



Building had no gas connection

Titas claims after fire service, bomb disposal unit say gas accumulated in building

Titas Gas yesterday refuted the inference by Fire Service and Civil Defence and the Bomb Disposal Unit officials that the explosion at the three-storey building in capital's Moghbazar may have been due to the accumulation of gas in the pipeline.

"There was no connection to the gas line in the building," Ali Iqbal Md Nurullah, managing director of Titas Gas, told The Daily Star. The gas pipeline found in the

building was disconnected a couple of years back, he added.

The Fire Service and Civil Defence (FSCD) and Bomb Disposal Unit (BDU) officials found a gas pipeline that was emanating gas while moving the debris from the explosion on June 27 that injured about 50 and claimed

On Sunday evening, Titas Gas officials were called into the site and the gas connection to the building was

"We are suspecting there was definitely an illegal gas line connection in the building. We are suspecting the explosion took place after gas accumulated from the Titas Gas line," said Dinomoni Sharma, deputy director of FSCD.

FSĆD has sent a letter to Titas Gas seeking documents of the connection, said Sharma, also a member of the five-member probe body formed to investigate the explosion.

A letter also sent to Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha to enquire how a residential building was turned into a commercial space, he added.

Rahmatullah Chowdhury, the chief of BDU and the member secretary of the police-formed seven-member probe body, echoed Sharma's account on the gas line.

"There were several gas pipelines points around the building and gas leakage found. The explosion took place after gas accumulated from the line," he told The Daily Star.

There was a sewerage line in the building but no source of gas was found in it, said another high official of the BDU involved in the

THE INVESTIGATION

Following the explosion, police have filed a case against unidentified persons but as of yesterday, no arrests were made.

Counter-Terrorism and Transnational Crime (CTTC) unit is now investigating the case.

A letter will be sent to Titas Gas authority, said CTTC officials requesting anonymity as they are not authorised to speak with media.

Govt bans travellers from 8 countries

India, Nepal among them; domestic flights suspended till June 14

The civil aviation authority last night imposed a ban on travellers from India, Nepal, South Africa, Botswana, Mongolia, Namibia, Panama and

The Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB) also suspended domestic flight operations until June

Bangladeshi citizens who visited the eight countries, categorised as Group-A, in 15 days of their arrival will be allowed to enter the country provided that they have a special approval from the ministry of foreign affairs, said a CAAB circular.

Bangladeshi seafarers who signedoff from the ships of the eight countries in 15 days of their arrival will be allowed to enter the country if they have proper documentary evidence of their profession and sign-off.

In both the cases, those who arrive arrival. Those who have not been must be in quarantine for 14 day at a vaccinated will have to be at a hotel hotel chosen by the government. The travellers will have to pay for their stay at the hotel. In an earlier circular, the CAAB

banned entries from Argentina, Bahrain, Bolivia, Brazil, India, Malaysia, Maldives, Nepal, Paraguay, Trinidad and Tobago and Uruguay. As per the circular issued last night, CAAB lifted the ban on arrivals from

Argentina, Bahrain, Bolivia, Brazil, Malaysia, the Maldives, Paraguay, Trinidad and Tobago, and Uruguay. People will now be allowed to travel to Bangladesh from Argentina,

Brazil, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ğeorgia, Kuwait, Malaysia, the Maldives, Oman, UAE, the UK and Uruguay. These countries were listed as Group-B.

Individuals fully inoculated against Covid-19 will have to be in home quarantine for two weeks upon their

chosen by the government for the same period of time. If the individuals from the Group-B

countries have transit in the countries in Group-A, they must not leave the transit airport and be under the close supervision of the airline concerned, added the CAAB circular.

There is no restriction on any other countries, CAAB said.

Individuals found to have Covid-19 symptoms will be sent to governmentauthorised hospitals for check-ups or to isolation at a governmentnominated facility, depending on the intensity of the symptom.

Domestic flight operations will remain suspended from 12:01am on July 8 until July 14, CAAB said.

