Act before it's too late

Experts urge govt as Covid cases surge alarmingly

As Covid-19 transmission escalates, healthcare experts urged the government to take stringent measures immediately to rein in the surge before it goes out of

The country witnessed at least 2,187 new cases yesterday -- the highest for a single day in the last 100 days.

The country witnessed 2,202 cases on December 8 last year, according to the data from the Directorate General of

Health Services (DGHS). "We are frightened and frustrated seeing the people's reckless behaviour. I think it is high time to send a strict message to the people that the situation is grave. If needed, the government should go for lockdown and cancel all public examinations," Prof Md Sayedur Rahman, chairman of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University's (BSMMU's) pharmacology department, told The Daily Star yesterday.

He also warned that if the transmission was not contained right now, it would go beyond control.

There has been a sharp rise of new Covid-19 cases since the beginning of the second week of March, with healthcare officials and experts blaming it on people's reluctance to follow health safety guidelines.

The new cases recorded yesterday were against 21,212 tests, which meant that the positivity rate was 10.45 percent -- almost 3 points up from the previous day's 7.68 percent. SEE PAGE 2 COL 3

Biman to fly Dhaka-Male

Bangladesh, the Maldives agree to direct shipping lines too

Bangladesh and the Maldives would have direct flights and commercial shipping links as the two South Asian countries see a huge scope of boosting trade, tourism, and cooperation on human resource development.

"The good news is the prime minister [Sheikh Hasina] has declared that Biman Bangladesh Airlines will start its Dhaka-Malé operations very soon. We are expecting another good news that we can begin a direct shipping line from Chattogram to Malé," said Foreign Minister AK Abdul Momen.

Officials said the move would drastically reduce the cost of travel and transport of commodities and thereby improve competitiveness of businesses. Pollutants 10 times the limit in winter

Two major public hospitals in Dhaka had concentrations of harmful air pollutants 10 times higher than the permissible limit in winter, finds a The indoor air quality of the healthcare installations during the pre-

monsoon period remained two times worse than the permissible limit recommended by the World Health Organization and Bangladesh national ambient air quality standards (NAAQŠ).

The study was based on the air quality of Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH), Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU) and Sonargaon Upazila Health Complex in Narayangani.

Air quality was monitored in 16 locations of the three health care installations between October 2019 and January 2020, said the report published in the journal of Environmental Science and Pollution Research on March 15.

"Outdoor air has a significant impact on the hospitals' indoor air quality," said the study titled "Indoor air quality indicators and toxicity
