As cases rise across India, criticism is mounting over how Prime Minister Narendra Modi's administration has handled the health crisis, as religious festivals and election rallies attended by thousands continue.

India's government relaxed almost all lockdown curbs of last year by the beginning of 2021, although some regions including New Delhi and the state of Maharashtra, home to financial hub Mumbai, have introduced localised restrictions.

While Mumbai remains under curfew on all days as per state guidelines, New Delhi has allowed cinema halls to operate at 30% capacity and people to move freely during weekdays.

"There is no option but to lockdown Delhi for 1-2 weeks," said Dr. Ambrish Mithal, a top doctor of endocrinology and diabetes at hospital operator Max Healthcare, adding that weekend curfews "won't do".

"(The) situation is unmanageable at present," he said on Twitter. **RELIGIOUS FESTIVAL** Amid reports of severe shortage of oxygen supplies and critical medicines such as the anti-viral drug Remdesivir, Modi on Saturday asked authorities to pull out all the stops to ramp up production of Covid-19 vaccines and asked his teams to work closely with local governments.

After hundreds of thousands of ascetics and devout Hindus gathered for several days along the banks of the Ganges for a religious festival Kumbh Mela, Modi on Saturday called for restraint, saying on Twitter the festival should now be kept "symbolic".

Responding to Modi's appeal, one of the religious leaders Swami Avdheshanand urged devotees to not gather in large numbers.

Those returning to Mumbai from the Kumbh Mela will have to quarantine, the city mayor said.

Experts have warned about the spread of more contagious variants of the disease, especially during largescale gatherings for religious festivals and political rallies.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi - who has also addressed election rallies in recent weeks - said yesterday he was suspending all his public rallies in West Bengal.

Renowned actor Wasim laid to rest

He was crowned "Mr East Pakistan" for his bodybuilding and fitness in 1964.

The actor studied at Mymensingh Zilla School and Anondomohan College in Mymensingh. He pursued his bachelor's and master's in general history from Dhaka University. He worked at Bangladesh Betar after his graduation. Wasim also served as the first secretary general of the National Sports Council.

He entered the film industry as an assistant director in 1972 with the film "Chhando Hariye Gelo", where he also had a cameo role.

At different recent programmes, he also instigated people, who attacked police stations, police outposts and other establishment across the country, the DC said in reply to a query at his office.

He would be produced before a court today, added the police official.

Mamunul, son of late Bangladesh Khilafah Majlis leader Allama Azizul Haque, became a known figure at waz mahfil. In recent times, he was even spotted using helicopters to reach venues of waz mahfil in different parts of the country, sources said.

If organisers of a waz mahfil wished to have him as a speaker, they had to contact him at least a year before the programme, added the sources.

Recently, Hefajat supporters took part in protests against Modi's visit and carried out widespread violence in Dhaka, Narayanganj, Chattogram and Brahmanbaria.

From March 26 to 28, at least 17 people were killed in violence, and 73 cases were filed with different police stations over for violence and mayhem in different districts, according to sources.

Police say Mamunul was one of the nstigators of these acts of violence.

On April 3, Mamunul was confined by locals and Awami League men in a resort in Narayanganj, along with a woman who he claimed to be his second wife.

A group of Hefajat leaders and activists then blocked the Dhakahighway, Chattogram staged demonstrations, vandalised vehicles and ransacked the resort.

Six cases were filed against Mamunul and Hefajat supporters following the vandalism. Since then, he had taken shelter at the madrasa to avoid arrest. While staying there, he went live on Facebook and made posts on the social media platform several times.

Meanwhile, law enforcers beefed up security measures in Brahmanbaria town and its outskirts following Mamunul's arrest, reports Brahmanbaria correspondent. Over the last seven days, law enforcers arrested eight central leaders of Hefajat, and made them accused in cased filed over the 2013 Hefajat mayhem. On May 5, 2013, thousands of Hefajat members clashed with law enforcers and AL men, turning Motijheel and Paltan areas into battlefields. A total of 83 cases were filed in seven districts, including Dhaka, accusing 3,416 named and 84,796 unnamed people. Many of the accused were from Hefajat, Jamaat-e-Islami and the BNP. Police have pressed charges in 18 cases and given final reports in two other cases. Investigation reports in 62 other cases are yet to be submitted to court. Law enforcers recently sped up he pace of investigation and started arresting Hefajat leaders following the government's green signal, say sources. AL insiders said Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina was irked by Hefajat's violent protests against Modi's visit on March 26 -- the day of celebration of the golden jubilee of the country's independence. Talking to The Daily Star, AL Presidium Member and agriculture minister Dr Abdur Razzaque said the government is very annoved by Hefajat's anti-state activities and acts of violence "We will handle them with an iron fist like we did in case of the antiliberation element Jamaat in the past. "What they are doing in the name of a religion is totally unacceptable. The government will not spare them,' said the senior AL leader. Hefajat first appeared on the scene n 2009 by protesting a draft national women development policy that provided equal inheritance rights to vomen. Things changed after the 2013 mayhem at Shapla Chattar, and Shafi and the AL government got closer. But a faction of Hefajat, led by Junayed Babunagari, was totally against the outfit's "soft approach" towards the government, according to several Hefajat leaders. Babunagari was declared Hefajat ameer in November, about two months after Shafi's death. Soon after the formation of the new committee, Hefajat hogged the headlines as it strongly opposed the construction of Bangabandhu's sculpture in the capital and gave antigovernment statements.

Eight family members killed in Afghanistan mosque shooting

Eight members of the same family were gunned down in an attack on a mosque in eastern Afghanistan, officials said yesterday.

The shooting happened on Saturday night in the city of Jalalabad in Nangarhar province, and was believed to be over a land dispute, the province's governor Zaiulhaq Amarkhil said.

Five brothers and three of their male cousins were killed.

"The incident is under investigation but initial information shows a land dispute has caused the incident," Amarkhil told AFP.

Fareed Khan, a spokesman for Nangarhar police, confirmed the attack.

Afghanistan, like the rest of the Muslim world, is observing the holy month of Ramadan, when men gather every night to offer special prayers after fasting for the day.

Revenge killings are common in Afghanistan, where families seek justice by carrying out violent acts of vengeance based on an ancient code of honour.

So-called blood feuds can last for decades, passing down through generations in a cycle of violence.

Greek police have dismantled a migrant trafficking network accused of abducting and torturing two people, the Athens News Agency reported yesterday.
