

Polls to 230 Municipalities

AL wins 80pc mayor posts

Voter turnout lowest in 5th phase

The ruling Awami League has won 80 percent mayoral posts in 230 municipality polls held so far in five phases. Candidates of the AL's arch-rival BNP won less than five percent mayoral posts and independent mayoral hopefuls won 14 percent posts.

However, the voter turnout in Sunday's fifth phase of the municipality polls was the lowest among the five phases. According to Election Commission statistics, the AL won in 185 mayoral positions, BNP 11 and independent candidates 32. Besides, one candidate each from Jatiya

Party and Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal became victorious. AL leader said most of the independent candidates, who won the mayor elections, are rebels of the ruling party.

Speaking to The Daily Star, Shushashoner Jonno Nagorik (Shujan) Secretary Badiul Alam Majumdar yesterday said, Such results have proved that elections have become a one-party affair.'

The EC is holding municipality elections in six phases. Five phases have already been completed on December 28, January 16 and 30, February 14 and 28 respectively.

The sixth and final phase of the polls is likely to be held

A total of 24 municipalities went to polls in the first phase, with all polling centres using Electronic Voting Machine (EVM). Polls were held in 60 municipalities in the second phase, including 26 using EVMs.

Sixty-three municipalities went to elections in the third phase with all of them using ballot papers. In the fourth

CLASH WITH COPS **300 BNP** men sued, 13 placed on remand

Police yesterday filed a case against nearly 300 leaders and activists of BNP and its associated bodies over Sunday's clash in front of Jaitya Press Club during a protest rally demanding justice for the death of writer Mushtaq Ahmed in prison custody.

Sub-Inspector Palash Saha filed the case with Shahbagh Police Station naming 48 leaders and activists on charges of attempted murder of policemen, assault on police and carrying out vandalism, said Harunur Rashid, additional deputy commissioner (Ramna Zone) of Dhaka

Metropolitan Police. Among the accused are 200-250 more unidentified

leaders and activists. Meanwhile, a Dhaka court yesterday placed 12 Chhatra Dal men on five-day remand each

PK Halder beat them by an hour

Immigration cops at Benapole got his travel ban notice after his departure

Former NRB Global Bank managing director Proshanta Kumar Halder fled the country through Jashore's Benapole land port less than an hour before immigration police received his travel ban notice, Deputy Attorney General AKM Amin Uddin Manik said yesterday.

"Officials from immigration department crossed the Benapole border at 3:38pm on October 23 in 2019," he told The Daily

The Anti-Corruption Commission issued a travel ban on PK Halder on October 22, 2019 and sent the notice to immigration police by post, which the officials received at 4:30pm the next day, he added quoting immigration officials.

The DAG said Halder possessed two passports -- one Bangladeshi and the other Canadian -- and used his Bangladeshi passport to go to India.

Bangladesh flag hoisted at **Dhaka University**

In a historic student rally held at Dhaka University premises, the first Bangladesh flag was hoisted. The flag was dark green with a red sphere in the centre on which the outline of East Pakistan map was superimposed. It was unfurled by student leader ASM Abdur Rab on the rooftop of the western porch of the Arts Faculty of Dhaka University in front of hundreds of students and people. Saluting the flag, they all expressed their solidarity with the movement for liberation.

In the afternoon, the Pakistani flag was pulled down and the new flag was hoisted at Dhaka University and on the secretariat premises.

Suu Kyi hit with two new charges

Army chief vows to punish 'instigators' as protests continue

Myanmar's ousted leader Aung San Suu Kyi appeared at a court hearing via video conferencing yesterday as supporters marched in several towns and cities in defiance of a crackdown after the bloodiest day since the February 1 military coup.

Police fired tear gas and stun grenades to disperse hundreds of protesters in the main city of Yangon yesterday, witnesses said. They later combed through side streets firing rubber bullets and at least one person was hurt, media reported.

Argentine titanosaur may be oldest yet

A colossal dinosaur dug up in Argentina could be the oldest titanosaur ever found, having roamed what is now Patagonia some 140 million years ago at the beginning of the Cretaceous period, scientists said Sunday.

The 65-foot (20-metre) lizard, Ninjatitan zapatai, was discovered in 2014 in the Neuquen province of southwest Argentina, the La Matanza University reported on its analysis.

4 arrested for raping teenager in Thakurgaon


Madrasa teacher held for raping student in Lalmonirhat
