Physical work to go on amid lockdown

Govt aims to complete those within fresh deadlines

The physical work of 18 major infrastructure projects under the road and rail sectors will continue amid the ongoing seven-day "strict lockdown" aiming to meet their fresh deadlines.

All but Padma Multipurpose Bridge Project are being

implemented with foreign funds. Deadlines of 15 of the projects have already been revised at least once. Officials involved with the projects said physical work

of almost all the projects remained halted for more than two months after the government had announced a "shutdown" in March last year to contain the spread of When the authorities were trying to revive the

momentum of the project works, a second wave of the pandemic hit the country in March this year, slowing down their progress. The government now wants to continue these major

projects, maintaining necessary health safety guidelines, the officials added

Unemployed, they have no option but to head back to village homes

Al-Amin worked at a metal ornament factory in the capital's Lalbagh area for 15 years. After the pandemic struck Bangladesh and the factory incurred losses due to a fall in sales, the factory had to eventually close down two weeks ago, leaving the 26-year-old unemployed.

"Since then, I have been searching for another job, but I am failing."

The sole earner in a family of five, Al-Amin lived with his family in a rented house at Tk 10,000 per month in the same area.

"After losing my job, had to take loans to clear the rent and run my family. As another lockdown has been enforced, there is no chance of me finding another job anytime soon. So, it is not possible for me to stay in Dhaka.'

EVIDENCE ACT

Experts laud govt move to scrap sub-section

Rights activists and legal experts welcomed Law Minister Anisul Huq's announcement about removing from the Evidence Act a provision allowing "negative" remarks about the character of a rape victim in a rape case.

The law minister on Thursday talked about removing Sub-section 155 (4) of the Evidence Act, 1872, which says: "When a man is prosecuted for rape or an attempt to ravish, it may be shown that the prosecutrix was of generally immora character.'

Those welcoming the decision said it will help the rape survivors who are routinely blamed and shamed in courts about their character, social class, attire, past sexual history, and lifestyle.

However, repealing sub-section 146 (3) of the Evidence Act is equally important, as, during cross-examination, a witness may be asked any question which tends to "shake his credit, by injuring his character".

Section 146 is often used against victims of rape and other sexual offences. Legal experts and rights activists said legal reform alone cannot help survivors to get justice.

Sensitising the public and legal channels to the plight of the victims is of utmost importance to change the mindset that judges a rape victim's testimony by the patriarchal standard of morality and

Yahya's plan a cruel joke: Muzaffar

NAP (WALI) REJECTS YAHYA'S CONSTITUTIONAL PLAN Muzaffar Ahmed, president

of the National Awami Party (Wali Group) rejected Yahya's plan to impose a government

of Islamabad's choice on the people of Bangladesh. Talking to newsmen, he said, "Yahya's so-called constitutional plan is a cruel joke perpetrated on the 75 million people of Bangladesh against whom he has let loose his armed hordes.

GP sued for using native bird in ad

A case was filed on Thursday against Grameenphone by Wildlife Crime Control Unit of the forest department for using an indigenous bird in their advertisement.

Nargis Sultana, inspector of WCCU, filed the case with Dhaka's Chief Judicial Magistrate Court under section 38(2), 41 and 46 of the Wildlife (Conservation and Security) Act-2012, reports our Bogura correspondent.

"Grameenphone Ltd used a rose-ring parakeet which is an indigenous bird. By showing this bird in a cage in their commercial advertisement, the mobile operator violated the aforesaid sections and inspired people to catch ingenious birds from nature, put them in cage and display them," she told The Daily

This advertisement went viral on social media. prompting people to criticise it and drew the WCCU's attention, said Sultana.

Largest comet ever seen is heading towards the Sun

An enormous asteroid from the outskirts of the solar system is heading towards the Sun.

Comet Bernardinelli-Bernstein is 1000 times larger than the average comet and was first spotted 4 billion kilometres from our solar system in 2014, roughly the same distance as Neptune; between its first sighting and this month, it has travelled another billion kilometres closer to us.

The comet's orbit is perpendicular to the plane of the Solar System, and it will reach its closest point to the Sun (known as the perihelion) in 2031 - but despite its size and proximity to our closest star, amateur astronomers will only be able to see it with a large telescope, even at its brightest.

"We have the privilege of having discovered perhaps the largest comet ever seen — or at least larger than any well-studied one — and caught it early enough for people to watch it evolve as it approaches and warms up," said the University

Covid cases rising again in Europe

Says WHO, sounds alarm over Euro 2020, travel pass AFP, Copenhagen

The World Health Organization (WHO) yesterday called for better monitoring of Euro 2020 football matches as Covid cases rise again in Europe, fuelled by the deadly Delta variant that is racing around the globe.

Hundreds of cases have been detected among spectators attending Euro matches taking place across Europe, with carriers of the Delta strain detected in Copenhagen, and infected Scots and Finns returning from London and Saint Petersburg respectively.
