Burglars murder boy, 12, whose life was a series of unfortunate events

After the separation of his parents 11 years ago, Hasan Bapari used to live in his maternal grandparents' house in Feni. After their deaths last year, he was admitted to a madrasa in Narayanganj. But there he was sexually abused by a teacher and left the madrasa.


Ibrahim Khalid was an IBA alumnus and served as the president of Bangladesh MBA Association. He was also the president of Kachi-Kanchar Mela.
