"I still believe it should have been held in February when things were looking a bit more stable. This is really frustrating," said Monirul, also the executive director of Academic and Creative Publishers' Association of Bangladesh.

But this was difficult due to social distancing requirements. Moreover, many writers living abroad couldn't come home to be there for their book's publication.

Poet Piash Mazid said, "I could only get very little interaction with the readers. The congregation of writers and readers that we are used to were sorely missed this year."

Mithun Raksham, writer and publisher of Thokbirim, said, "Every year, indigenous researchers and literary enthusiasts come here all the

way from Rangamati and Mymensingh Director General Habibullah Siraji to buy from my stall. But due to the said, "Everything is different due lockdown, almost none of them could come this year.'

Most visitors were also frustrated. From the delayed start to the frequent timing changes, they had a lot to complain about when this correspondent spoke to them.

"This year's fair felt underwhelming. It was short, and there was no festive feel to it," said regular Boi Mela visitor Suraiya Jasmine. "Besides, the timing was odd -- noon is no time to visit a book fair in summer.'

However, some also praised the initiative.

Atia Begum, standing next in line to him, said, "We have to stand in line for an hour or so. But once we reach the end, we end up getting fewer goods at higher prices.

"What makes it even harder is that the goods come in a package. If you don't buy onion, it doesn't give oil. But I don't need big onions like the ones sold here, I need cooking oil," she said with frustration.

Customers also alleged that the trucks are not going to places where they are needed most.

As an example, they cited how only one truck goes to Khalishpur, one of the lowest-income areas, whereas Shibbari Mor, a more affluent area, also gets one truck. They said this misallocation does not help the people of

"Founding Father of the Nation", but the court committed an error in its observations by using "Founding Fathers". The error is liable to be reviewed or expunged, it adds.

Article 96 deals with formation and functions of SJC. The article was scrapped when the 16th amendment was introduced.

In the full text of the verdict that upheld the scrapping of the amendment, the Supreme Court said the provision of SJC was reinstated in the constitution.

It also said the independence of the judiciary was undermined and curtailed by making the judiciary 'vulnerable to a process of removal of the judges by parliament".

The procedure entailed in the SJC is more in consonance with the spirit of the constitutional scheme, the SC observed in the full verdict. The provision of SJC was not only for the interest of justice, but also for the independence of the udiciary, the court said.

The scrapping of the 16th constitutional amendment was widely discussed among ruling party politicians as the SC, in its full verdict, made observations critical of the then prevailing political culture.
