# COVID-19'TSUNAMI' IN INDIA Unnecessary rush to hospitals a problem

Says WHO; relatives scramble for drugs Agencies

People in India are rushing unnecessarily to hospital, exacerbating a crisis over surging Covid-19 infections caused by mass gatherings, more contagious variants and low vaccination rates, the World Health Organization (WHO) said yesterday.

India's death toll is now pushing towards 200,000, and hospitals that do not have enough oxygen supplies and beds are turning away patients. Less than 15% of people infected with Covid-19 actually need hospital

care and even fewer will need oxygen, WHO spokesman Tarik Jasarevic said.

"Currently, part of the problem is that many people rush to the hospital (also because they do not have access to information/advice), even though home-based care monitoring at home can be managed very safely,' Jasarevic said

Community-level centres should screen and triage patients and provide advice on safe home care, while information is also made available via hotlines or dashboards, he said.

India is also facing severe shortages of medical supplies, with hospitals and crematoriums overwhelmed.

Manish Aggarwal celebrates with weary relief after laying his hands on precious doses of Covid-19 medication for his sick father -- a victory where thousands across India have not been so lucky.

He has been waiting in line outside a small pharmacy in Delhi for eight hours to secure remdesivir, and is rewarded with just two of the recommended six doses.

In the same queue are more than 100 people with loved ones in hospital. Only 30 people receive the medicine. As evening falls and the medical supplier shuts up his shop, some people outside start crying.

"This government has failed us so much that those who can normally survive also die," says an exhausted Vinod Kumar, who has been waiting since 6 am but coudn't get the medicine.

About Hefajat's funding and donor, Md Asaduzzaman, deputy commissioner (Motijheel division) of DB police, told The Daily Star that Hefajat leaders used to collect the funds from the donors for madrasa purpose. But they did not get any papers or documents where and how the funds were spent, he added.

He said, "We are now investigating to know how the funds were spent." "We are also checking the background and sources of income of these donors and purpose of giving the funds to Hefajat," said the DC.

Regarding the transaction, DB Additional Commissioner Hafiz Akter said they have traced over Tk 6 crore transaction in two bank accounts of Mamunul, joint secretary general of the now defunct committee of the Qawmi madrasa-based organisation.

One of his account details shows that over 47 lakh has been transacted, he said while talking to reporters at his office yesterday.

Police are now verifying the source of the money, said the DB chief.

Mamunul is now in DB police custody on a 10-day remand in two cases.

Later, they created an anarchy at father in the evening. through transforming Hefajat like the Hathazari madrasa in Chattogram, where the Hefajat is based, and drove away Hefajat leaders loyal to Shafi, said the DB chief.

Police Bureau of Investigation (PBI) also submitted an investigation report to the chief judicial magistrate court in Chattogram on April 12, accusing Babunagari and some other Hefajat leaders. But the PBI dropped Mamunul's name from the report, according to a copy The Daily Star obtained.

#### TARGET FOUR DISTRICTS

Following a crackdown against top leaders of Hefajat, law enforcers are now preparing a list of instigators of violence after analysing CCTV footage.

Anwar Hossain, deputy inspector general (DIG) of Chattogram range, told this paper yesterday that they were preparing a list, including students and teachers of different madrasas, who took part in the violence after analysing the footage.

"We have verified around 70 to 80 suspects' identities, whose names mentioned in the first information report (FIR) for violence in Chattogram. We may be able to say clearly about the list after the investigation," the DIG added.

On the other hand, a highlyplaced source said police have now kept leaders of Hefajat's now defunct coordinating interrogation, said committee dealing with financial issues under surveillance and they would be arrested anytime over the Pakistan to enforce misappropriation of funds that came from abroad.

### SIX MORE HELD

As part of the ongoing crackdown against Hefajat men involved in the three-day mayhem from March 26 in different parts of the country, especially in Brahmanbaria, police on Monday arrested six more Hefajat leaders and activists from the district. Of the six arrestees, Md Obaidullah, secretary of the organisation's Ashuganj upazila unit, was held for his alleged involvement in violence in the upazila.

He is the principal of a madrasa in Ashuganj and the khatib of Boro Masjid in Ashuganj Bazar.

Ashuganj Police Station Officerin-Charge Jabed Mahmud said Obaidullah was sent to jail yesterday through a local court.

#### **20 STUDENTS EXPELLED**

Al Jamia Al Islamia Al Eunusiya Madrasa on Monday expelled 20 students for allegedly taking part in March 26's mayhem in Brahmanbaria.

The madrasa, locally called "Boro Madrasa", took the action amid the ongoing drive being conducted by the law enforcers to arrest those involved in the incident, reports our Brahmanbaria correspondent.

