Never seen so many bodies

Jagannath Hall massacre witness recalls March 25 horror

Rabindra Mohan Das spent the entire evening yesterday watching live on television the programmes celebrating 50 years of the country's independence.

He was enthralled to see the colourful events held in the presence of global leaders who were lauding the socio-economic progress of Bangladesh.

Yet he was continuously distracted by the memories of the horror unleashed by the Pakistan army on the students and staff of Dhaka University's Jagannath Hall on the night of March 25, 1971.

"How could I forget it? The atrocities of the Pakistan military are flashing through my mind. As March 25 arrives every year, I feel restless. I

Infections gallop amid slow response

Experts yet again urge govt to act fast

In the wake of the second Covid-19 wave in the country, the government's efforts to check virus transmission and ensure treatment are still inadequate in view of the ground reality.

Despite the health directorate's recommendations for enforcing a lockdown and taking other strict measures, the government's efforts remain limited to distribution of masks and directives for following health safety guidelines.

The government has not been able to strictly enforce the health safety rules, a key instrument in the fight against virus transmission. A large section of the population is still reluctant to wear masks though it is mandatory to use those in public places.

Its preparations fall short of the required level in case the health system gets overstretched due to a surge in infections.

The health directorate has not been successful in increasing the number of Covid tests and providing central oxygen supply, ICU support and necessary equipment to public hospitals across the country.

Meanwhile, the directorate yesterday reported 3,567 new Covid cases -- the highest in nearly nine months. It recorded 28 more deaths from the virus.

Speaking at a programme in the city, Health Minister Zahid Maleque yesterday said that if Covid infections keep spreading this fast, the existing health system will not be able to handle the situation.

Against this backdrop, experts have recommended enforcing health safety rules strictly, increasing the number of daily tests, and ensuring that the Covid patients are kept isolated to check virus transmission.

Talking to The Daily Star yesterday, Dr Mushtuq Hussain, consultant at the Institute of Epidemiology, Disease Control and Research, said, "The government has

Acute gas crisis continues to hit city parts

Sazzad Hossain was waiting to buy food for his family of four at a restaurant in Mohammadpur's Zakir Hossain Road. They could not cook anything at home because of a gas crisis.

"There has been no gas in our home for the last two days. I have already spent more than a thousand taka for breakfast, lunch and dinner items," he said, standing at the restaurant yesterday afternoon.

Sazzad, a 55-year-old service holder, also said since food from outside was expensive and oily, he was thinking about getting an electric cooker.

Asif Iqbal, another man who lives in the same area, was a bit luckier than Sazzad. His family was being provided with food by a relative, who is using a gas cylinder to cook.

"But how long can this continue?" Asif asked.

Waive import duty on newsprint, cut corporate tax

It's safe, no risk of blood clot

Bangladeshi-British scientist says on AstraZeneca vaccine

The Oxford-AstraZeneca coronavirus vaccine is safe and effective and has no serious side effect like blood clot, says Bangladeshi-born British scientist Dr Khondoker Mehedi Akram.

In an exclusive interview with The Daily Star's Golam Mertoza, Akram talked about various aspects of the vaccine named Covishield and the recent rise of infections.

About the reports on blood clot from AstraZeneca vaccine in Europe, which also created concern in Bangladesh, he said in normal circumstances one in 10 lakh people may develop blood clot.

Akram, a research fellow at the University of Sheffield, said around 50 lakh people received shots in Bangladesh and in that case five out of these 50 lakh were supposed to face such a problem.

"But no one has so far complained [of blood clot]. After

3 killed in Gaibandha explosion

Bomb disposal unit rushes to the spot

Three people were killed in an explosion inside a house in Gaibandha's Gobindaganj upazila yesterday afternoon.

The explosion happened at 4:20pm, moments after the owner of the house and three others went into one of the rooms. The explosion blew off the corrugated-iron sheet roof of the house in Noyapara village.

Owner Borhan Uddin, 40, his neighbour Wahedul Islam, 32, were among the dead. Police could not immediately identify the other person.

Police cordoned off the area over suspicion

Government plans 258km underground rail

The government has plans to build an underground railway network with 258 kilometres of tracks in Dhaka and ease congestion on the roads.

There will be 11 subway routes in the city and its outskirts, according to the draft of a feasibility study by Bangladesh Bridge Authority (BBA).

The 50-year plan will be implemented in three phases. Four routes of a combined length of 102km will be constructed in the first phase. In the second and third phases, 85km and 71km lines will be constructed.

There will be a 29.35km route called "O" from Jhilmil Project area in Keraniganj to Tongi. It will be the first

to be implemented at an approximate cost of \$8 billion, officials said.

BBA officials and consultants revealed the information yesterday at a seminar at a hotel on the feasibility study and preliminary design for construction of the Dhaka Subway.

Several experts, including a few present at the seminar, questioned the feasibility of the mega project in Dhaka.

Building a subway network has long been in discussion, but it was not mentioned in the revised strategic transport plan for Dhaka, approved in 2015, they said.

Besides, the cost of the subway project would be more than the undergoing MRT projects, according

to the document.

The cost of MRT-1, which has a 19.87km underground section and an 11.36km elevated section, is Tk 52,561.43 crore. But the proposed cost of the 30km subway route is around Tk 68,000 crore.

Addressing the event, Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader said there should be proper coordination among different development projects to avoid overlap.

THE SUBWAY PLAN

Instructed by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, BBA started the feasibility study in September 2018.

Led by Spanish firm TYPSA, a
