Meanwhile, 25 people have died from Covid-19 during the 24 hours ending at 8:00am yesterday, according to a press release from the DGHS.

The total number of deaths from the virus is now 12,149 and the death rate stands at 1.56 percent.

At least 363 new infections were recorded, taking the total number of people infected to 7,80,159.

The positivity rate was 6.69 percent. A total of 5,430 samples were tested across the country in the 24 hours.

At least 601 Covid-19 patients recovered during this period. The total number of recoveries now

stands at 7,22,036 and the recovery rate is at 92.55 percent. Among the 25 deceased, 18 were

men and seven women. Two were between 31 and 40 years old; four between 41 and 50; six between 51 and 60; and 13 were above 60 years

## Bangladesh urges UNSC to act

Bangladesh has urged the UN Security Council to take up the issue of violence and breach of security in the occupied land of Palestine and work for a durable solution to the Israel-Palestine conflict.

"Bangladesh believes in a comprehensive and durable solution to the Palestinian issue in accordance with the relevant UN resolutions, the Arab Peace Initiative, and the Quarter Road Map," said Foreign Minister AK Abdul Momen at an open-ended meeting of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) Executive Committee held virtually yesterday.

The meeting was convened in response to the repeated attacks of a "terrorist nature" by the Israeli occupation forces on the innocent civilians in Al-Quds Al Shareef, bombing on the Al-Aqsa mosque compound followed by attacks on worshippers, and the eviction of Palestinian families in the Sheikh Jarrah neighborhood, said the foreign ministry in a statement.

Momen said there is no pretext that can justify killings of innocent civilians, disruption of prayer by the worshippers, and breach of international humanitarian laws and human rights standards.

and deep condolences to the victims of the recent atrocities.

The foreign minister mentioned Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's letter to the President of Palestine, saying, 'I take this opportunity to reiterate Bangladesh's unflinching commitmentin realising the inalienable rights of the brotherly people of Palestine for an independent homeland and a sovereign and viable State of Palestine based on the 1967 borders with East Jerusalem as its capital."

In the meeting, Bangladesh endorsed the statement of the OIC group at the United Nations and agreed with the suggestion made in the statement of resumption of the 10th Emergency Special Session of the General Assembly if the Security Council fails to uphold its responsibility.

The minister also urged all the UN member states to stand strong and work for the betterment of humanity.

Rohingya leader

Alleged robbers gunned down a Rohingya community leader at Lambersia refugee camp in Ukhia upazila of Cox's Bazar on Saturday evening.

Majhi (community Swakat Hossain, 45, was of Block-D of the camp, said Naimul Haque, superintendent of police (SP) of Arms Police Battalion (APBn) -14.

Witnesses said armed robbers went to a temporary cloth shop inside Lambersia camp around 4:00pm on Saturday.

They shot Swakat several times and fired shots in the air to create panic and leave, they said.

Swakat was taken to an IOM operated medical facility in critical condition and then to Cox's Bazar General Hospital where he declared dead on arrival.

SP Naimul said there were several bullet injuries on the upper part of the

Deaths mount in Gaza

rockets had been fired from the coastal strip towards Israel, the highest rate ever recorded.

Israel's Iron Dome anti-missile system had intercepted over a thousand rockets, the army said, in almost a week during which Israeli residential buildings have been hit, with over 500 people wounded.

"The intensity of the conflict is something we have not seen before, with non-stop airstrikes in densely populated Gaza and rockets reaching big cities in Israel," said the International Committee of the Red Cross.

"As a result, children are dying on both sides."

Two children were among the 10 killed in Israel.

Pope Francis said the violence risked degenerating further "into a spiral of death and destruction" and said: "Where will hatred and revenge lead? Do we really think we will build peace by destroying the other?" The bloodiest military conflict in

seven years has also sparked a wave of inter-communal violence and mob attacks between Jews and Arab-Israelis, as well as deadly clashes in the occupied West Bank, where 19 Palestinians have been killed since last Monday.

The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) said it had targeted the infrastructure of Hamas and Islamic Jihad, including by pounding a vast tunnel system with some 100 strikes, and by targeting weapon factories and storage sites.

Israeli air strikes also hit the home of Yahya Sinwar, head of Hamas'

political wing in the Gaza Strip, the army said, releasing a video showing plumes of smoke and intense damage, but without saying if he was killed.

At least 58 children have lost

their lives in Gaza, more than 1,200 people have been reported wounded and entire buildings and city blocks reduced to rubble. The IDF says it takes all possible

precautions to avoid harming civilians and has blamed Hamas for deliberately placing military targets in densely populated areas. One strike on Gaza killed 10

members of an extended family. The children "didn't carry weapons, they didn't fire rockets", said Mohammad al-Hadidi, one of the grieving fathers.

Some 10,000 Gazans have fled their homes near the Israeli border for fear of a ground offensive, the UN said. "They are sheltering in schools,

mosques and other places during global Covid-19 pandemic with limited access to water, food, hygiene and health services," UN humanitarian official Lynn Hastings said. The UN Security Council was due to
