Referring to negotiations underway in central Vienna between world powers and Tehran on the possible revival of the international 2015 deal on Iran's nuclear programme, Grossi said he hoped that by "wider general agreement that's being worked on downtown or by some other means, we are not going to see our... inspection capacities curtailed any more".
"We cannot limit and continue to curtail the ability of the inspectors to inspect and at the same time pretend that there is trust," he said.
He also referred to a long-running attempt by the IAEA to get clarity on several undeclared Iranian sites where nuclear activity may have taken place, mostly in the early 2000s.
In April the IAEA launched a new process of "technical discussions" with Iran in an effort to "break the impasse" over the sites.
But a report issued last week made clear that the IAEA's queries had not been resolved.
Grossi said yesterday that his "expectations were not met" and that there had been no "concrete progress" on the issue, despite the Iranian authorities' stated willingness

to cooperate.
"Talk must lead to conclusions," he said.
While stressing that the issue of the undeclared sites and the broader talks to revive the 2015 deal were not directly connected, Grossi underscored the importance of trust.
"This is where everything you do with any country is interconnected," he said.
"For me the road to trust goes through information, clarification, inspections and full transparency," he added.
Diplomats are hoping to conclude the talks on reviving the 2015 deal before Iran's presidential election on June 18.
The deal has been disintegrating ever since former US President Donald Trump dramatically withdrew from it in 2018 and went on to re-impose swingeing sanctions on Iran.
In retaliation Iran has been disregarding limits laid down in the deal on its nuclear activities.
Grossi reiterated yesterday that the situation in Iran was "serious".
"We have a country that has a very developed and ambitious nuclear programme which is enriching at very high levels... very close to weapons grade," he said.

train hit," Shahid, another passenger, told AFP.
The Millat Express was heading from Karachi to Lala Musa when it derailed, its carriages strewn over the tracks as the Sir Syed Express from Rawalpindi arrived minutes later in the opposite direction, smashing into it.
Most of the dead were pulled from the derailed train, officials said.
Umar Tufail, a senior Daharki police officer, said 43 people were killed and dozens injured.
A spokesman for Pakistan Railways put the toll at 33, but communications with the crash site were difficult because its remote location.
One rescue worker described having to stand on top of his vehicle to get a phone signal.
Local farmers and villagers were the first to join passengers in trying to pull survivors from the crumpled carriages, reaching into broken windows and roof hatches.
A clip aired on a local channel showed medics giving an intravenous drip to a conscious passenger whose lower torso was trapped between crushed carriage benches.
The dead were laid out in rows on train seat benches and covered in traditional scarves.

The accident happened on a raised section of track surrounded by lush farmlands.

"A director of a bank is taking money from another bank. There are allegations that money is being sent abroad through hundi."
He proposed that the ACC should have offices in Canada, Malaysia, Australia and others countries, saying many people having stashing illegal money and wealth there.
Another JP MP, Rowshan Ara Mannan, said banking and financial institutions have become like "tortured orphans in the absence of any caregiver" and said looting and corruption is taking place but no one is being punished for it.
In response, Mustafa Kamal said the government would enact 15 laws in the next one year for the reformation of the financial sector.
He said it also hurts him, like it hurts other, when hard-earned money of the countrymen is laundered abroad and he also wants this to stop.
"Money laundering has come down significantly. The situation is not like it was before. In the past, sand used to come in the name of cement. Under-invoicing, over-invoicing is not like before. I will not say it has completely stopped. But the number of such stories has decreased in newspapers," he said.
The finance minister said he did not know who took the money abroad. "I don't have a list of who took the money. Give us the names. It will be easier for us to do the job. Many are still in jail and being tried."
Kamal said that in past decade the interest rate on loans and the default rate were reduced. "In 2008, the total outstanding loan was 1.52 lakh crore, which has now increased eightfold to Tk 11.08 lakh crore."
He said that market capital now increased fivefold from Tk 1.04 lakh crore when the incumbent government took power. The daily average transaction was Tk 26 crore when the government first took power which has now increased 30 times.

