action plan expired, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, while speaking on the occasion of the National Road Safety Day in October last year, gave directions to prepare a new plan.

The Road Transport and Highway Division on October 27 last year directed the BRTA to prepare a draft and take opinions and updates from 26 ministries and agencies concerned. The BRTA recently sent the final draft to the division in this regard.

Citing police reports, the draft mentioned that in the last five years, road accidents claimed the lives of an average of 2,825 people every year.

"It is feared that with the continued expansion of the road network and the growth of traffic, this trend is likely to continue in the future unless effective remedial measures are taken with the coordination of all concerned agencies through national action plans," read the draft.

It also mentioned that "a suitable vision for road safety in Bangladesh, which is not unrealistic, is to achieve 50 percent reduction in road accident fatalities and injuries within the next 10 years [2030] and also the reduction of the number of road accidents to nearly 30 percent."

"For the next four years, a goal could be set up towards achieving 20-25 percent reduction in the annual number of road accident fatalities and injuries by the end of the year 2024," it added.

ACCIDENTS, DEATHS CONTINUE

As the government's steps for curbing road crashes continue to remain confined to holding meetings and forming committees and sub-committees, road crashes are continuing to take lives, experts said.

The committees make similar recommendations time and again, but those are hardly implemented, helping indiscipline -- the major reason behind road crashes -- to rule country's road transport sector, they said.

According to police reports, around 3,918 people were killed in 4,198 road crashes last year, even when operation of public transport remained suspended for more than two months to contain Covid-19 situation.

Bangladesh Jatri Kalyan Samity, who prepared the report after compiling media reports, however, said the number of accident and deaths were 4,891 and 6,686 respectively last year.

A total of 4,138 people died in 4,147 road accidents in 2019, said a police report.

In 2019, at least 7,855 people were

killed in 5,516 road crashes across the country, according to Jatri Kalyan Samity.

However, the World Health Organisation (WHO) estimated the number of casualties to be much higher than reported by police and other organisations.

In its latest report published in December 2018, the WHO said at least 24,954 people were killed in road crashes in the country in 2016, which is almost 10 times the official number given by police.

Total 2,463 people were killed in 2,566 road accidents that year, police said.

Citing their research, Prof Md Haduzzaman, director of Accident Research Institute at Buet, said the number of road crashes increased by 90 percent and casualties by 60 percent in last five years.

He added that the road infrastructure did not increase much compare to the huge rise of vehicle numbers in last 10 years.

"As it is very difficult to increase roads, the authority should take a strong policy decision to control vehicle numbers, especially private cars and small vehicles," he told The Daily Star yesterday.

"But, unfortunately several decisions taken recently, including slashing motorcycle registration fees, go against the notion of controlling the number of vehicles," he said, adding, "So, without changing the policy decisions, it would not be possible to achieve the target to be set in the new action plan, because the number of accidents will rise with the rise of vehicle numbers," he added.

Bar Association refused to represent them.

Senior lawyer Mollah Habibul Rasul Mamun appeared at the hearing on behalf of the plaintiff.

Serum Institute of India Pvt Ltd, the world's largest vaccine maker, and Beximco Pharmaceuticals Ltd, the government has bought three crore doses of Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccine.

Serum will send 50 lakh doses each month between January and June.

The first consignment reached the country on January 25 while another 20 lakh doses from the Indian government reached on January 20.

The health minister yesterday said that another 25-30 lakh doses of the purchased vaccine would reach the country on February 22.

The government brought down the age to 40 for registration to get jabs. The government is providing the vaccine for free.

The second one has to be taken within 8 to 12 weeks after the first dose.

COVID-19 DEATH RISE AGAIN

The fresh cases of Covid-19 and deaths caused by the deadly virus marked a rise in Bangladesh as the country's health authorities recorded 16 more deaths and 443 new cases in the last 24 hours till yesterday morning, reports UNB.

The Covid-19 fatalities in the country rose to 8,314 and the caseload to 541,877, according to the latest figures provided by the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS).

In a press release, the DGHS said the daily coronavirus infection rate in Bangladesh fell to 2.67 percent from Tuesday's 2.68 percent, while the overall infection rate stood at 13.92 percent.

However, the mortality rate remained almost steady at 1.53 percent for the past few days, including Tuesday, said the press release, adding that 489,254 patients -- 90.29 percent -- have recovered from the virus infection so far.

So far, 3,893,654 samples have been tested, including 16,612 in the past 24 hours till 8:30am yesterday.

Bangladesh reported its first coronavirus cases on March 8 and the first death on March 18 last year.

According to Zulfikar, Luna was supposed to start her treatment yesterday but she died because of a massive heart attack.

The body of the reputed IT and software entrepreneur Luna would be flown back to Dhaka either today or tomorrow, after completion of some procedures, he said.

Luna died around 10:30am in Singapore time and she left behind a daughter and husband, he said.

