Man Killed in Feb 19 'Gunfight'

A trucker, not a drug dealer

Family claims rejecting Rab version, says he remained missing since Feb 14

A man, who was killed in an alleged gunfight with Rab-10 in Dhaka's Keraniganj on Friday, was the driver of a truck that ran over and killed a Rab member in Mymensingh's Bhaluka on February 14.

Four days after the so-called gunfight, family members of the deceased identified the body at the Dhaka Medical College morgue around 1:00am

The deceased was Shafiq Sheikh, 35, son of Abed Sheikh of a Jamalpur village, his brother-in-law Mohammad Manik told The Daily Star yesterday. He said Shafiq worked as a technician at the Tongi truck stand and was behind the wheels of the truck that killed the Rab man in Bhaluka.

Manik claimed that Shafiq had been missing since the accident on February 14. "Shafiq was not a drug peddler. He had been traceless since the accident."

After police informed them about his death and that the body was kept at the DMC morgue, Shafiq's wife and other family members went there for identification, Manik added.

On February 19, Bachchu Mia, inspector of a police outpost at Dhaka Medical College Hospital, said members of Rab-10 took a man with SEE PAGE 6 COL 2

Authorities meet students' demand for continuing the examinations

Dhaka University authorities have decided to hold all ongoing and previously announced exams of its seven affiliated colleges in the wake of student protests.


The decision came at an emergency virtual meeting between Education Minister Dipu Moni and the university authorities yesterday afternoon.

Meanwhile, demonstrations by students blocking the city's Nilkhet intersection caused sufferings to commuters as they had to endure long tailbacks on streets throughout the day.

Traffic was badly disrupted on Mirpur Road and Elephant Road, and also on streets in Shahbagh, Bangshal, Nayabazar

and some other adjacent areas. Many people had to walk to their destinations after getting off vehicles.



SHOOTING IN BAGHAICHHARI

UP member killed at upazila office

A union parishad member was shot dead inside the Baghaichhari upazila office in Rangamati yesterday.

The victim, 42-year-old Samar Bijay Chakma of the upazila's Boradam village, was also a member of Jana Sanghati Samity (MN Larma).

Quoting witnesses, police said a masked assailant sneaked into the project implementation officer's room around 1:00pm and opened fire at Samar, leaving him dead on the spot. The killer who came along with another assailant fled immediately,

Ín a statement, Joshi Chakma, general secretary of Baghaichhari JSS (MN Larma), blamed Parbatya Chattagram Jana Samhati Samiti (PCJSS)

for the killing. The PCJSS, however, denied its involvement in the incident. Tridiv Chakma, organising secretary of the party's upazila unit, said the

Chinese firm raises fund crunch alarm

In a rare press release, it alleges it hasn't been paid for 7 months' work; project director casts doubt on the release

The Chinese contractor for the Padma Bridge Rail Link Project yesterday alleged that it has not been paid for work done in the last seven months and this was slowing down work.

The slowdown threatens cost escalation and meeting the deadline has become

challenging, the contractor said.

China Railway Group Ltd, the contractor for the biggest project of Bangladesh Railway (BR), said the government owes it \$400 million and the payment delay rendered it unable to buy sufficient construction materials and pay subcontractors and suppliers timely.