The board then submitted a bill for reimbursement to the district accounts office attaching related purchase documents.
On June 28 last year, Dhaka-based daily Janabani and local daily Paschimanchal published reports highlighting the extreme irregularities in the purchasing process. The reports alleged that materials worth only Tk 2.75 crore were purchased. No medicine worth Tk 4.5 crore was purchased but a bill for that amount was submitted and disbursed, the reports stated.
Following the reports, Khulna's directorate of health on July 2 formed the three-member probe body to investigate the matter.
Meanwhile, after the news was published, Dr Shamim Kabir filed a case under the Digital Security Act against two journalists -- Ahsan Alam, a Chuadanga correspondent of daily Janabani, and Saif Jahan, correspondent of Paschimanchal -- with Chuadanga Sadar Police Station on July 1.
Both the journalists were granted bail by the High Court on July 8 in the case.
Dr Shamim was transferred to Jhenaidah as Jhenaidah Sadar upazila health and family planning officer, the Civil Surgeon's Office sources said.
According to the investigation committee, it checked the stock of medicines purchased at the civil surgeon's office and all related documents. It also interrogated the civil surgeon of Chuadanga, the former RMO of Chuadanga Sadar Hospital, four upazila health and family planning officers, accountants and other officials concerned.
Contacted, Civil Surgeon Dr Maruf and Dr Shamim said they would not comment as the matter was under investigation.

After returning home, she filed the case against 12 people, including Rifadul Islam Ridoy, 26, also known as Ridoy Babo on mobile app TikTok.
Talking to The Daily Star recently, the victim described the brutalities she endured for more than two months in India's Bengaluru and Chennai.
Earlier on June 2, a team of Hatirjheel police arrested three accused in the case. One of the arrestees -- Mehedi Hasan Babu -- admitted to investigators to have trafficked nearly 1,000 women to India in the last eight years.
After a video clip of a 22-year-old Bangladeshi woman being tortured and sexually assaulted went viral on social media, Indian police on May 27 arrested Ridoy and five other Bangladeshis in Bengaluru.
Bangladeshi law enforcers later identified the transnational trafficking racket which has around 50 members.
Following the incident of the video clip going viral, father of the victim filed another case with Hatirjheel Police Station under the human

trafficking act and pornography control act.
Investigators said three women, who returned home recently, and the 22-year-old victim were trafficked by the same racket.
On June 1, the Rapid Action Battalion arrested the "kingpin" of the racket, Ashraful Islam Rafi alias Boss Rafi, and his three associates from Jhenaidah Sadar and Abhaynagar upazilas and Benapole of Jashore.
Rafi was shown arrested in the case filed by the father of the 22-year-old victim.
The Rab said "TikTok Ridoy" was one of the main agents of Rafi with whom he met two years ago. They used the social media platform to entice girls with modelling contracts or well-paid jobs and trafficked nearly 50.
Rafi with the help of Ridoy trafficked the girls to the South Indian city of Bengaluru. The main purpose of trafficking women to India was to engage them in sex work, Rab added.
Indian police have so far arrested 12 people, mostly Bangladeshis, involved in the trafficking racket.

and have helped enforcement teams "immensely", said the police chief.
"Although we have 157 standard operating procedure (SOP) monitoring teams, they move from one location to another.
"This makes them unable to monitor every location at once, including detecting symptomatic individuals in public places," said Rohaimi.
The drones, based in Kuala Terengganu, were loaned to the state by a private company for police use throughout the enforcement of the full lockdown.
In April last year, Terengganu police also used drones to track the movements and temperatures of residents in Dungun during the movement control order (MCO).
Malaysia is currently in a "total lockdown" from Jun 1 until Jun 14 amid a third wave of Covid-19 cases.
As of Sunday, Malaysia has recorded a total of 616,815 cases and 3,378 deaths since the start of the pandemic.

While taking part in the discussion on cut motions, BNP MP Harunur Rashid said the economic sector was hit hard by corruption and that the stock market has fully laid down.
"If we speak the truth about the situation of the financial institutions, treasury bench members will start shouting. The finance sector is in devastating situation due to corruption."
He observed that what the finance minister said regarding the whitening of black and undisclosed money was contrary to the Prime Ministers declaration of zero tolerance against corruption.
He, however, said he supports allowing undisclosed money into the economy.
