Dakshinkhan on Friday, KM Ashraf Uddin, officer-in-charge of Lalbagh Police Station, told The Daily Star. "He was seen in CCTV footage collected from nearby area after the attack. Hasan confessed to attacking Jasim Uddin. Police are interrogating him to know the motive," the OC said.

Maulana Jasim Uddin, assistant secretary general of Hefajat, was stabbed in the back while he was heading towards his Lalmatia home on a rickshaw from Jamia Qurania Arabia Madrasa in Lalbagh around 5pm on Tuesday.

Jasim, a senior teacher of the madrasa, is son-in-law of Mufti Fazlul Haque Amini.

SC judges visit Bangabandhu jail memorial museum

Mujib Borsho Udjapon Committee of the Supreme Court, led by Chief Justice Syed Mahmud Husain, visited the old Central Jail at Nazimuddin Road to see the Bangabandhu Jail Memorial Museum yesterday.

Committee members, all sitting judges of the Appellate and High Court divisions of the SC, left a floral wreath at the place where Bangabandhu's sculpture has been erected.

The "Kamini" tree, planted by Bangabandhu himself, is still there to blossom flowers and spread its fragrance.

The museum on Bangabandhu was established encompassing the Dewani Cell, where Sheikh Mujibur Rahman was kept detained during the Pakistani regime.

"Many of us know what Bangabandhu sacrificed for the Bengali nation. Anyone visiting the museum would find it difficult to control their emotions. The measures taken by the Pakistanis to subdue Bangabandhu's spirit is harrowing to witness," Justice Obaidul Hassan, an Appellate Division judge and committee member, told The Daily Star.

"We also visited the place where the four national leaders were killed and placed floral wreaths at the mausoleum made in their memory. It was a shame for the nation that we failed to bring the culprits to book for quite a long period. However, after Sheikh Hasina, Bangabandhu's daughter, assumed power, and the trial of the murderers finally started. Eventually the perpetrators were punished," he said.

"Let's pray for the departed souls of Bangabandhu and his family members who were killed on August 15, 1975 and the national leaders who were killed on November 3, 1975," the judge said.
