Strict patrol to enforce lockdown

DMP says it'll will arrest anyone out on streets without emergency as weeklong lockdown begins

Law enforcers have been deployed on streets to make sure people stay indoors as the government starts enforcing a seven-day countrywide lockdown today to stem the surge in Covid-19 infections and deaths.

A sufficient number of armed forces personnel will also be on patrol, the Cabinet Division said in a gazette yesterday, adding that they would be aiding the members of police, Ansar, Rab and Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB). Meanwhile, the Dhaka Metropolitan Police has warned

that anyone found outside their home without emergencies

will be arrested during the strict lockdown. Those people will be arrested and cases will be filed against them under Section 269 of the penal code, DMP Commissioner Md Shafiqul Islam said during a press SEE PAGE 6 COL 3

Lawmakers blast health boss

Minister says 80pc population to be vaccinated by 2022 first quarter

Eighty percent people of the country will be vaccinated against Covid-19 within the first quarter of next year, Health Minister Zahid Maleque told parliament yesterday. While explaining, the minister said Bangladesh will get

6.3 crore vaccine shots within December under the Covax facility. "Besides, we will get seven crore doses of Johnson & Johnson vaccine and will be able to vaccinate seven crore

people with the jabs by the first quarter of next year," he In reply to opposition BNP and Jatiya Party lawmakers'


huge criticism against the health ministry's failure to ensure vaccine for the people, the minister said around 25 lakh shots of Moderna vaccine would reach the country on July 2-3. Chinese vaccines will also arrive by that time.

"Bangladesh has signed an agreement with Chinese Sinopharm to get 1.50 crore vaccine shots." He said, "The country will have a total stock of 10 crore

shots by December and we will be able to inoculate five crore people with the doses," the minister said. This is how the country will be able to inoculate 80 percent of its population against Covid-19 within the first

quarter of next year, the minister added.

Country logs highest Covid cases in a day

The health directorate yesterday reported the country's highest single-day Covid-19 cases of 8,822 and the secondhighest death toll.

The total number of confirmed cases now stands at 9,13,258, according to a press release of the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS).

With 115 deaths being recorded in the 24 hours till

8:00am yesterday, the country enters a new month with fresh cases and deaths trending upwards. Yesterday's death toll is second only to the 119 recorded

on June 27. As many as 1,809 people lost their lives in June -- the second-highest monthly death toll so far this year after the

2,400 Covid-19 fatalities in April. With the latest count, the total number of deaths from Covid-19 in the country reached 14,503 -- around 1.59 percent of all cases detected so far.

The DGHS also reported a positivity rate of 25.13 percent against 35,105 tests in the 24 hours -- the highest daily positivity rate since June 19.

Of the 115 deceased, 72 were men and 43 women. Nine died in their homes and the rest passed away in hospitals.

Khulna division saw the highest 30 deaths yesterday, followed by 23 each in Chattogram and Rajshahi divisions. Among other divisions, 17 died in Dhaka, 11 in Rangpur,

six in Mymensingh, three in Sylhet and two in Barishal. Since Covid-19 cases were first reported in the country on March 8 last year, Bangladesh saw the first peak in July 2020 and the second peak in November last year.
