Hundreds of former leaders urge G7

hundred presidents, prime ministers and foreign ministers have urged the Group of Seven (G7) rich nations to pay global coronavirus vaccinations to help stop the virus mutating and returning as a worldwide threat.

The leaders made their appeal ahead of a G7 summit in England which begins on Friday, when US President Joe Biden will meet the leaders of Britain, France, Germany, Canada and Japan.

In their letter to the G7, the former world leaders said global cooperation had failed in 2020, but that 2021 could usher in a new era.

"Support from G7 and G20 that makes vaccines readily accessible to low- and middle-income countries is not an act of charity, but rather is in every country's strategic interest," the letter said.

Among the signatories were ex-British premiers Gordon Brown and Tony Blair, former UN Secretary General Ban-Ki Moon and 15 former African leaders



Free political prisoners, follow agreement Regional envoys urge Myanmar junta; Suu

Kyi to go on trial next week

Envoys from the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (Asean) called on Myanmar's junta to free all political prisoners and discussed implementing a regional "consensus" to end turmoil since the February 1 coup, the regional bloc said.

Myanmar's junta has shown little sign of heeding April's five-point agreement among the 10 Asean countries, including Myanmar, which calls for an end to violence, political talks and the naming of a regional special envoy.

The Asean envoys met junta leader Min Aung Hlaing in Myanmar's capital, Naypyidaw, on Friday.

The Asean statement dated June 5 said the objective of the visit was to discuss how Myanmar would reach "a peaceful solution in the interests of its people" by implementing the five points.

It said they had also "called for the lease of all political prisoners, including women and children and foreigners" - an this week. The junta's foreign minister, appeal that was not on the consensus but is supported by many Asean members.

Reuters was unable to reach a junta spokesman for comment.

The state-run Global New Light of Myanmar said the meeting covered "implementation of the recommendation of initial survey of Asean" and "terror acts" by junta opponents and the army's plan to hold elections.

The junta has failed to impose control

since seizing power from elected leader Aug San Suu Kyi, who is among more than 4,500 people detained since the coup. At least 849 ĥave been killed, a rights group says. The army disputes that figure.

Opponents of the junta have voiced frustration at the lack of tough action by Asean. Myanmar's crisis is also expected to be a topic at a special Asean-Chinese



Wunna Maung Lwin, will also attend.

Suu Kyi will go on trial next week, her lawyer said yesterday, with the Nobel laureate facing an eclectic raft of charges, from possessing unlicensed walkie-talkies to flouting coronavirus restrictions during elections last year.

"We will get testimonies from plaintiffs and witnesses starting from next hearing," lawyer Min Min Soe said after meeting her in the capital Naypyidaw.

Putin signs law exiting the pact

President Vladimir Putin yesterday signed legislation formalising withdrawal from the Open Skies security treaty after Washington quit the key post-Cold War defence accord last year.

announced Moscow in mid-January it was leaving the treaty that allows signatories to carry out unarmed surveillance flights over each others' territories. It cited a "lack of progress" on maintaining the treaty after the United States withdrew last year.

document formalising Russia's decision was published on a government website yesterday morning.

The decision Russian leader comes ahead of a highly anticipated summit between Putin and US President Joe Biden in Geneva next week.

Biden intially signalled his administration could reverse his predecessor's move to quit the accord, but then confirmed late last month Washington would not revisit the decision.

UYGHURS IN XINJIANG

China policies could cut millions of births

Chinese birth control policies could cut between 2.6 to 4.5 million births of the Uyghur and other ethnic minorities in southern Xinjiang within 20 years, up to a third of the region's projected minority population, according to a new analysis by a German researcher.

The report, shared exclusively with Reuters ahead of publication, also includes a previously unreported cache of research produced by Chinese academics and officials on Beijing's intent behind the birth control policies in Xinjiang, where official data shows birth-rates have already dropped by 48.7% between 2017 and 2019.

Adrian Zenz's research comes amid growing calls among some western countries for an investigation into whether China's actions in Xinjiang amount to genocide, a charge Beijing vehemently denies.

The research by Zenz is the first such peer reviewed analysis of the long-term population impact of Beijing's multi-year crackdown in the western region. Rights groups, researchers and some residents say the policies include newly enforced birth limits on Uyghur and other mainly Muslim ethnic minorities, the transfers of workers to other regions and the internment of an estimated one million Uyghurs and other ethnic minorities in a network of camps.

"This (research and analysis) really shows the intent behind the Chinese government's long-term plan for the Uyghur population,' Zenz told Reuters. The Chinese government has not made public any official target for reducing the proportion of Uyghur and other ethnic minorities in Xinjiang. But based on analysis of official birth data, demographic projections and ethnic ratios proposed by Chinese academics and officials, Zenz estimates Beijing's policies could increase the predominant Han Chinese population in southern Xinjiang to around 25% from 8.4% currently.

"This goal is only achievable if they do what they have been doing, which is drastically suppressing (Uyghur) birth rates," Zenz said.

Taliban demand 'remorse' from fearful interpreters

The Taliban said yesterday that Afghans who worked with foreign forces in the past have nothing to fear once international troops leave, as long as they "show remorse". Thousands of Afghans have received visas to live abroad after serving alongside US and Nato troops -- particularly as interpreters - but hundreds more are scrambling to leave before US President Joe Biden's September 11 withdrawal deadline. In recent weeks many interpreters have demonstrated in Kabul, demanding foreign forces and embassies that they worked with help them relocate. "They shall not be in any danger on our part," the Taliban said in a statement. "The Islamic Emirate would like to inform all the above people that they should show remorse for their past actions and must not engage in such activities in the future that amount to treason against Islam and the country."



Navalny transferred to prison after hunger strike

Jailed Kremlin critic Alexei Navalny has been transferred from a prison hospital back to his penal colony after receiving treatment following a hunger strike, his allies said yesterday. Navalny was jailed for two and a half years in February on old embezzlement charges he and his supporters say are politically motivated. He was sentenced shortly after returning to Russia from Germany, where he was receiving treatment for a near-fatal poisoning attack with a nerve agent. President . Vladimir Putin's most outspoken domestic critic declared a hunger strike in March to demand proper medical treatment for a growing list of health complaints.

Netanyahu alleges Israeli election fraud

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said on Sunday a newly formed Israeli coalition that is poised to unseat him was the result of "the greatest election fraud" in the history of democracy. Hours after Netanyahu's comments, Naftali Bennett, a nationalist set to replace him as prime minister, called on Israel's longestserving leader not to leave "scorched earth" behind and accept that "people are allowed to establish a government - even if you don't head it".Netanyahu made his sweeping accusation at a time when Israel's domestic security chief has warned publicly about the prospect of political

Nuke weapons spending swelled \$1.4b amid pandemic

Even as the pandemic raged and economies around the world were devastated, nucleararmed countries last year increased spending on atomic weapon arsenals by 1.4 billion dollars, campaigners said yesterday. In a fresh report, the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN) detailed how the world's nine nuclear-armed states continued to swell their spending on such weapons. "While hospital beds filled up with patients, doctors and nurses worked over hours and basic medical supplies ran scarce, nine countries found they had more than \$72 billion on hand for their weapons of mass destruction," the report said.


