

While head coach Jamie Day has competition for places in defence and midfield departments in the Bangladesh national football team, a lack of talent up front has forced the Brit to search for better options to get goals in international matches.

Day's charges have adopted well to his methods and defended well for nearly three years, but they are still like

trainees when it comes to finding the target on the international stage. In the absence of regular starter Nabib Newaj Jibon, Jamie last November picked forwards Suman Reza and MS Bablu for the two FIFA friendlies against Nepal in November. Suman retained his position in the national fold but Bablu was dropped following unimpressive performances in the domestic circuit.

Ahead of a tournament involving hosts Nepal and Kyrgyzstan U-23 side that Bangladesh will fly for on March 18, the 41-year-old coach again gave a couple of forwards the opportunity to grab spots, including Mohammad Jewel of Bangladesh Police, who made the jump from the standby list to a final 25-member squad by impressing in training.

"I really like playing in striking positions and I got a big opportunity by making it into the squad by proving myself. I have been playing as the forward since my childhood with an aim to score goals in every matches, said Jewel before the start of yesterday's training at Bangabandhu National

"I was kept as a standby player but my target was to do something good to secure a place in the final squad and I am really happy that I achieved my first target. I will now try to secure a place in the playing eleven," the 20-year-old who grew up in the neighborhood of Arambagh said.

Meanwhile, Jewel said that he had faith in himself and was not taking any pressure to shine for the national team immediately.

'I have just started my journey with the national team. I don't think everything will come to an end if I can't shine this time around but I am hopeful that we can deliver something good against Nepal and Kyrgyzstan as well as in the FIFA World Cup Qualifiers in June," Jewel said.

CHAMPIONS LEAGUE ROUND OF 16

Lazio need a miracle against Bayern



Bayern Munich take on Lazio in the second leg of their Champions League last-16 knockout tie tonight, with the defending champions holding a 4-1 lead from the first leg at Stadio Olimpico.

As such, it would take a monumental effort from the Italians to overturn the deficit at Allianz Arena and subsequently reach the quarter-final of this competition for the first time since 2000.

After the first leg in which Bayern demolished Lazio, the second leg should just be a formality and doesn't promise a lot of excitement. Still, this is Champions League where often predictions end up trashed.

The reigning winners are on a good path to defend the title since they are practically already in the quarter-finals. The Bavarians are a well-oiled machine and they haven't missed a beat this season since they are also sitting at the top of Bundesliga with four points ahead of Red Bull Leipzig and three wins in a row.

On the other hand, it would take a miracle for Lazio to win the tie after losing the first leg. In addition to this, Lazio are not in the best form. In the past five Serie A matches, they've won only two times and lost three games.

Can Atletico overcome their deficit?

Chelsea will look to book a spot in the Champions League quarter-finals as they take on Atletico Madrid at Stamford Bridge tonight with an away goal in their kitty.

Chelsea are yet to be beaten under new manager enough, the Blues have conceded just twice in that time.

Though they haven't exactly been the most enterprising side in the final third, the Blues have shored up their defense and all they might need to do on Wednesday is dig their heels in and defend out of their skin. Atletico have it all to do at Stamford Bridge, but on a run of two wins in seven, form is not on their side. They have, though, won four of their last six away matches, which is a boost as they look to overturn the one-goal deficit.

Atletico will have to show considerably more going forward in this game otherwise their European campaign



will be over. They have been slightly more convincing since the first leg, taking eight points from four league games in a run which has included some tough fixtures such as the Madrid derby and an away trip to Villarreal. Their most recent outing was a disappointing 0-0 draw at Getafe where Atleti failed to convert a series of late chances to win the game.

Atletico have happy memories of this ground having won a Champions League Semi-Final 2nd Leg here in Thomas Tuchel. They have won eight and drawn four of 2014. Only Koke remains from the starting XI that night their 12 games played. And as if that wasn't impressive though and this is also clearly a very different Chelsea
