ARSENIC CONTAMINATION IN WATER

No proper study done in years

Twenty-eight years have passed since the country first detected arsenic in water, but neither the extent nor the intensity of the chemical element was reduced, say experts.

To make it even worse, no comprehensive study to gauge the intensity of arsenic contamination was done in all these years.

As a result, the government does not have any updated record on the number of arsenic patients in the country, they added.

Also, the government has no exact data on how many persons get infected with arsenicosis or die because of the silent poison every year.

According to a bulletin of the World Health Organization (WHO), conducted in 2012, Bangladesh's arsenic contamination of water was the world's worst mass poisoning.

At least 43,000 people died because of arsenic poisoning every year in Bangladesh, the bulletin read.

Soon after the presence of arsenic in



tube-well water was detected in the early 90s, the Department of Public Health Engineering tested arsenic in tube-wells in 2003 all over the country except for Dhaka, Chattogram, Rajshahi, and Khulna zones.

Under the Bangladesh Arsenic Mitigation Water Supply Project (BAMWSP), the department conducted a nationwide screening covering 57,482 villages located in 271 upazilas.

They found 29 percent out of the 4.95

Cuet student arrested in DSA case

Arrested teen in Thakurgaon sent to juvie

A student of Chittagong University of Engineering and Technology was arrested yesterday in a case filed by police under the Digital Security Act.

The accused, a final-year student of civil engineering, made derogatory remarks about Prophet Hazrat Muhammad (SM) on his Facebook page, according to police.

The student was arrested from the port city's Uttar Nalapara area yesterday morning, said Md Anwar Hossain Shamim, assistant superintendent of police (Raozan-Rangunia circle).

Earlier, police filed the case with Raozan Police Station after his alleged derogatory remarks went viral on Facebook.

The Cuet authorities later suspended the student from the university.

The decision was made at a meeting of the disciplinary committee, said Rashedul Islam, public relations officer at Cuet.

Meanwhile, a Thakurgaon court yesterday sent a student of class-XII to Jessore Juvenile Correction Centre following his arrest on Saturday in a case filed under the DSA.

MAYHEM IN SUNAMGANJ

3 more held over attacks on Hindus

Police have arrested three more people in two cases filed over Wednesday's attack on Hindu houses in Noagaon village of Sunamganj's Shalla upazila.

The arrests were made in different villages of the upazila early yesterday, said Najmul Huq, officer-in-charge of Shalla Police Station.

With them, 33 people have so far been arrested in connection with the incident. All are in jail now, the OC added.

On Saturday, Police Bureau of Investigation held prime accused -- Shahidul Islam Swadhin, member of Sarmangal Union Parishad in Derai upazila.

Shahidul, a resident of Nachni village adjacent to Noagaon, is locally known as a leader of Jubo League, the ruling Awami League's youth front. Jubo League, however, claimed that he was not a leader of the organisation.

There are widespread allegations that Shahidul had a feud with the Hindus of Noagaon village over fishing in a water body (Jolmohal) and he perpetrated the attack by gathering Hefajat supporters over an alleged Facebook post.

TRIPARTITE TALKS

On the morning of March 22, 1971, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman called on President Yahya Khan. Zulfikar Ali Bhutto was also present at the meeting. The three met together face to face for the first time since the December elections. Bangabandhu was annoyed at the presence of Bhutto since he had told Yahya that direct negotiations with Bhutto was out of the question. Bhutto was also disturbed since he had the understanding from the "clarifications" sent by Yahya that such talks would be arranged once he was in Dhaka. Bhutto provides an account of the tripartite meeting in his memoir:

"[Sheikh] Mujibur Rahman then turned to the President and asked him if he had given his final approval to the proposals



of the Awami League. The President reminded him that it was necessary for me also to agree and for that reason I was present at the discussions. On that [Sheikh] Mujibur Rahman remarked that the proposals had been communicated to the President and it was for the President to convince me and went on to say that once Mr. Bhutto agreed in principle to the proposals, they could hold formal discussions, but until then the discussions were of an informal nature and on leaving the President he would tell the press that he had met the President and that Mr. Bhutto also happened to be present. The President replied that this was not good enough, but [Sheikh] Mujibur Rahman remained adamant." [Zulfikar Ali Bhutto, The Great Tragedy, SEE PAGE 5 COL 1

US promises have no credibility

Says Iran's Khamenei

Iran does not trust US promises on lifting sanctions and will only return to its commitments under a 2015 nuclear deal once Washington fully removes the measures, Iranian Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei said yesterday.

The administration of US President Joe Biden is exploring ways to restore the 2015 nuclear deal that Iran signed with major world powers, but which was abandoned in 2018 by President Donald Trump, who reimposed sanctions.

Half of all UK adults get first vaccine dose

AstraZeneca counters Indonesian Muslim concerns over its Covid jab

Britain has hit a Covid-19 vaccination milestone with more than half of all adults having had at least one injection, health secretary Matt Hancock said, making it the world's first major economy to achieve that level of inoculation.

Britain's vaccine roll-out, which has raced ahead of those in the European Union and the United States, means the country is on track to ease lockdown measures and re-open the economy in line with its plan, Hancock said.

"The vaccination programme is our route out of the pandemic," Hancock told Sky News on Saturday. Official data showed 26.9 million had received a first dose of vaccine, up from 26.3 million the previous day.
