Unnecessary rush to hospitals a problem

Says WHO; relatives scramble for drugs

People in India are rushing unnecessarily to hospital, exacerbating a crisis over surging Covid-19 infections caused by mass gatherings, more contagious variants and low vaccination rates, the World Health Organization (WHO) said yesterday.

India's death toll is now pushing towards 200,000, and hospitals that do not have enough oxygen supplies and beds are turning away patients.

Less than 15% of people infected with Covid-19 actually need hospital care and even fewer will need oxygen, WHO spokesman Tarik Jasarevic said.

"Currently, part of the problem is that many people rush to the hospital (also because they do not have access to information/advice), even though home-based care monitoring at home can be managed very safely," Jasarevic said.

Community-level centres should screen and triage patients and provide advice on safe home care, while information is also made available via hotlines or dashboards, he said.

India is also facing severe shortages of medical supplies, with hospitals and crematoriums overwhelmed.

Manish Aggarwal celebrates with weary relief after laying his hands on precious doses of Covid-19 medication for his sick father -- a victory where thousands across India have not been so lucky.

He has been waiting in line outside a small pharmacy in Delhi for eight hours to secure remdesivir, and is rewarded with just two of the recommended six doses.

In the same queue are more than 100 people with loved ones in hospital. Only 30 people receive the medicine. As evening falls and the medical supplier shuts up his shop, some people outside start crying.

"This government has failed us so much that those who can normally survive also die," says an exhausted Vinod Kumar, who has been waiting since 6 am but couldn't get the medicine.

313 identified as Hefajat's donors

Meanwhile, police sources said Mamunul Haque, who is now on remand, told that Hefajat wanted to turn Bangladesh into a country like Pakistan or Afghanistan through transforming the organisation into militant group Tehrik-e-Labbaik Pakistan.

About Hefajat's funding and donors, Md Asaduzzaman, deputy commissioner (Motiheel division) of DB police, told The Daily Star that Hefajat leaders used to collect the funds from the donors for madrasa purposes. But they did not get any papers or documents where and how the funds were spent, he added.

He said, "We are now investigating to know how the funds were spent."

"We are also checking the background and sources of income of these donors and purpose of giving the funds to Hefajat," said the DC.

Regarding the transaction, DB Additional Commissioner Hafiz Akter said they have traced over Tk 6 crore transaction in two bank accounts of Mamunul, joint secretary general of the now defunct committee of the Qawmi madrasa-based organisation.

One of his account details shows that over 47 lakh has been transacted, he said while talking to reporters at his office yesterday.

Police are now verifying the source of the money, said the DB chief.

Mamunul is now in DB police custody on a 10-day remand in two cases.

DC Asaduzzaman, who is coordinating the interrogation, said police queried about the funds and Mamunul replied that the funds were for madrasas and mosques. But he failed to show any proof or documents that the funds were spent for madrasas, the DB official added.

The police officer said Mamunul was asked why madrasa funds came to his personal account when madrasas have separate accounts to receive donations. "Mamunul failed to give any specific answer in the connection."

Sources said around 21 Hefajat leaders and supporters have been arrested by DB police so far. Eight of them are now on remand.

In another development, DMP Additional Commissioner (DB) Hafiz Akter said some Hefajat leaders, including Mamunul, former Dhaka city unit president Junaid Al Habib and Maulana Khaled Saifullah Ayubi,

met at the wedding programme of then secretary general Junayed Babunagari's son and planned to remove its former ameer Shah Ahmad Shafi.

Later, they created an anarchy at Hathazari madrasa in Chattogram, where the Hefajat is based, and drove away Hefajat leaders loyal to Shafi, said the DB chief.

Police Bureau of Investigation (PBI) submitted an investigation report to a Chattogram court on April 12, accusing Babunagari and some other Hefajat leaders of "creating an atmosphere that hastened Shafi's death".

But the PBI later dropped Mamunul's name from the report, according to a copy The Daily Star obtained.

FOUR DISTRICTS

Following a crackdown against top Hefajat leaders, law enforcers are now preparing a list of instigators of violence after analysing CCTV footage.

Anwar Hossain, deputy inspector general (DIG) of Chattogram range, told this paper yesterday that they were preparing a list, including names of students and teachers of different madrasas, who took part in the violence after analysing the footage.

"We have verified around 70 to 80 suspects' identities, whose names have been mentioned in the first information report (FIR) for violence in Chattogram. We may be able to say clearly about the list after the investigation," the DIG added.

On the other hand, a highly-placed source said police have now kept leaders of Hefajat's now defunct committee dealing with financial issues under surveillance and they would be arrested anytime over the misappropriation of funds that came from abroad.

A high official of an intelligence agency said they were now finalising the instigators' list in four districts -- Chattogram, Narayaniganj, Brahmanbaria and Munshiganj. Once the list is done, Hefajat men from the four districts would face arrest, said the official.

Sources in Police Headquarters said around 142 cases were filed and over 879 people, mostly Hefajat supporters, were arrested for the violence that took place between March 26 and 28.

Meanwhile, police found Mamunul's "second wife" Jannat Ara Jharna in a house in the capital's Basila area yesterday.

Police conducted the drive after her father filed a general diary with

Kalabagan Police Station.

