 "His condition suddenly deteriorated while returning to Dhaka from Sylhet on Sunday. Upon reaching the capital, he was rushed to the hospital. On Monday, he was tested for Covid-19 and the report came positive," said Julhas.
 He was praised for helping his constituents during the early days of the pandemic. The online version of this newspaper ran a report about him titled "The people's lawmaker" on April 16 last year.

Mahmud Us Samad, hailing from Nurpur village of Sylhet's Fenchuganj upazila, was born on January 3, 1955 in Sylhet.
 He was first elected a parliamentarian in the 2008 general election and then again in the 2014 and 2019 polls from the Awami League.
 The lawmaker was also a successful industrialist. He was acting as the chairman and managing director of Kushiara Composite Knit Industries Limited, MSC Real Estate Limited and MSC Garments Limited.

12 protesters shot dead

 Tun, said Suu Kyi had accepted illegal payments worth \$600,000, as well as gold, while in government, according to a complaint by Phyo Mien Thein, a former chief minister of Yangon.
 "He strongly said that," the spokesman told a news conference. "We have verified those facts several times. Now the anti-corruption committee is continuing the investigation."
 Aye Ma Ma Myo, a member of the dissolved parliament belonging to Suu Kyi's National League for Democracy, rejected the claim.
 "It is no longer uncommon to see slander against politicians and efforts to crush the party while innocent young people are killed in public," she told Reuters in a message.
 Thursday's deaths brought the number of protesters killed since the coup to more than 70, the AAPP said. Some 2,000 people have also been detained since the coup against Suu Kyi's elected government, it says.
 The army did not respond to requests for comment on the latest deaths but the junta spokesman said the security forces were disciplined and used force only when necessary.
 UN human rights investigator Thomas Andrews told the UN Human Rights Council in Geneva the military may have committed crimes against humanity. He called for multilateral sanctions on the junta and the state energy firm, Myanmar Oil and Gas

Enterprise.
 An Amnesty International report yesterday accused the military of using "battlefield weapons" on unarmed protesters and carrying out premeditated killings orchestrated by their commanding officers.
 The rights group catalogued the security forces' use of firearms that are "completely inappropriate for use in policing protests", including light machine guns, sniper rifles and semi-automatic rifles.
 The army has justified taking power by saying that a November election, overwhelmingly won by Suu Kyi's party, was marred by fraud - an assertion rejected by the electoral commission.
 Junta spokesman Zaw Min Tun reiterated that the military would only be in charge for a certain period before holding an election. The junta has said a state of emergency will last for a year, but has not set a date for the election.
 With international condemnation so far seemingly ignored by the junta, the United States applied fresh pressure with sanctions against two adult children of coup leader General Min Aung Hlaing.
 And the Asian Development Bank announced it had temporarily suspended funding for government projects in Myanmar "as the international community assesses the evolving situation".

 The International Labour Organization describes shipbreaking as one of the world's most dangerous occupations, but NGO Shipbreaking Platform, a coalition campaigning for safe ship recycling, said there was little accountability for deaths and injuries.
 At least seven Bangladeshi shipbreaking workers died last year and 24 died in 2019, said non-profit Young Power in Social Action.
 Law firm Leigh Day, which is representing Begum, said this was believed to be first judgment of a higher court that directly held that shipping companies can be held liable.
 "The (findings) will send shockwaves around the shipping industry as a higher court has recognised that shipping companies choosing to send vessels to the beaches of Bangladesh may owe a duty of care to the local workers and can be liable," said Oliver Holland, a partner at Leigh Day.
 Bangladesh is one of the top locations for dismantling end-of-life ships with at least 144 ships broken on its beaches last year, or about one in every five dismantled worldwide in 2020, according to a report by NGO Shipbreaking Platform.
 Most of the others ended up in India, Pakistan and Turkey.

Facebook halts project for undersea data cable to HK

 Facebook has decided to halt its efforts to build a trans-Pacific undersea cable that would have connected California and Hong Kong, due to tensions between the United States and China.
 "Due to ongoing concerns from the US government about direct communication links between the United States and Hong Kong, we have decided to withdraw our FCC application," a Facebook spokesperson told AFP on Wednesday, referring to the Federal Communications Commission.

 railway project has already been submitted.
 The estimated cost of the project would be about \$11.4 billion, or Tk 96,752 crore.
 The 227.3km Dhaka-Narayanganj-Cumilla-Feni-Chattoogram route was approved by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.
 Once constructed and the high-speed train begins operation, the journey from the capital to the commercial capital (Chattoogram) will be slashed to just 73 minutes.
 An uninterrupted journey between Dhaka and Chattoogram will take only 55 minutes.
 The trains, which will run at a top speed of 300km/hr, can carry approximately 50,000 passengers each way daily.
 It will, however, not be cheap. With fares expected to be around the Tk 2,000 mark, more than three times the fare of an AC seat on existing Bangladeshi inter-city trains.
 However, some transport experts termed the project "highly ambitious" and questioned the capacity of BR to operate the high-speed train, when it has not yet introduced the electric train.
THE PROPOSAL
 As per their proposal, CRCC and CCECC will form one special purpose vehicle (SPV), a term for a dedicated company for the project, in Bangladesh pursuant to laws and regulations here.
 The company will undertake the financing, construction and five-year operation (subject to negotiation) of the service, according to the proposal. After the agreed operation period, they would hand over the project to BR or the designated receiver.
 BR shall pay the company the

available payment semi-annually according to the agreed schedule and the repayment period would be 20 years.
 The repayment should commence from the start of agreed operation period and the total repayment sum shall cover the capital and operating expenditure of the company.
 CRCC and CCECC will source the project financing from different banks and financial institutions in the name of the SPV at a competitive interest rate to minimise the financing cost, they said.
 The finance ministry will have to provide a sovereign guarantee to the financier for securing the loan, it added.
 The SPV will implement the project with their parent companies CRCC and CCECC, reads the proposal.
 "The railways ministry has asked us [BR] to give opinion over the proposal. But we are not the competent authority to give opinion on financing issues. We are the implementing authority," a high-level BR official, who took part in yesterday's meeting, said.
 "So, we will write to the rail ministry to take opinion from ERD and PPA over the proposal," he said, preferring anonymity.
 He also said it has not yet been settled whether the project would be implemented under PPP or investment model.
 Another participant of the meeting said there is an ambiguity in the proposal that needs to be clarified. So, they opined for seeking opinions from PPA and ERD, he said wishing anonymity.
 Contacted BR's DG Dharendra Nath Mazumder said they got the proposal from the Chinese companies, but they thought that such proposal should come through the ERD.

 A study published in the journal Antiquity yesterday documented a particularly significant discovery of a grave in which a man and woman were buried. Ancient DNA analysis revealed

the individuals were not biologically related, but had children together.
 Radiocarbon dating found that they had died close together in the mid 17th-century BC. Atop the female skull was a silver crown known as a diadem, suggesting the woman buried was an elite member of society.
