## 13 Indian fishermen detained

### BSF hands over five Bangladeshis

**Indian Border Security** Force (BSF) handed over five Bangladeshi nationals, detained while entering Bangladesh illegally, to Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) on Saturday night.

The five Bangladeshis, including women and two children, were handed over by Inspector Vivek Mila of Dhaprahat BSF camp, under 192 BSF Battalion in Cooch Behar district of the Indian state of Pashchimbanga, to the BGB through a flag meeting at Kashipur border in Kurigram's Phulbari upazila

BGB 15 Battalion Kashipur Camp Company Commander Subedar Ramzan Ali said they handed over the Bangladeshis to Phulbari Police Station. Of them, three have been charged under the Illegal Entry and Passport Act,.

# Longan: newest exotic fruit in C'nawabganj

New and exotic tropical fruit longan, an off-seasonal fruit in the country, is likely to gain popularity in Chapainawabganj for its taste and demands at markets.

With taste similar to lychee -- its betterknown family member from soapberry species of the fruit, Longan has a bright prospect in the district where lychee grows in abundance for its climate conditions.

Longan originates is southern China. But currently the fruit is being grown widely in Thailand, Cambodia, Laos, Vietnam and Taiwan. Longan is even grown in parts of Australia, the Caribbean islands and the US.

Owing to its export value, the fruit is also being grown commercially in many other countries across the world, said horticulturists at Chapainawabganj Horticulture Centre.

The tropical fruit is gradually gaining popularity among orchard owners in the country for its high demands at local markets. Many enthusiastic orchard owners already started growing longan plants on a small scale alongside other fruit trees in their orchards. Many people have also been growing the fruit on

Almost spherical shaped yellowbrownish longans usually hang in clusters from its branches. Its thin, firm and barklike shell covers its white translucent pulp that surrounds a large black seed. The flesh has a musky sweet taste that can be

compared to the taste of lychee.

Longan starts ripening from July end till August, when other popular domestic seasonal fruits are not available.

Because it grows best in tropical and subtropical climates, the soil and climate condition in Chapainawabganj is also suitable for longan, said the horticulturists at Chapainawabganj Horticulture Centre.

Horticulturist Mohammad Habibullah said one of their scientists brought three longan plants from Vietnam about twelve years ago and another scientist of the same centre brought another longan plant from Thailand nearly four years ago and all the four plants were planted in the horticulture centre.

Following thorough research and observation on the plants, the scientists there decided to expand farming of longan in Chapainawabganj, said Mozdar Hossain, deputy director of Chapainawabganj Horticulture Centre.

They already grew some saplings of longan and sold those to orchard owners and others. Many of them have been harvesting the fruit over the last two or three years.

Mozdar hoped that after meeting local demands, longan grown in the country will be exported overseas where demand is very high.

With that view in mind, the horticulture centre will grow around 1,000 saplings from the four mother trees and sell each sapling for Tk 50, he added.

# Mosquito menace on the rise in Brahmanbaria town

many areas across Brahmanbaria town, mosquitoes descend upon neighbourhoods every day after sunset. But these days, even during daytime, their numbers are so high that people are finding it hard to stay home.

However, there is no allocation of fund for the prevention of mosquitoborne diseases including dengue for the Brahmanbaria municipality.

Residents of the municipal area said there is no respite from mosquito menace despite closing doors and windows

Sharmin Akter, a housewife of Bonikpara area said, "Mosquito problem is unbearable here. As soon as evening comes, lighting up a coil is a must. Or else you can't go two minutes without a mosquito biting."

Hasan Rabby, resident of Kandipara area said that swarm of mosquitoes enter the rooms just after darkness descends. Even if one wants to sleep at the day time, mosquito nets must be drawn.

The town dwellers allege that the situation has taken a such worse turn because of unscrupulous garbage dumping, which hasn't been cleaned for years causing stagnation of the canal flowing through the middle of the town.

The canal has divided the municipal area into two parts almost equally. The once mighty canal has now turned dead where garbage is dumped unscrupulously halting the

it a breeding ground for mosquitoes. Moreover, mosquitoes are not being eradicated naturally due to lack of heavy rainfall. On the other hand, the municipal

authority has not taken any mosquito eradication programme for a long time resulting into severe mosquito Municipality sources said, the

municipality consisting of 12 wards and 33 localities are home to about two lakh population.

Sohel Sarkar, a dweller of power house road area said that in the past municipal authority would spray mosquito repellents in different areas. But for the last four to five years the municipality has not taken any such initiative and the town canal is also not being cleaned. As a result, the number of mosquitoes is on the rise.

While visiting different areas of

natural flow of the canal and making the town, this correspondent found swarm of mosquitoes flying on heaps of garbage in most of the localities like Kandipara, Kazipara, Mourail, Bonik Para, Paikpara. The total town has turned into a breeding ground of

mosquitoes.

Contacted, Mustafizur Rahman, conservative inspector of Brahmanbaria Municipality, a concerned official in mosquito eradication, said, "I don't have any information in this regard, contact the secretary of the municipality."

Md Shamsuddin, secretary of the municipality said, "There is no allocation for mosquito eradication this year. Due to recent Hefajat mayhem larvicide and adulticide and spray machines were damaged by the fire set to municipal store room."

At present, they are running the programme somehow by their own fund, he claimed.