Jannat was handed over to her father in the evening.

SIX MORE HELD

As part of the ongoing crackdown against Hefajat men involved in the three-day mayhem from March 26 in different parts of the country, especially in Brahmanbaria, police on Monday arrested six more Hefajat leaders and activists from the district.

Of the six arrestees, Md Obaidullah, secretary of the organisation's Ashuganj upazila unit, was held for his alleged involvement in violence in the upazila.

He is the principal of a madrasa in Ashuganj and the khatib of Boro Masjid in Ashuganj Bazar.

Ashuganj Police Station Officer-in-Charge Javed Mahmud said Obaidullah was sent to jail yesterday after he was produced before a local court.

STUDENTS EXPELLED

Al Jamia Al Islamia Al Eunusiya Madrasa on Monday expelled 20 students for allegedly taking part in March 26's mayhem in Brahmanbaria.

The madrasa, locally called "Boro Madrasa", took the action amid the ongoing drive being conducted by the law enforcers to arrest those involved in the incident, reports our Brahmanbaria correspondent.

COVID-19 CRISIS

Army deployed in Pakistan to enforce rules

Pakistani troops have been deployed in 16 major cities to assist civilian authorities in enforcing measures meant to curb the spread of the coronavirus, including the wearing of masks in public and the closing of non-essential businesses after 6pm.

"Starting at 6am this (Monday) morning, troops have been sent to aid the civilian administration in each district," military spokesperson Major General Babar Ifukhar said.

Pakistan has recorded 17,187 deaths and 800,452 cases so far, and is in the midst of a third wave.

The federal government has opted not to impose nationwide lockdowns seen in some other countries, saying such measures could endanger the lives of many who rely on daily wages.

Study: 1 in 10 women experience miscarriage

One in seven pregnancies worldwide ends in miscarriage, and eleven percent of women endure a failed pregnancy at least once in their lifetime, experts said yesterday.

Some 23 million miscarriages occur every year, according to data pieced together from around the globe by an international team of 31 researchers.

But the actual tally is sure to be "substantially higher" due to underreporting, they said in a trio of studies published in The Lancet.

Two percent of women -- one in 50 -- have experienced two miscarriages, while less than one percent have been through three or more.

Deen Mohammad, also the founder of City Bank, breathed his last at Anwer Khan Modern Hospital around 1:00am due to old age complications and Covid-19 infection.

The noted businessman left behind his wife, one son, two daughters, and a host of relatives and well-wishers to mourn his death.

He had been admitted to different hospitals in the city at different times due to his age-related complications earlier. Later, he was admitted to Sikder Medical College and Hospital after he got infected with Covid-19.

Three days back, he was admitted to Anwer Khan Modern Hospital where he was tested Covid-19 negative, said his son Mohammad Shoeb over the phone. "My father had a heart problem and he had a bypass operation in 1992. He was very strong but the coronavirus left irreparable damage to his lung. And he could not make it after he suffered from two strokes," said Shoeb.

Deen Mohammad, who was also involved with many socio-cultural organisations, was buried at Lalbagh Shahi Mosque premises after his namaz-e-janaza at the mosque after Zohr prayers, followed by another janaza in Shyamoli.

Born on August 3, 1938, in Dhaka's Lalbagh area, Deen Mohammad was a man on a mission.

His mission had started in 1960 through hardware business with only Pakistani Rs 5,000 he got from his father.

Later, he established himself in the business arena both in the country and abroad.

In continuation of his success, he had established one after various business organisations and had created employment for thousands of people.

He was the founder chairman of Phoenix Group of Industries, which is associated with Phoenix Textile Mills Ltd, Phoenix Spinning Mills Ltd, Phoenix Fabrics Ltd, and Eastern Dyeing and Calendaring Works Ltd.

Today Phoenix Group has nearly 20,000 employees, according to Shoeb.

Deen Mohammad had served as chairman of the PCL between 2000 and 2006 and was also the founder chairman of and director of The City Bank Ltd, Phoenix Finance and Investment Ltd, and Phoenix Securities Limited.

He was the proprietor of Apollo Steel and a partner in the real estate company Rupayan Group.

He had earned a huge name and fame in the business community for his honesty, integrity, dedication, hard work, and a high degree of sense of responsibility.

Known as one of the native traders of Dhaka, his experience expanded in

time and reflects through his successful works that played a leading role in the development of industrialisation and the economy of the country.

He was a lifelong member of Dhaka Club Ltd, Gulshan Club Ltd, Uttara Club, and Rotary Club.

Deen Mohammad was awarded various awards and medals at home and abroad. He was honoured with Maulana Akram Khan Gold Medal and Jagadish Chandra Gold Medal.

He was awarded Business Initiative Directions (BID) by a Spanish-based business firm.

His founding Phoenix Finance and Investments Limited was awarded the International Award (ISAQ).

Deen Mohammad will be remembered always through his contribution to trade and commerce, job creation, and industrialisation in the country.

Following his death, different business organisations including the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI), political and cultural personalities expressed deep shock and extended condolence to his bereaved family members.

"We have lost a guardian. He was never talked to us with an angry voice and had always been caring about the benefits of employees," said Rafiqur Rahman, deputy managing director and secretary of Phoenix Insurance.
