Death from stroke and cardiac arrests increased in 2020

Finds BBS report

The death toll from cardiac arrests and strokes increased last year compared to 2019, Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS) revealed yesterday.

Of the total deaths in the country, 17.9 percent died from cardiac arrest in 2019 whereas 21.1 percent of total deaths were caused by heart attacks in 2020. it said.

A total of 147,259 people died of heart attacks in 2019, whereas the number rose to 180,408 last year.

Mohammad Yamin Chowdhury, secretary of BBS, shared the information at a press conference.

The survey was conducted under the Monitoring the Situation of Vital Statistics of Bangladesh (MSVSB) project. He said about 8,248 people died of novel coronavirus till December 31, 2020.

"There is a slight difference between ours and DGHS data," said Yamin.

BBS has identified 75 causes of death in the last two In 2019, a total of 822,841 people died of different

causes and incidents. The number of deaths rose by 31,412 in 2020. Death from stroke almost doubled to 85,360 from

45,502 in the last two years, reads BBS statistics. According to BBS, the estimated population of the country is 16.85 crore, and the crude birth rate was 18 per thousand population in 2020. On the other hand, the crude death rate in 2020 was five per thousand population,

Photo exhibition on Bangabandhu's life and work concludes

A three-day photo exhibition on Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's life and work, marking the historic 7th May, concluded at Sylhet's Shilpakala Academy on Tuesday

The exhibition, inaugurated on March 7, was jointly organised by Bangladesh Photo Journalist Association in Sylhet and Sylhet Zilla Shilpakala Academy. Hundreds of people visited the photo exhibition during its three-day run.

In the closing ceremony, AZ Rowshan Jabin Ruba, panel chairman of Sylhet Zilla Parishad; Al Azad, president of Sylhet Zilla Press Club; Abdur Rashid Renu, general secretary of Sylhet Press Club; Swarnalata Ray, president of Sylhet Women's Chamber of Commerce and Industry; Bappa Ghosh Chowdhury, president of Electronics Media Journalist Association (EMJA) were present among others.

At the closing ceremony, speakers said that Bangabandhu's life and work is still extremely influential to Bangladesh's nation building process, and the next generation needs to be taught more about the legendary leader.

They said that Bangabandhu visited Sylhet many times during his lifetime. The history of those times must be collected and protected by photo journalists. Among the organisers, Ashit Baran Das Gupta, cultural officer of Sylhet and Sheikh Ashraful Alam Nasir, president of Bangladesh Photo Journalist Association in Sylhet division, also spoke during the closing ceremony.

Both the wage-employed and self-employed respondents were from agriculture, forestry, fishing, manufacturing (RMG and non-RMG), construction, hotel and restaurant, wholesale and retail trade, transportation, and health and social work sectors.

The report said 80 percent of those self-employed faced decrease in production, profit or sales amid the pandemic. In Dhaka, 31.1 percent of workers and 41.8 percent of self-employed individuals are yet to see their usual income,

Disclosing the findings, Sanem Research Director Prof Sayema Haque Bidisha said it is important to identify the affected sectors, which have not been able to recover vet. The self-employed ones were experiencing slower

recovery, and they should be in the government's policy focus, she said. Addressing the webinar, Policy Research Institute of

Bangladesh Executive Director Ahsan H Mansur said while the country was still dealing with those who have been affected by the pandemic, an additional 20 lakh new faces already entered the labour market.

"There is no scope for complacency," he said.

Pointing to an increased unemployment situation in the country, Mansur said while young people were entering workforce as they reached working age, there was no initiative for their employment. On the other hand, financial and non-financial data

point out that investment remains stagnant. So, the concern is if investment does not increase then how will youths, who are entering the workforce, be employed, he added. Khondaker Golam Moazzem, research director of Centre for Policy Dialogue, said there was "sluggish" private

investment, which could continue due to uncertainty amid In this context, increase in public investment is important,

he said, suggesting that the government in the next budget should consider "employment-enhancing investments". Sanem Executive Director Prof Selim Raihan said due to

Covid-19, inequality increased and employment sector was disrupted in the country. INTERNAL AND INTERNATIONAL MIGRANTS

The Sanem survey said of the 230 internal migrants, 49 percent returned to villages amid the pandemic, mainly due to job loss, non-payment, decrease in salary and failure to

However, at the time of the survey, almost everyone returned back to the cities.

Of the 273 international migrants, 20 percent faced job loss amid the pandemic and five percent returned home, said the report.

Sanem recommended that strategies to integrate returnee migrants in domestic market should be prioritised.

Refugee and Migratory Movements Research Unit Chair Prof Tasneem Siddiqui said the government needs to formulate a long-term "emergency situation guideline" for migrant workers to address their problems in crisis periods.

ILO Bangladesh Country Director Tuomo Poutiainen said the global market, particularly labour market, as well as consumption and trade continue to be unpredictable amid the pandemic.