At least four Covid patients died at Pabna General Hospital in 24 hours till yesterday noon, allegedly due to a shortage of oxygen supply. The deceased are: Rashida Begum, 70, Rokeya Khatun, 70, Nure Alam, 67, and Najmul Islam, 72. Speaking to UNB on condition of anonymity, a senior doctor at the hospital said, "The hospital is seeing a crisis of oxygen as the number of Covid patients increased in the last few days. Many had to arrange oxygen cylinders

personally. These patients died due to disruption in oxygen supply." Alamgir Hossain, son of deceased Rashida, said he got his mother admitted to the hospital around noon on Sunday with fever and breathing

problems. "Seeing the shortage of oxygen at the hospital, I requested the authorities about 10 times to arrange oxygen for my mother. But she breathed her last

gasping for oxygen."

He said at least three more patients died in front of his eyes gasping for

Mamun Hossain, brother of a patient admitted to the Covid ward, complained that the hospital management and health services have collapsed.

"My sister was admitted 12 days ago. She gave samples for Covid testing a day later, but she is yet to receive the test result," he said.

Regarding the deaths, Dr Saleh Mohammad Ali, acting assistant director of the hospital, said: "Most of the patients came at the last stage when there was little left to be done for saving their lives." There is no central oxygen supply system at the hospital. Oxygen was

being supplied to patients through a manifold system, which was not enough for the large number of patients and it created the crisis, he added. Pabna Civil Surgeon Monisor Chowdhury said 139 people were infected with Covid-19 in the district

in the 24 hours. With this, the district's death toll

reached 28 and the total caseload stood at 5,341.

The district's infection rate is 21.35 percent, he said.

UNO made OSD after he slapped a fine on doctor

Chattogram's Satkania upazila nirbahi officer has been withdrawn and made officer on special duty two days after he fined a doctor for violating lockdown.

who fined another physician for violating lockdown in Habiganj on Saturday, returned him the money yesterday.

The public administration ministry issued the UNO's withdrawal order on Sunday, but did not mention any reason.

Contacted, Chattogram's Divisional Commissioner Kamrul Hasan on Sunday confirmed that he got the order, and said, "The AC land of the apazila will perform the additional charge of UNO until further order."

Asked, Kamrul said he did not know whether the order had any connection with the incident of fining a doctor.

On Friday afternoon, UNO Nazru Islam conducted a mobile court in Satkania to enforce the lockdown. At that time, Farhad Kabir was going to his private chamber in the upazila. The mobile court halted him and fined him Γk 1,000.

The incident triggered protest from doctors as they claimed it was not a violation of the lockdown. They also demanded withdrawal and punishment of the UNO.

"If doctors cannot attend chambers, how will patients receive treatment? said Faisal Iqbal Chowdhury, general secretary of Bangladesh Medical Association's Chattogram chapter.

In a separate incident of Habiganj's Ajmeriganj upazila, an executive magistrate, who earlier fined a doctor for violating the lockdown, yesterday

returned the money. The local administration said the money was given back following the doctor's appeal. However, the doctor claimed that the government officials

asked him to appeal. On Saturday, Executive Magistrate Shoaib Shat-el Ivan fined Rezaul Karim, owner of Popular Physiotherapy in the

upazila's Kakailcheo Bazar area, Tk 20,000 for violating the lockdown. He was fined because crowd was

created at his physiotherapy centre, said the magistrate.

Yesterday afternoon, a staff of the nagistrate's office went to Rezaul's home and returned the money. Contacted, Ajmeriganj Upazila

Nirbahi Officer Matiur Rahman Khan said the money was given back as the doctor had appealed for it. However, the physician yesterday

told The Daily Star that the government official came to his house with an application form and asked him to sign it for getting the money.

Contacted, State Minister for Public Administration Farhad Hossain said. "We will do everything to reap the benefits from the ongoing lockdown. The next few weeks will be important

Cattle markets have become a big headache for the government as those in the capital draw huge crowds of buyers and sellers before the Eid-ul-Azha everv vear. "We will encourage people to

buy cattle online. If the situation improves, we will allow some cattle markets on condition that the health safety guidelines are strictly followed," Farhad said. Separate websites for buying and

selling livestock have been created for each district and campaigns will be run to publicise those, he added. Expressing similar view,

the NTAC, said, "We must encourage online cattle markets. Even if the government allows cattle markets before the Eid, their number should be very low and the health safety rules must be strictly

followed there, he noted. He further said that ideally, the lockdown should be continued for three weeks at a stretch.

"It is tough ahead of the Eid. What can be done is strict enforcement of the health safety rules in all cases.... violators of the rules have to be penalised.
