Agri project director killed in road crash

Driver lost control of the vehicle that hit a tree in Sirajganj

A project director of Bangladesh Agriculture Development Corporation was killed in a road accident in Sirajganj yesterday morning while on the way to a meeting in the capital.

Another BADC official and the

driver of the vehicle were injured in the incident.

The deceased, Sazzad Hossain Bhuiyan, was the executive engineer of BADC Pabna and also the project director of an irrigation and agriculture development project in Pabna, Natore and Sirajganj districts.

He was coming to the capital in his official vehicle to join a meeting.

Officer-in-charge of Shahzadpur Police Station Shahed Mahamud Khan said when the vehicle reached Parkola area around 9:00am, the driver lost control and the vehicle ran

The injured were taken to Khwaza

Yunus Ali Medical College and Hospital.

Md Sajahan, officer-in-charge of Hatikumrul Highway Police Station, said highway police recovered the body from the spot and sent it to the Sirajganj General Hospital morgue for autopsy.

The official vehicle was taken to Hatikumrul Highway Police Station and a general diary was filed in connection with the incident.

Talking to The Daily Star, Md Rakib Al Kadir, assistant engineer of BADC, Pabna said the project director and the additional engineer were going to Dhaka to join an official meeting at the BADC headquarters.

The project director was going to the capital through Sirajganj so that he could visit BADC's Sirajganj project on the way.

After autopsy, his body will be taken to the Sirajganj BADC office, from where the body will be sent to BADC headquarters in the capital,

PFIZER VACCINE GETS APPROVAL Meanwhile, the Directorate General

of Drug Administration (DGDA) has issued emergency use authorisation to the Pfizer mRNA Covid-19 vaccine in the country yesterday, said a press release signed by Maj Gen Md Mahbubur Rahman, director general of DGDA.

Produced by Pfizer Manufacturing Belgium NV, this is the fourth Covid vaccine approved for emergency use in Bangladesh after AstraZeneca's Covishield, Russia's Sputnik V and Sinopharm's BBIBP-CorV.

DU authorities have beefed up security

50 officials transferred from Rab to police units

The Police Headquarters yesterday transferred 50 officials, including 10 of the rank of additional superintendent of police, from Rapid Action Battalion to different units of police.

According to the transfer order, signed by Inspector General of Police Benazir Ahmed, the officials have to hand over charges by June 3, else they will be considered stand released the following day.

The 50 have been transferred to various units of district police, Police Bureau of Investigation, and metropolitan police.

The transfer order came two days after the home ministry on May 25 suspended two police officials of the ranks of superintendent of police and assistant SP following the leak of their alleged phone conversation regarding police and Rab.

5 Bangladeshis arrested in Bengaluru

Police in the Indian city of Bengaluru said they arrested five Bangladeshis, four men and a woman, yesterday over the rape and torture of a young woman who they also believed to be from Bangladesh.

Footage of the incident has gone viral on social media over the last few days.

Police in Bangladesh said they dentified the victim and one of the perpetrators as Bangladeshi and that they were not officially told about the

Mohiul Islam, assistant inspector general of National Central Bureau (NCB) told The Daily Star last night that they could not confirm if the rest were Bangladeshi.

Two cases under the human trafficking act and the pornography act have been filed with Hatiriheel Police Station over this incident, Tejgaon Division Deputy Commissioner Md Shahidullah said.

Covid cases fall for 2nd straight day

1,292 infected, 22 die in a day

The number of Covid-19 cases continued to decline for the second consecutive day yesterday. In the past 24 hours till 8:00am

resterday, a total of 1,292 people were tested positive for the viral infection in the country. On the previous day, a total of 1,497

new cases were detected, according to the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS).

With the latest figure, the total number of Covid-19 confirmed cases rose to 794,985 in the country.

In the same 24 hours, a total of 22 people have died with Covid-19, up from 17 deaths of the previous day.

With this, the total number of deaths reached 12,480, and the death rate at

1.57 percent. Meanwhile, the positivity rate has

also continued to decline for the second consecutive day yesterday.

DU proctor, said, "The main areas where drugs are sold are Suhrawardy Udyan, Shaheed Minar, and Curzon Hall. We have already instructed police to carry out strict operations to stop the sale of narcotics... We are working to uproot the drug syndicate. campus from Brahmanbaria the day after Eid. That night, Hafizur took drugs with his friends at Curzon Hall. A few hours later, police found him

with his throat slit in the Shaheed Minar area and sent him to Dhaka Medical College Hospital. Citing information provided by

his friends during interrogation, DB officials said Hafizur had misbehaved with a disabled rickshaw-puller that evening. After his friends told him what he did was wrong, he ran out to the Curzon Hall field, despite his friends' attempt to stop him, to beg the rickshaw-puller for forgiveness.

At one point, Hafizur grabbed a sharp weapon from a coconut-seller nearby and slit his own throat.