### EU lawmakers debate Brexit accord before decisive vote **REUTERS**, Brussels

EU lawmakers debated the post-Brexit trade agreement between the European Union and Britain for the last time yesterday, ahead of a vote that is expected to give the accord overwhelming approval. That should be the final step towards

ratification of the trade and cooperation deal, struck in December after more than four years of acrimonious negotiations and lingering mistrust as Britain ended 47 years of EU membership.

"This is a divorce. It is a warning, Brexit. It's a failure of the European Union and we have to learn lessons from it," the EU's chief Brexit negotiator, Michel Barnier, told lawmakers, who gave him a standing ovation for his work.

The accord crafted in the last days of 2020 only took force provisionally until the end of April, pending approval from the European Parliament. Lawmakers will vote late on Tuesday, with the outcome made public today morning.

There is no doubt that they will back

the deal, after assembly committees earlier cleared it by 108 votes to 1. If they did not, EU-UK ties would fall back to basic WTO

terms, with quotas and tariffs. Even with a trade deal, British exports to the EU fell by 47% in January-February and imports by 20%, far more than the declines

for any other EU trading partner. However, there had been some doubt the vote would go ahead as parliament protested against British changes to trading arrangements in Northern Ireland, a move that prompted Brussels to launch legal action.

Once parliament has given its consent, the 27 EU countries are expected to rubberstamp the deal. The bloc will then inform Britain and the trade agreement will be formally concluded.

The lawmakers are also voting on a 17page accompanying resolution that calls Brexit a "historic mistake". The text says parliament regrets the limited scope of the deal, which lacks cooperation on foreign policy or student exchanges, and notes that opportunities for Britain's largely servicebased economy are "vastly reduced.

US SC to take up gun rights case AFP, Washington

The US Supreme Court agreed on Monday to hear a challenge backed by the gun lobby to a New York law that restricts the carrying of firearms outside the home.

It will be the first major case involving the Second Amendment constitutional right to bear arms heard by the nation's highest court in more than a decade.

The case will be argued before a Supreme Court with a 6-3 conservative majority and comes amid a gun control push by President Joe Biden in the wake of several mass shootings.

A more than centuryold New York law currently requires someone applying for a permit to carry a gun outside the home to establish "proper cause."

The suit to be heard by the Supreme Court was brought by two men who were denied permits to carry handguns for self-defense.

The SC agreed to hear the case in its October term.

The court said it would limit arguments to the question: "Whether the state's denial of petitioners' applications for concealed-carry licenses for self-defense violated the Second Amendment."

The Second Amendment to the Constitution is subject to various interpretations.

It reads: "A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall

not be infringed." For the National Rifle Association and many gun owners, it guarantees the rights of citizens to carry weapons.

In a landmark case in 2008, the SC ruled that the Second Amendment ensured the right to have a gun at home and left it up to cities and states to set their own rules on carrying

firearms outside the home. There were more than 43,000 gun-related deaths in the United States last vear, including suicides, according to the Gun Violence Archive.

A high official of an intelligence agency said they were now finalising the instigators' list in four districts Chattogram, Narayanganj, Brahmanbaria and Munshiganj. Once the list is completed, leaders and supporters of Hefajat from the four districts would face arrest, said the official.

Sources in Police Headquarters said around 142 cases were filed and over 879 people, mostly Hefajat supporters, were arrested for the violence that took place between March 26 and 28. police Meanwhile, rescued Mamunul's "second wife" Jannat Ara Jharna from a house in the capital's Basila area yesterday.

Police rescued Jannat after her father filed a general diary with Kalabagan Police Station in this regard.

Pakistani troops have been deployed in 16 major cities to assist civilian authorities in enforcing measures meant to curb the spread of the coronavirus, including the wearing of masks in public and the closing of non-essential businesses after 6pm.

"Starting at 6am this (Monday) morning, troops have been sent to aid the civilian administration in each district," military spokesperson Major General Babar Iftikhar said.

Pakistan has recorded 17,187 deaths and 800,452 cases so far, and is in the midst of a third wave.

The federal government has opted not to impose nationwide lockdowns seen in some other countries, saying such measures could endanger the lives of many who rely on daily

wages.

One in seven pregnancies worldwide ends in miscarriage, and eleven percent of women endure a failed pregnancy at least once in their lifetime, experts said yesterday. Some 23 million

miscarriages occur every year, according to data pieced together from around the globe by an international team of 31 researchers.

But the actual tally is sure to be "substantially higher" due to underreporting, they said in a trio of studies published in The Lancet. Two percent of women -- one in 50 -- have experienced two miscarriages, while less that one percent have been through three or more.
