

'They stole 1,000 bikes in last 7yrs'

Nine inter-district thieves arrested in Ctg

Police yesterday claimed to have arrested nine inter-district motorbike thieves and recovered 20 stolen motorbikes conducting drives in different districts for the last two days.

Law enforcers said the gang stole nearly 1,000 motorbikes across the country and later traded them in different areas.

The arrestees are Md Mehedi Hasan (19), Md Mahmudul Hasan (24), Md Shakhawat Hossain alias Rubel (25), Shahadat Hossain Sajjad (27), Md Reaz (32), Md Anwarul Islam Ripon (38), Md Obaidul Kader (42) and Milton Sarkar alias Milton Kumar Shaha alias Sohel (44).

Among them, Milton, Rafiq, and Reaz are the kingpins of the motorbike stealing gang, said police.

CMP Additional Deputy Commissioner (South) Palash Kanti Nath told The Daily Star, "Arrested Rafiq and Milton met in jail and later organised the syndicate to steal motorbikes. Under the syndicate, over 15 members used to steal bikes."

"During interrogation, the duo admitted that they have stolen around 1,000 motorbikes from different areas in the

country over the last seven years," said the ADC.

Assistant Commissioner (Kotwali zone) Nobel Chakma said, "A team of Kotwali police first arrested Mehedi and Milton on March 25 night with an unregistered motorcycle without a number plate from Kadamtali area of the port city."

"Based on Milton's information, police recovered one motorbike from Sitakunda Sadar upazila, seven from Boro Darogar Hat of Sitakunda, two from Feni and one from Ramgar area," told the AC.

During the drives, police also arrested Anwar, Obaidul, Mahmudul, and Rubel in this connection, said the official.

"After modifying the motorbikes, they used to sell those in exchange for Tk 15,000 to Tk 30,000 based on the bike's condition. The stolen motorcycles used to run in remote areas of Khagrachhari, Sitakunda, Feni, and other parts where traffic police are not available," said Sub-inspector Mominul Hasan of Kotwali police station.

OC Nezam Uddin of Kotwali Police Station said Milton is accused in four cases, Ripon in three and Sajjad in four cases. Police were trying to arrest the other accused, he said.

BALUKHALI BLAZE Med supplies arrive from Turkey

A flight from Turkey landed at Shah Amanat International Airport in Chattogram carrying supplies for a field hospital for Rohingya yesterday.

A Turkish Air Force flight-C130 carrying 20 tonnes of goods including generators, tents and equipment landed at 2:30pm, said airport manager Farhad Hossain.

"Turkey government sent the materials to reconstruct the field hospital named Turkish Hospital - which was gutted in the fire at Balukhali rohingya camp," the official added. "It will be handed over to hospital authority in presence of the Turkish ambassador."

"His indomitable spirit and fortitude inspired millions, who emerged victorious despite challenging circumstances," Modi also mentioned.

During his visit to Orakandi, Modi said the two countries have proven their capabilities during the coronavirus pandemic and today, both are facing this pandemic strongly and also fighting it together.

India is working with consideration that it is its duty that "Made-in-India" vaccines reaches the citizens of Bangladesh, he added. Modi offered prayers at Harichandra Thakurbari Temple in Orakandi.

He started his day visiting Jessoreshwari Kali Temple at Ishwaripur village of Shyamnagar in Satkhira and offered puja there. Jayanta Chattapadhyaya and Krishna Chattapadhyaya from Sebayat family of the temple welcomed him around 10:15am.

At Jessoreshwari Kali Temple, Modi was welcomed with beats of traditional drum and blowing of conches, reports our correspondent from Satkhira.

He entered the temple and offered prayers along with the Sabayet (caretaker) of the temple, Jyoti Chattopadhyay told The Daily Star.

Inside the temple, Modi, who was wearing a mask, sat on the floor while the priest Dilip Mukharjee recited from holy books.

During the prayers, Modi offered golden crown, red saree, fruits and sweets to Goddess Kali.

According to news agency ANI, after offering prayers at the temple, Modi said, "I got the opportunity to visit this Shaktipeeth to pay obeisance to Maa Kali. I prayed to her to free the human race from Covid-19."

"When Maa Kali mela (festival) is held here, large number of devotees come from across the border. Therefore, a community hall is needed which should be multi-purpose so that when people come here during Kali puja, it is useful to them for social, religious and educational events."

"Most importantly, it should act as a shelter for all at the time of disasters like cyclone. The government of India will do the construction work. I express gratitude to Bangladesh Government that they have wished us well for this," Modi said.

ISLAMI ANDOLAN EXTENDS SUPPORT TO HARTAL

Meanwhile, Islami Andolan Bangladesh expressed full support to the hartal called by Hefajat-e-Islam today.

They also announced a protest rally in front of the Jatiya Press Club in the capital on April 1.

Over two thousand activists of the Islamist party thronged the north gate of the national mosque around 3pm after Hefajat-e-Islam activists moved from there, after staging a rally on the same demands.

They placed a six-point demand at the rally: suspension of police officers responsible and judicial probe into the killings at Chattogram and Brahmanbaria, suspension of Hathazari Police Station Officer-in-Charge, compensation for families of the slain Hefajat activists and treatment for the injured, release of all arrestees detained over anti-Modi protests and withdrawal of cases against the activists.

It also urged the government to identify ruling party "thugs" who carried out the attacks and bring back the constitutional rights to freedom of assembly and meetings.

Friday's clashes left four agitators dead

at Hathazari, Chattogram -- the home base of Hefajat, one in Brahmanbaria, and more than a hundred injured.

After the deadly clashes, members of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) were deployed at different parts of the country, including the capital, to keep law and order situation in control.

Besides, police officials were asked to remain alert as police stations might come under attacks.

CASE FILED OVER ATTACK ON POLICE, VANDALISM IN CAPITAL
Meanwhile, a case was filed with Paltan Police Station in the capital over the mayhem that took place at national mosque premises on Friday.

The clashes left around 60 people injured including two Daily Star photojournalists, confirmed Syed Nurul Islam, deputy commissioner of Motijheel Division of police.

While addressing reporters at Paltan intersection, DC Nurul said the case was filed for the attack on police and vandalism in the mosque against unidentified people, but no one was named in the first information report (FIR).

Asked about today's hartal, DC Nurul said their job is to protect public property, and they will be on high alert to ensure security.