Besides being a brilliant entrepreneur, Luna was a director of the Bangladesh Association of Software and Information Services (BASIS).

For her sound knowledge of finance and economics, she was also appointed as the first female chairperson of the state-owned Janata Bank Limited in 2018.

Before joining the bank, she had served the bank as a member of the board since 2016.

She was also a board member of state-owned Agrani Bank between 2009 and 2012.

Luna was the founder president of Bangladesh Women in Technology (BWIT).

She was also a board member of SME Foundation, Member of Council Global Thought Leaders on Inclusive Growth, Global Advisory Council & Strategic Partner of Thinkthrough Consulting (TTC) India.

She was a Trustee of Independent University Bangladesh (IUB) and Underprivileged Children's Educational Programs (UCEP) Bangladesh.

Her software company Dohatec was involved in the development of a voter enrolment solution in 2007-2008.

The firm developed several e-governance projects and the electronic Government Procurement (e-GP) system that ensures transparency of government procurement.

Because of her extraordinary contribution to particular fields, she received multiple awards. Among those, she received The Daily Star's "Outstanding Woman in Business" award in 2017.

She achieved her master's degree in International Relations from Dhaka University and started working as a lecturer at the Institute of Modern Language at Dhaka University.

State Minister for Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Zunaid Ahmed Palak expressed condolences to the demise of Luna.

"She worked for the development of the ICT sector until her last breath. She had been a dedicated worker to build a Digital Bangladesh."

"Luna Shamsuddoha's contribution to the government's automation projects, including government's electronic procurement project, is indisputable," said Palak in a statement.

Meanwhile, talking to The Daily Star, BASIS President Syed Almas Kabir yesterday said, "The early demise of Luna is a big shock not only for the sector but also for the country. Her death is unexpected and it is a great loss for the country."

The IT and software sectors of the country lost a brilliant entrepreneur with the death of Luna, he added.

"It was her passion to brand Bangladesh positively abroad," Kabir said.

Her company also exported software abroad, especially in the neighbouring countries, as both private and government organisations, he added.

She earned those countries' trust and faith with the quality of her company's products, he further said.

Transport workers

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The injured students alleged that transport workers along with others attacked them with sticks, rods, and sharp weapons.

Of the wounded, Alim Salehi, Emon and Noor have head injuries and they had their CT scans done, said students.

Police arrested Rafiq after injured Sajol filed a case against him with Bandar Police Station.

Mahamudul Hasan Tamal, student representative of the university, said the transport workers attacked students' accommodations in the city's Rupatli area. The windows and gates of many houses were vandalised.

Another student Hasibul Hasan said their protest would continue until the attackers were arrested.

About the allegations of students, Kawsar Hossain Shipon, general secretary of Patuakhali Minibus Owners' Association, said outsiders were involved in the attack. No transport worker was involved there, he claimed.

BU VC Prof Sadequul Arefin said he contacted Barishal Metropolitan Police Commissioner Shahabuddin Khan and told him to take necessary steps to solve the problem.

The university will bear all medical costs of the injured students, the VC said.

Muktar Hossain, deputy commissioner of Barishal Metropolitan Police, said they were doing their best to handle the situation.

examinations would be held on three dates.

The tentative date for admission test for students from the humanities group is June 19. For the business group, it is June 26 and the science group either July 3 or July 10, they said.

The 20 public universities include Jagannath University, Shahjalal University of Science and Technology, Khulna University, Begum Rokeya University, Islamic University, Hajee Mohammad Danesh Science and Technology University, Mawlana Bhashani Science and Technology University, Noakhali Science and Technology University, Comilla University, Jatiya Kabi Kazi Nazrul Islam University, Jessore University of Science and Technology, Pabna University of Science and Technology, Bangladesh Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Science and Technology University, University of Barishal, Rangamati Science and Technology University, Rabindra University, Bangladesh Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Digital University, Sheikh Hasina University, and Bangamata Sheikh Fojilatunnesa Mujib Science and Technology University.

Besides, a cluster-based admission test for seven agricultural universities is likely to be held on May 29.

The tentative dates for Dhaka University admission test are May 21, 22, 26, 27 and June 5, while it is June 10 for Buet.

The entry test for Jahangirnagar University is likely to be on June 6-10 and June 20.

Admission test for Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Maritime University is likely to be held on June 4-5, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Aviation and Aerospace University on June 26, Bangladesh University of Textiles on June 18 and Bangladesh University of Professionals on February 26 and 27.

However, the probable date of admission test for Rajshahi and Chittagong universities have not been decided yet.

Admission tests for the MBBS course in the country's government-run and private medical colleges for the academic year 2020-21 will be held on April 2.

Also, entry tests for BDS courses of dental colleges and units will be held on April 30.

Tight competition awaits admission seekers of public universities this year. A record-setting number of students got GPA 5 in the HSC examinations, thanks to the lack of actual exams and the results being reflections of each student's grades in public exams held before.
